1. Announcement is made of the following course to be conducted annually at the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas:

a. Title: General Staff Officer

b. Course Number: 250-0-7

c. Purpose: Training for selected officers in the duties and functions of general staff officers of Infantry, Armored, and Airborne Divisions, and familiarization with general staff responsibilities in the Corps, Army, and Communications Zone.

d. Scope: Orientation and general principles of staff procedures; review of capabilities and employment of elements of all types of combat divisions; general staff organization, functions, duties, techniques and records; relationship of general staff and special staff officers; tactical employment of Infantry, Armored, and Airborne Divisions including their administrative, intelligence and logistical support; orientation and introduction to the tactical employment and administrative functions and responsibilities of the Corps and Army; familiarization with the organization and responsibility for logistical support of the Communication Zone.

e. Prerequisites: Commissioned officers of a civilian component on extended active duty, Category III only, with a minimum of 8 and not more than 19 years of commissioned service, or commissioned officers of the Regular Army with a minimum of 15 and not more than 19 years of promotion list service. Must not have attended or have credit for the Regular or Associate Courses, Command and General Staff College, but must have attended or have credit for advanced branch school courses, associate or regular. Potentiality for assignment in high staff positions indicated by actual performance of duties. Security clearance to include SECRET.

f. Security Clearance: SECRET

g. Length of Course: 18 weeks, to be conducted annually. Reporting date for the first class is 5 January 1952; closing date is 7 May 1952.

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h. Class Capacity: 350

2. Priority in this course will be given to officers on extended active duty up to 90% of the class capacity. A minimum of 10% and a maximum of 15% of the class capacity will be selected from officers of the Regular Army.

3. Selection of officers to attend will be given by the Department of the Army. Commanders of the Continental Armies will be notified of the officers within their command so selected. Attendance at this course will be on a TDY basis and commanders will issue the necessary orders for selected officers to attend. The name, rank, serial number and branch of those officers who have been selected by the Department of the Army and cannot possibly be released will be reported promptly to that office (ATTN: AGG-Z).

4. Preliminary checks of 201 files of most officers on extended active duty indicate that Department of the Army will not be able to grant interim or final security clearances in the time remaining prior to the reporting date for the first class. It is therefore requested that commanders take expeditious action to obtain the necessary security clearances for all officers selected for this course.

1. Rescission. Letter, AG 210.31 (10 Dec 51)CS, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 10 December 1951, subject: Assignment and Utilization of Officers.

2. An increasing reluctance of commanders at all levels to accept and effectively utilize officers unless they meet the commander's criteria as to age, branch, previous experience or schooling has been noted. This can be attributed largely to the natural desire of all commanders to retain high quality subordinates whom they know and to reward these officers, many of whom are in grades not commensurate with their assignments, by promotion.

3. Frequently, when officers are assigned who are not known to possess fully a commander's desired qualifications, assignments are made to positions other than those for which the individuals are shown by record, to be qualified, even though appropriate vacancies do exist. In some cases these positions to which such officers are assigned are outside authorized vacancies, or the officers are given a series of temporary duties, none of which give them ample opportunity to prove their true value to the unit or reduce the unit's requirement for officers. As a result, overstrengths occur while officer requirements, as established by the unit, are not filled. Such actions are manifestly unfair to these officers as well as to the Army as a whole.

4. The Department of the Army has predicted a serious Army-wide shortage of officers during 1952. The effects of this shortage are already becoming apparent in the Far East Command. The proportion of known

competent and experienced officers in the Far East Command has decreased materially during the past few months. Recent requirements have been met largely by older and less widely experienced officers, many of whom are in doubtful physical condition. Although strong efforts have been made and will continue to be made to raise the quality of incoming officers, all commanders must be cognizant of the world conditions necessitating the fullest utilization of all officer personnel. It is a specific and continuing responsibility of command to improve the quality level and broaden the experience of officer personnel.

5. The necessity for reduction to authorized strength by 31 December 1951 and the decreasing number of experienced officers being received from the zone of interior make it essential that all commanders exploit to the fullest officer manpower made available to them.

6. Assignment of incoming officers will be made to fill existing and anticipated requirements after giving full consideration to each officer's qualifications. Particular attention will be given to prevent the diversion of an officer possessing a critical MOS to a position which, though important, can be filled by other available officers. All echelons must give special attention to the reception of new officers. They must be given assignments appropriate to their grades and branch of service. If an officer fails to perform in a satisfactory manner the duties appropriate to his branch and grade, proper action will be taken under the provisions of existing regulations. Failure to take such action, when warranted, is a definite failure in the exercise of command responsibility.

7. It is desired that commanders at all echelons give personal attention to the effective utilization of available officer personnel.

Section I, Inclosure 1, letter, AG 200.3 (8 Nov 51)AG-PA, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 8 November 1951, subject: "Rotation, extension and reassignments," is changed as follows:

"6. Effective 1 January 1952, the following will apply to personnel absent from parent unit on emergency leave, temporary duty or detached service outside or within the Far East Command:

a. Emergency leave

(1) Outside the Far East Command

a. Time spent in a transient status while proceeding on and returning from emergency leave spent outside the Far East Command will be computed on an actual time (1 to 1) basis. Time spent in such status will be computed beginning the day following departure from parent unit through effective date of departure on emergency leave at Port of Debarkation in United States, or territory of residence; and, from date of reporting at such Port of Debarkation on return from emergency leave through day preceding reporting date upon return to parent unit.

b. Time spent on emergency leave in United States, or territory of residence, will be computed on an actual time (1 to 1) basis provided duration of such emergency leave does not exceed sixty (60) days.

c. Personnel granted emergency leaves in United States, or territory of residence, in excess of sixty (60) days, including any extensions thereof, will receive no credit for the period of absence spent on such leave status (computed from date of departure on emergency leave at Port of Debarkation in United States, or territory of residence, to date of return to such Port).

