SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENT

Immediate Educational Goals with extent of progress:

1. Closing of Teachers' Training Course for their License.

The above training course, having met with many troubles since the first, was closed as of Aug. 25 before scheduled time, because the 5th period of the course was cut off in compliance with the Teachers' License Law as amended.

This course was generally successful though various difficulties were encountered.

2. Preparation for holding the National Youth Athletic Meet for "Higashiguchi" Trophy.

It is the first time that such a national event is held in Kochi. The Secretariat of the Board was decided to assume the greater part of the business preparation for this Athletic Meet, which is held on Sept. 23 and 24 and attended by 1,000 young men. It is near at hand, so we are very busy now.

3. The draft of supplementary budget to be presented to October session of pref. assembly.

The Local Tax Law passed the Diet in July, but the distribution of the equalization grant have not yet been decided and accordingly the prefectural finance is still in indistinct condition. There are many financial problems left unsettled since the beginning of the current fiscal year and to be presented to the October Session of the Prefectural Assembly for settlement. We are now endeavouring to draw up the budgetary estimates corresponding to these matters.

Main Activities

- Aug. 26 Inspected the repairing works of Asakura Shrine and Tosa Shrine (National Treasures) with Nagahiro Nagano, chairman of Education Committee of House of Representatives.
- Sept. 6 Inspected the cultural goods (national treasures) located in Kochi City and vicinity.
- Sept. 15 Attended the meeting of 4 School Superintendents of Shikoku. The school superintendents of Ehime and Tokushima were absent due to their official trip to Tokyo. The meeting was generally inactive.

Evaluation

Generally speaking, the goals for this period were attained. There are found many petitions such as the demand by Teachers' Union on their salaries or the requests by school principals, PTA etc in connection with the next Prefectural Assembly.

One year has passed since the reorganization of high school system. The educational situation of high schools in this prefecture is satisfactory in general except that, to my greatest regret, they are very poor in their facilities and equipments. It is also very regrettable that the Board of Education having no financial power can not quickly meet the demand or petition by principals and PTAs of this schools.

## Immediate Educational Goals with extent of progress

In connection with the carrying out of the course for certification.

In this prefecture from 10th July to 9th Sept. above was to be carried out to give 10 units.

The first period.

From 10th to 20 July attendants were about 370 persons the majority of who were senior High School teachers with very few of primary and Junior High School.

The Second Period - From

From 22nd July All anticipated attendants are participating in this course and is making a good progress. At the end of July the law governing this matter was amended and the teachers union consequently proposed to have the 4th and 5th periods postponed indefinitely to which Education Board agreed to postpone indefinitely the 5th period upon consultation with prefectural office and the university.

It was fairly successful in Kochi-ken to have had so far this course held despite of some slight trouble, when compared with other prefectures.

This course for certification problem gave rise to many nation wide grievances.

It is expected that it will need some alteration or further research in putting into practice this amended law.

We negotiated with the prefectural authorities in connection with the travelling expenses to be given to the teachers to attend the preparatory course for certification, to arrive at no compromise.

Hence we introduced our supplementary budget direct to prefectural assembly which agreed to pay ¥ 9,000,000 in August Session of Ken Assembly. to cover above item. Thus the matter was settled.

2. Re Realization of Preparatory course of certification.

June and July experienced our busiest time in preparing to set up above program. and the measure was studied as to how to give pupils while teachers are attending their preparatory course.

The course was commenced on 10th Jul. as scheduled at 19 places in this "Ken" to which majority of primary and Junior high school teachers did not attend, recording on 336 teachers on the commencing date of which majority attended Kochi City course giving place, composing nearly all of high school teachers.

After negotiation with the teachers union, they agreed to attend the course on and after 22nd July. This matter was thus temporarily brought to a settlement leaving room for budgetary and other problems.

## 1. Distribution of 6-3 building subsidies:

On May 24 informed of the allocated amount of the subsidies to this prefecture by the Education Ministry. Board on it prepared the distribution plan for city, towns and villages, and the final decision of distribution amount was made by the regular committee meeting on June 6. After that prepared the concerned documents to be transmitted to the Education Ministry, and sent them on June 20.

So the situation is that almost all the requirement for supplementary budget will not be discussed before the August Session. Our contact with the prefectural authorities for the supplementary education budget, especially for the budget concerning the re-education is undergoing difficulty.

3. As to the contact with the pref. authorities for the education budgets we have always been in trouble because of lacking financial power on the part of Education Board. We wonder when the independence of Education Board in regard to Education will be realized.

