SUBJECT: Weekly Report of Police Branch Activities for Period
30 August Through 4 September 1948

TO: Chief, Public Safety Division

1. Conferences:

a. Chief Administrator with W. L. Thompson, MP&T Branch, CI&E re: Lewdness and indecency in legitimate theaters of Tokyo. Action: Thompson requests PSD assistance in cleaning indecency from Tokyo theater plays. Plan of action to be studied with CI&E and Tokyo MPD.

b. Chief Administrator with I. Taketa, T. Watanabe, and Y. Aoki of MPD re: Indecency in Tokyo theaters. Action: Discussion of provisions of minor offense law and other laws empowering police to make arrests on indecent plays. Also procedure for making arrests. No action until further conference between CI&E and PSD.

c. Chief Administrator with Tanaka of MPD re: Reports on Kyoto meeting of Chiefs of Six Cities; (2) Toho Studio Strike; (3) Disciplinary action on 2 policemen. Action: (1) General discussion; (2) Strikers obeying court order and negotiating with management; (3) Two policemen discharged for disobedience to orders - have taken case to court.

d. Chief Administrator with Furuya of MPD re: Economic raids. Action: Leakage of information within police department. New method of planning raids must be developed. To confer further on 2 September.

e. Chief Administrator with Nakagawa and Morino of NRPNHq re: Transfer of men from other agencies to NRP. Action: Final PSD approval of 134 names. Twenty-six additional names being held up for PSD study.

f. Administrator Williams with Investigator Munroe, Mr. Ogino, Takao and Manzen of Identification Section, NRPNHq re: Proposed NPSC regulation on fingerprints. Action: NRP submitted its third draft of regulation revised as per PSD suggestions. All PSD fingerprint program has been accepted now by NRP except shorter fingerprint form. Final conference on this scheduled 3 September.

g. Administrator Kimberling with Investigator McCarthy and CCS at Dai Ichi Building -- weekly meeting of Planning and Research Committee for police communications. Action: Radio and telephone problems and methods of better maintenance discussed. To meet again 7 September to report progress.

h. Chief Administrator with Carusi of CIS re: Police attending assemblies and meetings. Action: Follow-up on conference with Chief CIS, Chief PSD, and personnel of Labor Div., CIS, and CIC, re authority of police in attending meetings. Delivered PSD study of matter to Carusi and discussed contents of same.

i. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa, F. Muto, K. Ogura, and M. Morino of NRPNHq re: Procurator-police cooperation. Action: Discussed draft of order to be issued jointly by NPSC and Procurator-General. Discussed other procurator practices which interfere with efficient police procedure. Continued to 3 September when all present will meet with H. Meyers of Legal Section on same subject.

j. Administrator Williams, Investigator Munroe with Messrs Ogino, Takao, Manzen of Identification Section, NRPNHq re: Regulation on fingerprints. Action: 1. Two further revisions suggested by PSD accepted by NRP. 2. Agreement reached that long fingerprint forms will continue to be used until present stocks are exhausted before change-over to American style short report form. 3. NRP requests to be shown movies or slides of American style Identification Bureau.

k. Administrator Fritz with K. Matsumoto, 1st Traffic Section, MPD re: Traffic cases pending in Tokyo courts. Action: 1. Report submitted by Matsumoto. 1,672 persons presently awaiting trial in 11 ward courts. Does not substantiate previous report of 5,000 cases reported. Only 60 cases pending according to Meyers of Government Section. Further investigation to be made. 2. Requested weekly report on number of traffic cases sent to procurator's office. 3. Requested list of locations by time of day where MPD horses and men are presently being trained on traffic control before being moved to Tokyo Central traffic areas.

l. Chief Administrator with M. Morino of NRPNHq re: Revisions in procedure of National Criminal Identification Bureau. Action: Police Branch survey shows necessity of revising fingerprint forms and filing of same, as Japanese system too bulky for increased fingerprint activities. Chief of Bureau objects to change. PSD policy to remain unchanged on matter and PSD will assist in securing budget for new files and forms, as bureau is keystone to efficient police service.

m. Chief Administrator with Chief Kobayashi and Section Chief Otsu of Yokohama City Police re: Rules and regulations for Municipal Police. Action: General discussion of promotional exams, discipline, retirement, and police procedure. Chief Kobayashi will appoint committee to study draft rules and regulations after same are delivered to him.

n. Chief Administrator with Chief PSD and Lt. Colonel Randall of CIS re: Honjo, Saitama Ken investigation. Action: General discussion of material for checksheet. Checksheet being prepared by Colonel Randall.