(2) Within Far East Command

a. Personnel absent on emergency leave within the Far East Command will continue to receive the same constructive months of service to which normally entitled when present with parent unit provided duration of such absence, including transient time incident thereto, does not exceed thirty (30) days.

b. Personnel absent from parent unit in excess of thirty (30) days, including period of emergency leave and transient time incident thereto, for purpose of emergency leave within the Far East Command will receive the constructive months of service authorized for the zone in which the emergency leave is spent for the duration of such absence.

b. Temporary Duty and Detached Service

(1) Personnel absent for sixty (60) days or less on temporary duty or detached service performed within and outside the Far East Command will continue to receive the same constructive months of service which would have been accumulated if present for duty with parent units.

(2) Personnel absent in excess of sixty (60) days on temporary duty or detached service performed outside the Far East Command will receive no credit for the entire period of absence, except that transient time to and from the United States or other area will be computed on an actual time (1 to 1) basis.

(3) Personnel absent in excess of sixty (60) days on temporary duty or detached service performed within the Far East

2. Battlefield Promotion:

a. Definition: A battlefield promotion is defined as a temporary promotion to fill a specific Table of Organization and Equipment or Table of Distribution position vacancy in a unit in the combat zone. The combat zone includes Korea only.

b. Promotion Authority:

- (1) To grade of colonel: The Department of the Army.
- (2) To grade of captain through lieutenant colonel: Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command.
- (3) To grade of first lieutenant: Commanding General, Eighth Army, w.o., only in the case of paragraph 2 c (3) (a) 2. below, is authorized to redelegate this authority to corps and division commanders.

c. Requirements:

- (1) For promotion to grade of major, lieutenant colonel, and colonel: Six (6) months service in current grade on current tour of extended active duty and demonstrated ability for sixty (60) days in a position vacancy of the next higher grade.
- (2) For promotion to grade of captain: Six (6) months service in current grade on current tour of extended active duty and demonstrated

ability for thirty (30) days in a position vacancy of the next higher grade.

(3) For promotion to grade of first lieutenant:

(a) Six (6) months service in current grade and demonstrated ability for thirty (30) days in combat, except as follows:

1. Second lieutenants of infantry regiments, artillery battalions, tank battalions or companies, combat engineer battalions or companies, reconnaissance companies or chemical mortar companies who have ninety (90) days in current grade and thirty (30) days of outstanding combat performance may be promoted to grade of first lieutenant.

2. As an exception to policy specified in preceding subparagraph, authority is granted to the Commanding General, Eighth Army (who may further delegate such authority to corps and division commanders) to effect on-the-spot promotions of such officers without regard to time in combat in those cases of individuals who have exhibited exceptionally outstanding leadership and courage in battle, provided they have completed ninety (90) days in grade.

(4) Orders:

(a) Orders effecting promotion of officers under the provisions of paragraph 2 c (3) (a) above will cite Department of the Army message CL 35602, 31 July 1950, as authority.

(b) Orders effecting promotion of officers under the provisions of paragraph 2 c (3) (a) 1 and 2 above will cite Department of the Army message Da 29339, 3 October 1951, as amended by Department of the Army message Da 46412, 23 November 1951, and this letter as authority.

(5) For Arrested Promotion:

(a) Posthumous Promotion

1. May be effected under provisions of Public Law 630, 77th Congress (Bulletin 42, Department of the Army, 1942) provided recommendation for such promotion was initiated prior to death of individual.

2. Posthumous promotion bestows prestige in rank without pay benefits.

3. Department of the Army takes final action on this category of promotions.

(b) Promotion of officers who, subsequent to date of recommendation for promotion, are hospitalized, reported missing in action, evading capture in enemy territory, are interned or made prisoners of war may be effected in accordance with provisions of Department of the Army message CL 40523, 25 August 1950 (Notal). Final action is taken on this category of promotions by the same headquarters as indicated in paragraph 2 b above.

d. Vacancies:

(1) On the 3d and 15th day of each month, this headquarters will notify the Commanding General, Eighth Army, of the number of existing vacancies by grade and branch for which nomination of eligible officers for battlefield promotion may be made.

(2) Vacancies will be based on the tabulation of "Actual and Authorized Officer Strength of Eighth Army units in Korea" by Promotion Control Report, AGA-ER-272, Statistical and Accounting Division, this headquarters.

(3) For purposes of computation, overages in upper grades will directly reduce vacancies in the lower grades of a specific branch; similarly, vacancies in upper grades will directly increase vacancies in lower grades. For example:

(4) In computing actual and authorized strength by grade, Branch, Material, Inspector General's Department and General Staff positions will be equitably distributed among the various arms and technical services.

(5) Authorized strength will be adjusted monthly in conformity with changes in Eighth Army Troop basis.

(6) Actual strength by grade will be determined on the basis of the control branch of each officer within the strength accountability of the command as of the date of preparation of the report.

(7) Nominations to fill existing specific branch vacancies will be restricted to eligible officers of that specific control branch.

e. Recommendations:

(1) On the 10th and 25th day of each month, the Commanding General, Eighth Army, will select and nominate to the Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command, for consideration for battlefield promotion to the grades of captain through lieutenant colonel, those officers considered best qualified among all eligibles to fill existing grade and branch vacancies.

(2) Recommendations will be submitted on DA AGO Form 78 in duplicate and will be forwarded by letter of transmittal to this headquarters. Officers will be listed in the letter of transmittal by name, rank, serial number, organization, in the order in which promotion is desired.

(3) Recommendations for promotion to the grade of colonel will be submitted separately, through this headquarters, to The Adjutant General.

(4) Recommendations initiated as provided in paragraph 2 c (5) above will be processed to this headquarters for necessary action, except recommendations for promotion of second lieutenants under category 2 c (5) (b) which will be processed to Headquarters, Eighth Army.

3. Non-Battlefield Promotion:

a. Promotion Authority and Recommendations:

(1) To grade of first lieutenant:

(a) Commanders prescribed in paragraph 4, reference 1 c above, are authorized to effect promotions in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 6 a and b, Section I, reference 1 b above.

(b) Recommendations initiated by general officers under the provisions of paragraph 6 c, Section I, reference 1 b above, will continue to be forwarded direct to The Adjutant General, Department of the Army, Washington 25, D. C. (attention AGPO-P) by the general officer recommending the promotion.