## 1. Teachers' attitude towards House of Councillors' election

The teachers' union in Kochi Prefecture recommended Y. Tamura, a former Board of Education member and a former teacher in cooperation with other labor unions and democratic organizations.

## 2. Teachers' political activities:

The teachers except some special teachers made election campaigns in a position of individual at night and after school, while reflecting upon themselves not to ignore their duties at school. The teachers union was supposed to let all the teachers throughly know Article 137 of the Public Servants' Election Law. In general, most teachers' activities were not illegal, but a few suspects were found out and a few troubles happened because of teachers' careless overdoings.

## 3. Measures taken by B.E. Secretariat:

B.E. Secretariat sent notes to the schools in cooperation with the prefectural election administration committee to get the teachers and students cooperate with them for preventing non-voting.

4 The secretariat sent note to the teachers union not to ignore their duties as educational public servants and not to violate the laws concerned. The secretariat was very watchful of their activities.

## SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

## Immediate Education Goals with Extent of Progress

## 1. Obtaining of budget for next fiscal year.

The negotiation with Governor on the budget not coming to a settlement in regard to 3 points, we presented our Board's own bill to the Prefectural Assembly Meeting. During the session (17 days) we made effort to get their approval, but after all the Governor's plan tentatively passed thru the Assembly. We, however, could get the words that every possible effort will be made hereafter to revise the budget to meet our wish for the said 3 points.

## 2. Making up of policy and practical method on personnel charges in teachers at the end of March.

The policy was already decided, but it seems difficult to fix the concrete method by the end of March owing to the delay in the approval of Pref. Assembly for the next fiscal year budget, by which fixed number of teachers was decided. We are now very busy in conducting this business.

## 3. Preparations concerning the Emperor's visit.

Preparations were finished by the 20th.

## Main Activities

1. Always attending the Prefectural Assembly Session, we gave explanations and answers on the bill.
2. Attended various meetings for preparations to welcome the Emperor.

## Conference held or attended:

Attended the conference of school superintendents of all country, held in Tokyo on the 17th day.

## Evaluation

Pref. Assembly Meeting was held for 17 days, so we were very busy. We generally attained our aims as expected.



## SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION SECTION

## School Finance

## 1. Primary school and junior high school.

- (a) In case of making up the budget at first, personnel expense (salary for one teacher) was fixed at ¥3,700 base x 1.43, because at that time the 3,700 yen base was going to be revised at 6,300 yen base. In fact, however, the pay for teachers was revised at over the said base, so there are caused considerable much deficit in each item of the expense.
- (b) As for travelling expense, the budget was made up at 4,100 yen (the unit price), but with decrease in national subsidy (unit price---¥3,000), the first budget will be inevitably decreased.
- (c) Consideration is required to give ¥1,000 per capita as the allowance for teachers' study.

## 2. Senior High School

- (a) As for the expenses for supplies, such items, comparatively flexible, as the cost of wear and tear, repairing expense, advertisement rates, etc. were required to be decreased owing to increase in the compulsory expenses (communication fees, electric light charges, water-supply rates, full expenses, etc.)
- (b) We were supplied with ¥7,000 of national subsidy for Kochi Agricultural Higher School with a view to promote vocational education. Prefectural expense over the said subsidy should be required for this promotion business.
- (c) With the revision of the Pension Law, the money due to government will be naturally increased.
- (d) The allowance for teachers' study is the same as that for teachers of primary school and junior high school.

## 3. Part-time high school

- (a) The national subsidy was changed in regard to the fixed number of teachers (it was decreased) and the objects of the subsidy as compared with the case where the budget was made up at first, so the budget will also naturally changed.
- (b) The allowance for teachers' study and the money due to government based on the revised Pension Law are same as the above case of senior high school.



## 4. The Blind and deaf school

The allowance for teachers' study is same as primary school and junior high school.

## 5. Others

(a) ¥100,000 was appropriated in the budget as a subsidy for the facilities and working expenses of the 4th primary School of Kochi City, the school designated to be supplied with school lunch through UNICEF.

(b) The balance caused by revision of the base of the teacher's salary will be additionally appropriated in budget with regard to the grant for the teachers' mutual benefit associations of public schools.

## School Finance:

As the standard of number of teachers and budgetary amount fixed by the Education Ministry for the primary and secondary school is out of accord with the real financial situation of Kochi Ken, the red-ink account up to 36,000,000 yen is becoming the cause of trouble.

If the Education Ministry would not provide subsidy as much as one half of the red-ink amount for us, it is afraid that the educational level of this Prefecture will be lowered with the heavy monetary burden on the part of Prefectural people in general.