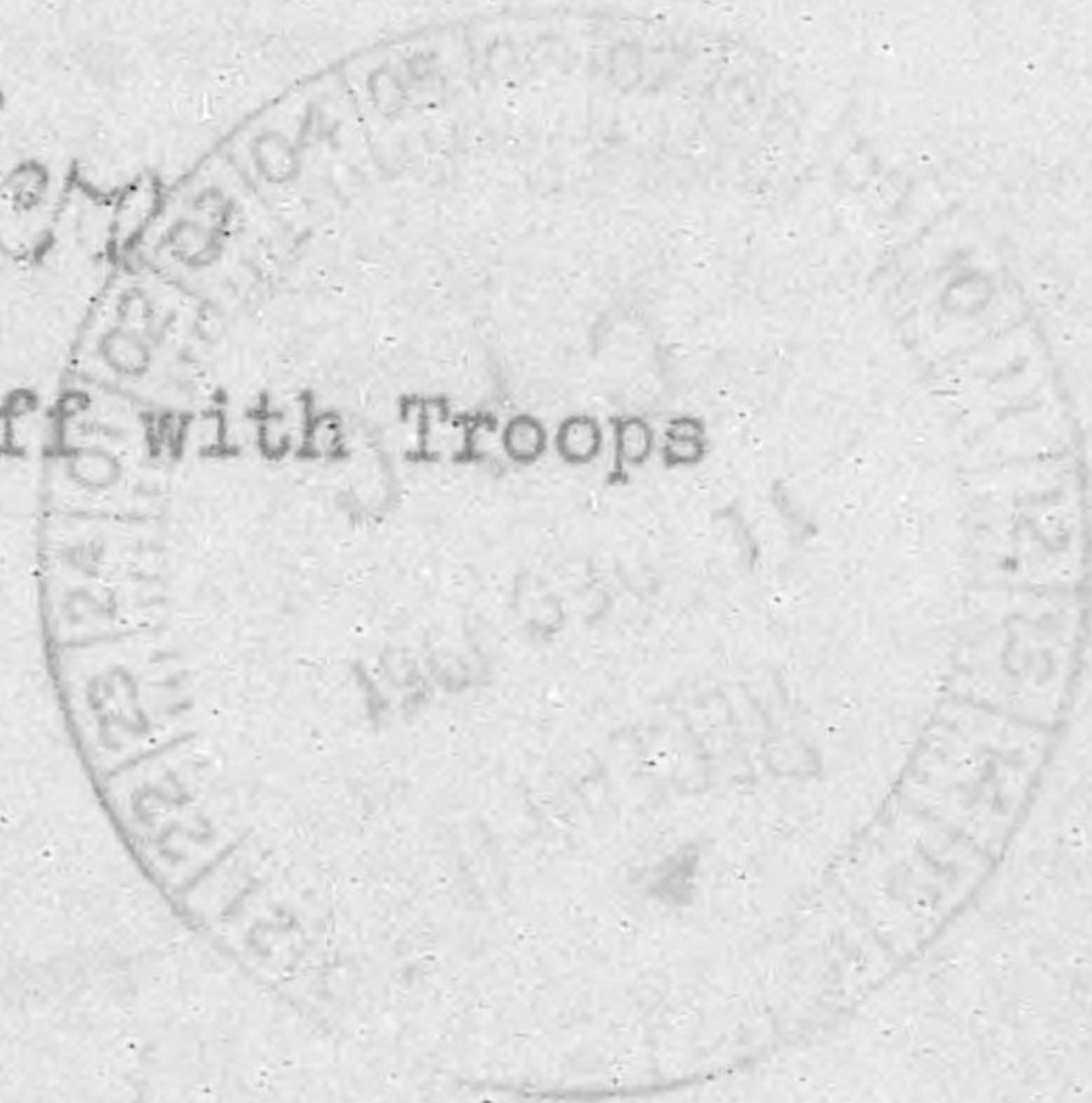

1. An increasing reluctance of commanders at all levels to accept and effectively utilize officers unless they meet the commander's criteria as to age, branch, previous experience or schooling has been noted. This can be attributed largely to the natural desire of all commanders to retain high quality subordinates whom they know and to reward these officers, many of whom are in grades not commensurate with their assignments, by promotion.

2. Frequently, when officers are assigned who are not known to possess fully a commander's desired qualifications, assignments are made to positions other than those for which the individuals are shown by record, to be qualified, even though appropriate vacancies do exist. In some cases these positions to which such officers are assigned are outside authorized vacancies, or the officers are given a series of temporary duties, none of which give them ample opportunity to prove their true value to the unit or reduce the unit's requirement for officers. As a result, overstrengths occur while officer requirements, as established by the unit, are not filled. Such actions are manifestly unfair to these officers as well as to the Army as a whole.

3. The Department of the Army has predicted a serious Army-wide shortage of officers during 1952. The effects of this shortage are already becoming apparent in the Far East Command. The proportion of known competent and experienced officers in the Far East Command has decreased materially during the past few months. Recent requirements have been met largely by older and less widely experienced officers, many of whom are in doubtful physical condition. Although strong efforts have been made and will continue to be made to raise the quality of incoming officers, all commanders must be cognizant of the world conditions necessitating the fullest utilization of all officer personnel. It is a specific and continuing responsibility of command to improve the quality level and broaden the experience of officer personnel.

4. The necessity for reduction to authorized strength by 31 December 1951 and the increasing number of officers being received from the Zone of the Interior make it essential that all commanders exploit to the fullest officer manpower made available to them.

1. Military occupational specialties have been established in the Scientific Services Career Field for identification of scientific and professional personnel in several educational areas. (See Change 1, SR 615-25-15.) Identification of scientific and professional personnel, however, will not be limited to these specialties. Individuals having prerequisites for identification as scientific and professional personnel in any of the major areas included in Appendix II, SR 615-25-38, which do not come within the military occupational specialty structure set forth in SR 615-25-15, as changed, may be identified by an appropriate title. For Example: An individual with a college degree in personnel management may not be identified by any of the Scientific Services Career Field MOS's contained in Change 1, SR 615-25-15, but he may be identified as a "Personnel Management Research Assistant", or any other appropriate title, because personnel management is one of the authorized scientific and professional areas covered in Appendix II, SR 615-25-38.

2. In order that this Command may secure its proportionate share of the enlisted personnel with scientific and professional backgrounds who are entering the Army and that proper initial assignments may be made within this theater, it is necessary that the needs of all units for this type of personnel be known. Accordingly, commencing with the month of December 1951, each of the above addressees will submit a monthly requisition for scientific and professional enlisted personnel to CINCPAC, Attn: AG-RR, so as to arrive not later than the 15th of each month.

a. Requisitions will reflect the number of personnel required, by military occupational specialty (see Change 1, SR 615-25-15) or by educational category, will indicate the unit to which assignment is desired, and will be prepared substantially as indicated in the sample form contained in the inclosed Appendix, which is furnished as a guide only.

b. Requisitions will reflect requirements for scientific and professional personnel for the second subsequent month. For example, requisitions submitted as of 15 December 1951 will reflect requirements for the calendar month of February 1952, and requisitions submitted as of 15 January 1952 will reflect requirements for March 1952.

c. The unfilled portions of requisitions or requests previously submitted will be cancelled as of the last day of the month in which a new requisition is received.

3. These requisitions for scientific and professional personnel are exempt from Reports Control under the provisions of para 4b, AR 305-15.

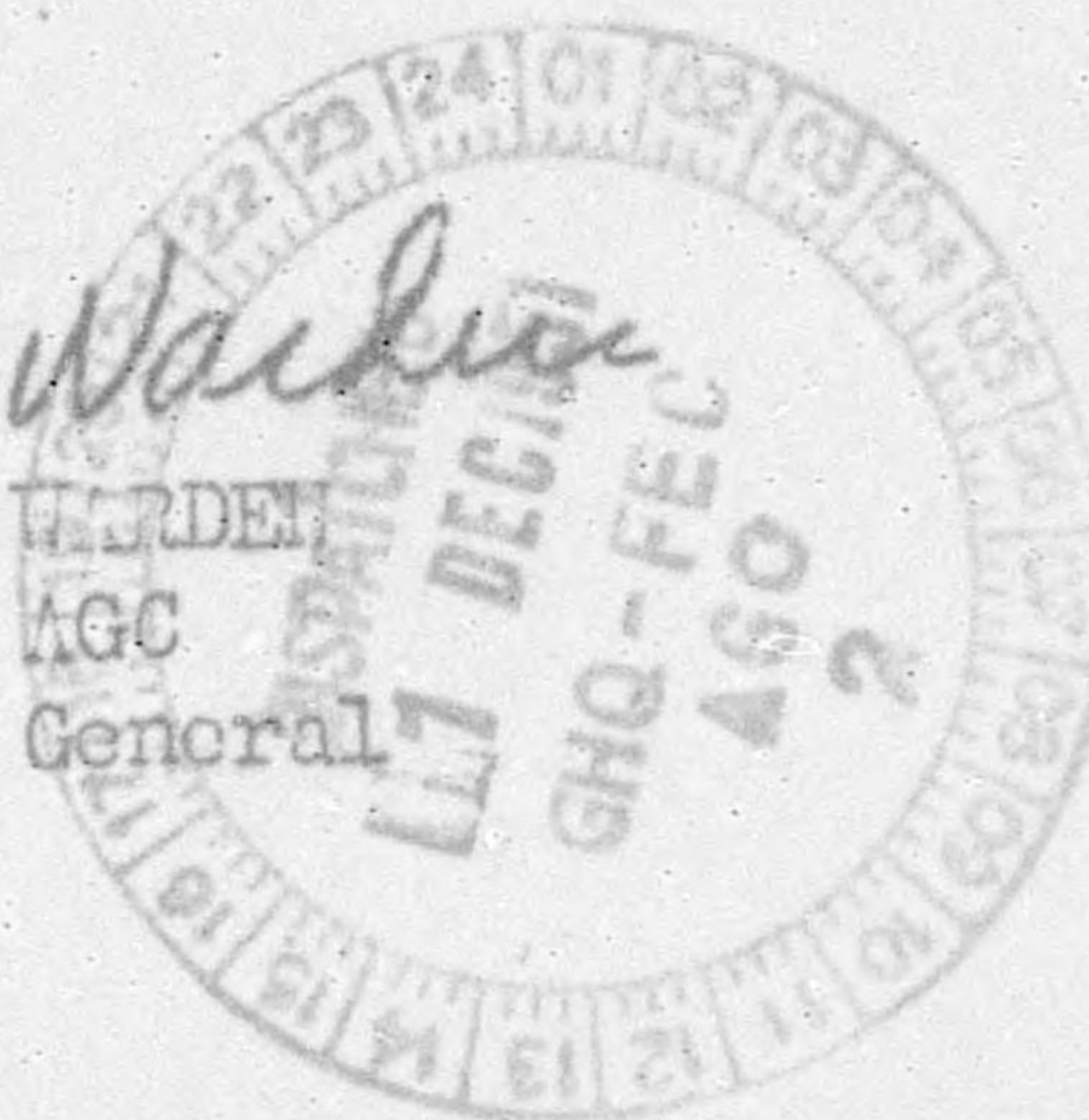

SUBJECT: Assignment of Reservists Released from Active Duty

TO: Commanding Generals
Continental Armies

1. Reservists, both officer and enlisted, who have been ordered into active military service subsequent to 25 June 1950, under the provisions of Section 21, Universal Military Training and Service Act, as amended, and have been or are hereafter released from active service, will not be reordered into active service involuntarily under the same authority in accordance with current Department of the Army policy, either as individuals or as members of Organized Reserve Corps units ordered into active service. While it is realized that the services of many of these recently trained and experienced reservists are desirable, due consideration should be given their availability for active military service in assigning them to Organized Reserve Corps Troop Program units in the event decision is made to order the units concerned into active military service in the absence of a declaration of war or national emergency by Congress.

2. The policy of the Department of the Army that the assignment of individual reservists to units will be determined locally in accordance with pertinent regulations is applicable to all reservists including those who are currently being released from active military service.

3. However, any reservist falling within the category stated in paragraph 1, above, who is assigned to an Organized Reserve Corps unit which is subsequently alerted for active service will be transferred from the unit prior to entry into active service, except in time of war or a national emergency declared by Congress, unless he volunteers for active military service.

Individuals who have applied for Far East Command reassignment may withdraw their applications at any time prior to final action by this headquarters. All such withdrawals will be promptly reported to this headquarters by electrical means.

7. Applications falling within the following categories will normally be not favorably considered:

- a. Requests which indicate disciplinary action is pending.
- b. Requests from individuals who have courts-martial records.

8. Applications disapproved by intermediate headquarters in accordance with current directives will be returned to the applicant.

9. The provisions of this directive are not intended to preclude reassignment within major commands, i.e., from Zone A or B or vice versa as directed by the Commanding General, Eighth Army.

Inter-Theater (Hawaii)

10. Individuals who have dependents, baggage, automobiles within or are legal residents of Hawaii will be reassigned to Hawaii when selected for rotation.

11. These individuals will be assigned to the 8285th Personnel Center, Schofield Barracks, APO 958. Commanding General, United States Army Pacific, APO 958 will be furnished an airmail report of all officers and enlisted men assigned to his command under this authority. An information copy of this report will be furnished Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention: AG-PH.

12. The foregoing instructions do not preclude the Commanding General, United States Army Pacific, from reporting to The Adjutant General for assignment instructions any individual so reassigned who cannot be effectively utilized within his command or any individual who desires further reassignment to the zone of interior.

a. Individuals who do not desire leave in Hawaii will be authorized leave, not to exceed 30 days, upon arrival in the zone of interior.

b. Individuals desiring some leave in Hawaii will be authorized the remaining portion of 30 days leave not taken, upon arrival in the zone of interior. Combined leave will not exceed 30 days.

13. Direct communication between major commanders and the Commanding General, United States Army Pacific, is authorized for the purpose of implementing the above. Commander-in-Chief, Far East, will be furnished an information copy of all messages this subject.

CIRCUITOUS ROUTING

14. Individuals, having dependents in the Philippines who are eligible for entry into the United States, or territory of residence, may be authorized circuitous routing to the zone of interior and permitted not to exceed 21 days temporary duty (without per diem) in the Philippines for the purpose of joining their dependents and preparing for onward concurrent travel to the zone of interior. 2. This directive is published for the purpose of consolidating the various directives and policies concerning rotation, extensions of foreign service tours and reassignments.

3. Rotation will provide that, consistent with maintaining organizational proficiency, individuals with the longest actual or constructive service on current foreign service tour will be rotated first.

4. Monthly quotas for rotation and reassignment will be announced to major commanders by Commander-in-Chief, Far East, together with

minimum constructive months of service criteria. Replacements will be allocated commensurate with rotation and operational requirements of all Far East major commands.

5. When an individual has accrued a sufficient number of constructive months service to be included in the announced rotation criteria, he may not be retained for more than 60 days subsequent to the date he attains eligibility for rotation, except upon approval of the major commander concerned.

6. The criteria in the attached inclosure will be used to determine eligibility of personnel for rotation, extension of foreign service tour and reassignment. Criteria is not applicable to reassignments or extensions for compassionate or hardship reasons.

7. The provisions of this directive are applicable to all Department of the Army personnel on duty within the Far East Command who are under Department of the Army control, except as indicated below:

a. Army aviators (MOS 1981 and 1066) will be selected for rotation and intra-theater reassignment based solely upon the availability of qualified replacements.

b. Counter Intelligence Corps personnel (except linguists) will be selected for rotation when a qualified replacement is assigned. Non-Counter Intelligence Corps personnel assigned to Counter Intelligence Corps detachments will be rotated in accordance with criteria applicable to non-exempted personnel contained within this directive.

c. Warrant Officers, Military Occupational Specialty 9322, and enlisted personnel, Military Occupational Specialty 1446 (Criminal Investigation Detachment personnel) will be selected for rotation and intra-theater reassignment based solely upon the availability of qualified replacements. Criminal Investigation Detachment personnel other than the above are not affected by this exemption.

d. Medical Department and Army Nurse Corps officer personnel will be selected for rotation based upon quotas to be announced monthly by Commander-in-Chief, Far East. Requests for intra-theater reassignment will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, for final determination.

e. (1) requests for voluntary extension of overseas service tour submitted by the categories of personnel listed above which would

exceed 48 calendar months on current foreign service tour normally will not be favorably considered.

(2) Requests for voluntary extensions of overseas service tour submitted by the above categories of personnel which would exceed 42, but not 48, months actual service in the Far East Command on current foreign service tour will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, for final determination.

f. Linguists - see separate instructions contained in paragraph 8, below.

g. Filipino enlisted personnel who have established eligibility for rotation or for intra-theater reassignment in accordance with current criteria will be afforded the opportunity of applying for reassignment to any other major command of the Far East Command or extending their current foreign service tours, in increments of not less than 6 nor more than 12 months, within any major command of the Far East Command without regard to length of continuous overseas service on current tour. Such requests will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East Command for final determination as prescribed by provisions of reference 1 g, above.

8. Instructions contained below will govern the rotation, intra-theater reassignment and extensions of overseas service tours of company grade officer and enlisted linguists. Field grade officers having linguistic qualifications will be governed by instructions pertaining to non-exempted personnel contained within this directive.

a. Linguists are defined as those persons having linguistic qualifications entered on their Form 66 or Form 20 in one or more of the following languages: Japanese, Chinese, Korean and Russian.

b. Linguists now occupying authorized Table of Organization and Equipment and Table of Distribution linguistic positions will be selected for rotation when a qualified linguist replacement is assigned.

c. Linguists occupying non-linguistic positions will be rotated when eligible in accordance with normal criteria specified within this directive for non-exempted personnel.

d. Linguists, as defined herein, may apply for extensions of foreign service tour in increments of not less than 6, nor more than 12, months regardless of actual months served within the Far East Command on current foreign service tour.

(1) Authority is delegated to major commanders to take final action on requests for extensions of foreign service tour submitted by linguists assigned to authorized Table of Organization and Equipment and Table of Distribution linguistic positions, without regard to length of service on current foreign service tour or marital status to a foreign national whose entry into the United States is authorized in accordance with provisions of Public Law 717, 81st Congress, as amended.

(2) Applications for extensions of foreign service tour submitted by linguist personnel who occupy non-linguistic positions which would extend the current foreign service tour of the applicant beyond 42 calendar months in the Far East Command will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, for final determination.

e. Intra-theater reassignment instructions contained in Section III of this directive are equally applicable to linguistic personnel. In those cases wherein an extension of foreign service tour is required to establish eligibility, the application for the requisite extension will accompany the request for reassignment.

SECTION I

Rotation

1. The total months of constructive service of individuals coming within the provisions of this directive will be computed for entire service on current foreign service tour on the basis of time spent in each of the zones indicated below.

a. Zones

- (1) Zone A - Close combat (Division or separate combat type unit in Korea).
- (2) Zone B - Combat (All Korea, except Zone A).
- (3) Zone C - Communications (Japan, Ryukyus, Philippines and Marianas-Ponins Command).

b. Service in Zones A and B will be credited for periods subsequent to 1 July 1950 only.

c. Service in each Zone will have a constructive service value based on the following ratio.

- (1) Zone A - 4 to 1, i.e., one month actual service equals four months constructive service.
- (2) Zone B - 2 to 1.
- (3) Zone C - 1 to 1, except for service in the Ryukyus Command, Philippines Command, and the Marianas-Ponins Command which is established at 1.5 to 1.

d. Constructive service of individuals who served part of their current foreign service tour in areas other than those prescribed above will be computed on the basis of foreign service tour for the area concerned, as listed in SA 600-175-1.

e. Officer and enlisted personnel (E-1 to E-7, inclusive) having dependents as defined in paragraph 7001, Joint Travel Regulations, who are serving in Zone C, unaccompanied by such dependents, will receive one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) months additional constructive service while in that status for each month served therein subsequent to 1 July 1950.

2. Individuals will receive 2 constructive service months for each

month served on current overseas tour in Korea prior to 1 July 1950.

3. Time en route from the zone of interior to unit of initial assignment in the Far East Command will be computed on actual time basis. Credit for service in zones will begin upon reporting to a unit classified within one of the zones listed. Time consumed in inter-theater travel or between zones will be credited on the basis of the zone from which departed.

4. Personnel hospitalized as a result of wounds received in action in Korea, for which a Purple Heart was awarded, will receive credit for the period of hospitalization as time served with the organization to which assigned when wounded. Personnel hospitalized as a result of illness or injury, non-battle, will receive credit for the period of hospitalization as time served in the zone where hospitalized, except that no credit, actual or constructive, will be granted for the entire period of hospitalization to personnel whose wounds or injuries are determined to be "self-inflicted."

5. Recovered United States Army personnel (BRICKS) with a confirmed "UNDEAD" or "missing in action" status will be credited with time spent in Zone 1 for a like period on recovery.

6. Personnel on emergency leave, temporary duty or detached service outside or within the Far East Command for a period of less than 60 days will continue to receive the same constructive months of service normally accumulated as if the individual had been present with his assigned organization. Personnel absent on emergency leave, temporary duty or detached service outside the Far East Command for periods exceeding 60 days will receive no credit for the entire period of absence. Personnel absent on temporary duty or detached service in other zones within the Far East Command for periods in excess of 60 days will receive the constructive months of service authorized for the zone in which the temporary duty or detached service is performed.

7. Computation of credits will be as of the dates to be announced periodically by Commander-in-Chief, Far East. The computation effected as of 31 August 1951 will be entered in ink and dated in the remarks section of the DA AGO Form 20, for enlisted personnel, and Form 66 for officers. Subsequent computations will be entered on the personnel data cards for reporting purposes. Periods of constructive months of service will be reported to the nearest whole month.

8. Individuals who reenlisted within the Far East Command will be considered as serving on their original normal tour or extension thereof,

irrespective of any intervening leave, within or outside the Far East Command, incurred as a result of reenlistment.

9. Individuals in the Far East Command married to persons who are foreign nationals authorized entry into the United States or territory of residence, in accordance with provisions of Public Law 717, 81st Congress, as amended, will be rotated in accordance with instructions contained in reference 1 f, basic communication.

10. Personnel in an "RTD" or "BRICK" status who are evacuated to Japan and have accrued 32 or more constructive months of service as of date of recovery will not normally be returned to duty with their unit in Korea, but will be rotated to territory of residence or the zone of interior via Camp Drake Replacement Depot.

11. Individuals desiring to marry foreign nationals, eligible for entry into the United States under the provisions of Public Law 717, 81st Congress, as amended by Public Law 6, 82d Congress, residing in areas within the Far East Command other than those in which applicants are stationed must have in their possession an approved application to marry, or in lieu thereof a certificate executed by the unit commander attesting to the impracticability of processing such application, prior to departure from parent organization for rotation. Refer to reference 1 f, basic communication, for detailed instructions.

12. Individuals who meet the minimum criteria for rotation and who are rotated will be authorized credit for having completed a foreign service tour. The entry "WTC" (normal tour completed) will be recorded in accordance with paragraph 10b, SR 600-175-1 in the personnel records of individuals concerned.

SECTION II

Extensions

1. Applications for extensions may be submitted for six (6) or more months and final action taken thereon by major commanders, provided the extension as approved will not exceed 42 actual months service on current foreign service tour within the Far East Command. An extension which would result in a tour longer than 42 months, but would not exceed 48 months, will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention: AG-111, for final determination provided the request is favorably considered by the major commander concerned and is based upon cogent military reasons.

2. Personnel will be eligible for rotation upon completion of an extension provided they have otherwise established eligibility for such

rotation by accumulation of constructive service credits above the minimum cut-off score then in effect for the area in which serving. Personnel who have not accrued sufficient constructive service credits to establish eligibility for rotation will, upon expiration of extension, be retained within the major command until such time as they become eligible for, and have been selected for rotation. For reporting purposes, expected date of departure from the Far East Command of personnel otherwise eligible for rotation under the constructive credit system will be established as termination date of an approved extension.

3. Extensions will become effective on the first day of the month following the date of approval and will terminate on the last day of the appropriate month (i.e., a seven month extension approved 24 October 1951 would become effective 1 November 1951 and expire on 31 May 1952). In those cases where the applicant is currently serving on a previously approved extension, the new extension will become effective on the first day of the month following expiration of current extension.

4. Requests for extensions submitted subsequent to announcement of a cut-off score by individuals who have become eligible for rotation thereunder will be disapproved by the major commander concerned.

5. Due to transportation limitations, extensions which would terminate between 30 June and 30 September will not be granted unless a cogent compassionate or military reason exists.

6. Personnel who voluntarily accomplished an 18 month extension under the provisions of Commander-in-Chief message CX 58615 in order to provide eligibility for reassignment from Korea to a non-combat area within the Far East Command may elect either to:

a. Continue such 18 month extension in effect, utilizing termination date thereof as LTD from the Far East Command; or

b. Prior to 1 January 1952, request revocation of 18 month extension approved under provisions of Commander-in-Chief, Far East, message CX 58615 and elect to come within rotation criteria applicable to the area in which now serving. However, a minimum of 12 months service in area to which reassigned from Korea is mandatory and will be utilized in computation of the LTD from the Far East Command of personnel electing this provision.

7. Authority is delegated to major commanders to curtail an approved extension of foreign service tour at any time an individual

becomes surplus to their requirements and for other cogent military or compassionate reasons.

SECTION III

Reassignments and Circuitous Routing

Intra-Theater

1. Individuals may volunteer for reassignment from one zone to another, or their reassignment may be directed for the best interests of the service.

2. Individuals will be considered eligible to apply for intra-theater reassignments during the following periods of service:

a. Zone A or B to zone C - not less than 24 nor more than 30 actual or constructive months service. Normally an individual with more than 30 constructive months service at time of transfer will not be transferred unless he volunteers to serve a minimum of 12 months in area of reassignment.

b. Zone C to zones A or B - not more than 20 months actual or constructive months service. Normally an individual with more than 20 constructive months service at time of transfer will not be transferred unless he volunteers to serve a minimum of 6 months in area of reassignment.

3. In order to fill monthly quotas allotted by Commander-in-Chief, Far East, authority is delegated to Commanding General, Eighth Army, to take final action on applications of individuals desiring reassignment from Eighth Army to Japan.

a. Applications will include a statement that personnel understand they will be assigned against existing military Occupational Specialty vacancies in the Far East Command at the time of arrival within the area of assignment and that no commitment to any specific geographical area, unit or duty assignment can be made.

b. It is desired that Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention: AG-TR, will be notified daily by courier dispatch of the name, grade, service number, and SSN of approved applicants desiring reassignments. Applications falling within the following categories will normally be not favorably considered:

(1) Requests which indicate disciplinary action is pending.

(2) requests from individuals who have courts martial records.

4. Applications for intra-theater reassignment of personnel from commands other than Eighth Army will be forwarded to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention: AG-PA, for final determination. These applications will contain the data required by paragraph 6b, AR 615-200 and will include the date of departure on current foreign service tour, the number of constructive months service accrued and location of dependents, if married.

5. Except as otherwise directed, personnel being reassigned to Korea, Japan, Ryukyus or the Philippines will be assigned to gain Brakō Replacement Depot for further assignment to the appropriate command. Commanders will insure that personnel records are correct and complete, and that individuals have in their possession a complete issue of current authorized clothing and equipment upon departure from the command from which reassigned.

6. Quotas referred to in paragraph 4, above will be issued monthly by Commander-in-Chief, Far East as follows:

- a. For enlisted men - by Military Occupational Specialty and grade spread.
- b. For officers - by grade and branch of service.

7. The provisions of this directive are not intended to preclude reassignment within major commands, i.e., from zone .. to .. or vice versa as directed by Commanding General, Eighth Army.

Inter-Theater (Hawaii)

8. Individuals who have dependents, baggage, automobiles within or are legal residents of Hawaii will be reassigned to Hawaii when selected for rotation.

9. These individuals will be assigned to the 8285th Personnel Center, Schofield Barracks, AGO 958. Commanding General, United States Army Pacific, AGO 958 will be furnished an airmail report of all officers and enlisted men assigned to his command under this authority. An information copy of this report will be furnished Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention: AG-PA.

10. The foregoing instructions do not preclude the Commanding General,

United States Army Pacific, from reporting to The Adjutant General for assignment instructions any individual so reassigned who cannot be effectively utilized within his command or any individual who desires further reassignment to the zone of interior.

a. Individuals who do not desire leave in Hawaii will be authorized leave, not to exceed 30 days, upon arrival in the zone of interior.

b. Individuals desiring some leave in Hawaii will be authorized the remaining portion of 30 days leave not taken, upon arrival in the zone of interior. Combined leave will not exceed 30 days.

11. Direct communication between major commanders and the Commanding General, United States Army Pacific, is authorized for the purpose of implementing the above. Commander-in-Chief, Far East, will be furnished an information copy of all messages this subject.

CIRCUITOUS ROUTING

12. Individuals, having dependents in the Philippines who are eligible for entry into the United States, or territory of residence, may be authorized circuitous routing to the zone of interior and permitted not to exceed 21 days temporary duty (without per diem) in the Philippines for the purpose of joining their dependents and preparing for onward concurrent travel to the zone of interior. The Commanding General, Philippines Command, is authorized to grant extensions of temporary duty of military sponsors, desiring to effect entry into the United States of their dependents, until such time as dependents are eligible to enter the United States under pertinent immigration laws. In no case, however, will the total period of temporary duty granted for this purpose exceed 90 days.

13. Individuals, whose legal residence is in the Philippines, may be authorized circuitous routing to the zone of interior via the Philippines and granted 30 days leave (not temporary duty) to visit their dependents or relatives with the implicit understanding that upon arrival in the zone of interior they may not be authorized further delay en route when traveling from the personnel center serving the port of entry to the new duty station.

14. Individuals authorized temporary duty or leave in the Philippines will report to the Commanding Officer, 814th Army Unit (LST), APO 928, within 24 hours after arrival.

SECTION IV Permanent Change of Station Subsequent to Emergency Leave

1. Individuals departing on emergency leave outside the Far East Command who are otherwise eligible for a permanent change of station will, unless cogent military reasons to the contrary exist, be reassigned to a station within their territory of residence or the zone of interior, as applicable, provided they fulfill one of the following criteria:

a. Have less than 8 months service remaining prior to expiration term of service as extended and who do not desire to reenlist to fill their own vacancy or to voluntarily extend their term of service.

b. Have completed current normal foreign service tour as prescribed in SR 600-175-1.

c. Have accrued 32 months constructive service on current foreign service tour computed as of date of departure from the losing command.

d. Determination of permanent change of station for those categories of personnel specified in paragraphs 7a, 7b, 7c, 7d and 8 of the basic communication is delegated to major commanders concerned.

e. Emergency leave orders published by the losing command will indicate permanent change of station, if applicable.

2. Unless Department of the Army assignment instructions have been received prior to departure of these personnel on permanent change of station, orders placing these personnel on emergency leave issued by Commanding General, Ryukyus, Marianas-Bonins, Philippines Commands and Commanding Officer, Camp Drake Replacement Depot, will concurrently effect assignment to the Reception Station (as listed in Department of the Army Circular 23, 1951) nearest leave address.

3. The following references and this directive will be cited as the authority for permanent change of station for individuals who qualify under the provisions of the above subparagraph as indicated:

a. Subparagraph 1a - Department of the Army message DA 28924, 28 June 1951.

b. Subparagraph 1b - SR 600-175-1.

c. Subparagraph 1c - this directive only.

4. Individuals departing from units in Korea or Japan, who come within the above criteria will be assigned to Camp Drake Replacement

Report, CSCIA 184, will be submitted by the Commanding Generals Ryukyus, Marianas-Bonins, and Philippine Commands, and the Commanding Officer, Camp Drake Replacement Depot in accordance with provisions of SR 605-145-16 citing the appropriate authority, as outlined in paragraph 3 above, for permanent change of station.

SECTION V CAG-50 Report

1. All addressees will submit daily by radio to Commander-in-Chief, Far East, attention AG-IR, Report CAG 50 on personnel being rotated to zone of interior for reassignment only. Negative report will be submitted daily, if applicable. CAG-50 report will be submitted as follows:

a. For Eighth Army only:

(1) Part 1 - CAG-50. All officers and warrant officers will be reported by name, grade, service number, branch and (MOS for warrant officers) in the following 5 groups:

(a) Group 1. Officers and warrant officers with dependents in Far East Command showing after name, location of dependents, e.g., Ryukyus, Marianas-Bonins, or in case of Japan, name of city.

(b) Group 2. Officers and warrant officers who have automobiles in Far East Command, who are not included in group 1 above, and location of automobile (see explanation Group 1).

(c) Group 3. Officers and warrant officers who have personal baggage in Far East Command who have not been included in Group 1 or 2 and location of baggage (see explanation Group 1).

(d) Group 4. Officers and warrant officers not included in Group 1, 2 or 3 who for cogent reasons cannot be immediately shipped to zone of interior.

(e) Group 5. All other officers and warrant officers not included in first four groups.

(2) Part 2 - OAG-50. Enlisted Personnel. All personnel reported will be considered white unless otherwise designated. All enlisted men in following groups will be reported by name, grade, service number and MOS.

(a) Group 1. All enlisted men who have dependents in the Far East Command and location of dependents.

(b) Group 2. All enlisted men, not included in Group 1 above, who have automobiles in the Far East Command and location of automobile.

(c) Group 3. All enlisted men, not included in Groups 1 and 2, above who have baggage in Far East Command and location of baggage.

(3) For enlisted personnel listed in Part 2, Group 1 above, the following information will be included after each name and indicated by code as follows:

(a) W - months service remaining on current enlistment, e.g., W-10 (If indefinite enlistment, so state).

(b) X - Army area of preference, e.g., X-5.

(c) Y - If government transportation is desired from port of debarkation to new duty station, e.g., Y-Yes (or) No.

(d) Z - If other than government transportation is desired, information contained in paragraph 22a (8) Circular 28, Department of the Army, 1951, as amended by Department of the Army message DA 23419, 12 June 1951, will be shown, e.g., Z-R (or) Z-B (or) Z-no.

(4) OAG-50 report will be rendered daily on personnel as they arrive at the embarkation points in Korea (Pusan or Inchon). Information copy of report will be sent to Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command; Commanding Officer, Camp Drew, 8014 Army Unit; and Commanding Officer, Sasebo Replacement Depot, 8068 Army Unit.

b. For all other commands:

(1) Part 1 - OAG-50. All officers and warrant officers will be reported by name, grade, service number, branch and (MOS for warrant officers) in the following two groups:

(a) Group 1. All officers and warrant officers with dependents in the Far East Command available for shipment to the zone of interior.

(b) Group 2. All officers and warrant officers without dependents who are available for shipment to the zone of interior.

(2) Part 2. AG-50. Group 1. All enlisted personnel regardless of grade, who have dependents in the Far East Command who are available for shipment to the zone of interior will be reported by name, grade, and MOS. In addition information required by paragraph 1a (3) above, will be shown after each name.

(3) Personnel listed in Group 1, parts 1 and 2, AG-50 report, will be reported daily 21 days in advance of estimated date of shipment.

(4) Personnel listed in Group 2, part 1, AG-50 report will be reported daily 7 days in advance of estimated date of shipment.

(5) Personnel will not be reported until they are available for return to the zone of interior within the time limits prescribed above.

(6) For Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command only. Personnel being returned from Korea for 90 days temporary duty for the purpose of completing arrangements for marriage and/or transportation of their foreign national brides will be reported by Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command at such time as they are available to return to the zone of interior within the 90 days time limit. If traveling with dependents they will be reported 21 days from estimated date of shipment or 7 days from estimated date of shipment in the case of officers and warrant officers who are returning without dependents. Commanding General, Japan Logistical Command will institute such controls as are required to insure that these personnel are shipped from the Far East Command by the completion date of their temporary duty. Code 8. will be shown after each name of this type personnel when reported.

2. Personnel with dependents in Far East Command will not depart on permanent change of station prior to receipt of department of the Army assignment instructions unless specifically approved by Commander-in-Chief, Far East.

3. Personnel who have dependents, baggage or automobiles in Hawaii who are legal residents of the Territory of Hawaii, will not be included in the AG-50 report but will be assigned to Detachment 1, 8285th Personnel Center, Schofield Barracks, AO 958, as heretofore prescribed in Section III.