o. Chief Administrator and Administrator Mulbar with Chief PSD, Saito and Morino of NRPNHq re: Budgets for improving efficiency of present NRP, without increasing size of force. Action: General discussion of budget items. After study of same, PSD will support those items approved by PSD.

p. Administrator Mulbar with Kimura, K. Yumama and R. Okada of Imperial Guard re: Proposed Rules and Regulations. Action: Further discussion to be held early part of next week.

q. Administrator Fritz with Major W. E. Rowens, TI&E re: Traffic Safety announcements on Armed Forces Radio. Action: Obtained all back issues of Traffic Safety spot announcements. To be turned over to Mr. Huggins, CI&E Radio Section for presentation to Japanese.

r. Administrator Fritz with M. Nakano, Chief of National NRP Traffic Section re: Radio publicity on Traffic Safety throughout Japan. Action: Nakano has contacted the Japanese National Broadcasting Corporation of Japan and has their support for spot traffic safety announcements. Further consultations to be held. CI&E support promised in okaying any plan submitted by the Japanese.

s. Administrator Fritz with M. Kobayashi, Chief of Police, Yokohama City re: Traffic. Action: Motorized patrol to be started between south end of city to Totska (Rt. #1). Traffic Safety islands through Yokohama on Rt. #1 to be painted a distinctive color.

t. Chief Administrator with Murai of NRPNHq re: Railway strike situation. Action: NRP report to PSD on present situation in strike of railway workers. The strike has not assumed harmful proportions to date.

u. Chief Administrator with Chief Fire Administrator and Carusi of GIS re: Securing support of Tokyo Fire Marshal on police and fire attendance at meetings and assemblies. Action: Chief Fire Administrator will secure statement from Tokyo Fire Marshal, and same will be hand-carried to GIS.

v. Chief Administrator with Tomida of MPD re: Juvenile activities of MPD. On Tuesday 7 September, MPD will make roundup of homeless juveniles in all parts of Tokyo. Action: Approved plan for roundup.

w. Chief Administrator with Dr. Aoki of Keio University re: Police use of abandoned 720th MP barracks as police school. Keio wishes to use barracks as branch of University. Action: Notified Dr. Aoki that PSD has no knowledge of use for school. Sent him to see Chief Tanaka of MPD.

x. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Aso of NRP re: Support of PSD in the NRP application to Price Control Section for rationed shoes to be used by the police. Action: Mr. Aso assured of PSD support in this matter.

y. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Murai, NRP re: The disapproval of Finance Section, ESS, on the appropriation in the police budget for rewards and informant fees. Action: Mr. Murai urged to expedite English translation of this appropriation as passed by Finance Minister and the Diet. That PSD cannot take any action in this matter until translation is received and studied.

z. Administrator Mulbar with T. Ohisuka, NRP re: 1. Revision of NRP training text books. 2. Police training program. Action: 1. Reported that slow progress being made. Agreed that reports of the progress of this project will be reported at regular intervals to PSD. 2. Mr. Ohisuka advised to have municipal police checked to be sure personnel being trained according to schedule and program.

aa. Administrator Fritz with Mr. Iwata, member of the Tokyo City Council and member of Council Police Committee re: Operations of Police and Public Safety Commission. Action: Mr. Iwata was informed of relationship of city councils to police in USA. Mr. Iwata is a self-confessed communist.

bb. Administrator Kimberling with Mr. Oshida, MOD Radio Research Bureau re: Problems of obtaining and training radio operators for police emergency stations. Action: Study of present qualified operators and methods of increasing the number to adequately operate emergency stations will be made by Mr. Oshida.

cc. Administrator Kimberling with Mr. Murai, Chief Guard Section, NRP re: Status of all former NRP boats. Action: Mr. Murai will furnish up to date report.

dd. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Kashiwamura and Miwa of NRP re: Appropriation for rewards and informant fees to the police budget. Action: Translation of request made and approved by Budget Director and Diet submitted. Plan conference with Mr. Reeves, Finance Section, ESS, Tuesday.

ee. Administrator Fritz with Nakano, Chief NRP National Traffic Section, M. Miyagi, Chief Tokyo-To NRP Traffic Section, and K. Hashimoto, Chief MPD, Traffic Section re: Funds for Traffic Safety Leaflets. Action: 500,000 yen made available by MPD, 50,000 yen made available by NRP. Approximate cost per leaflet is 2 yen. 275,000 leaflets to be printed in Japanese and English. Tokyo-To NRP decided to hold and coordinate their Traffic Safety Week to same time as MPD.

ff. Investigator Hill with Colonel Nash, AC of S, G-2, 1st Cav. Divn re: Securing planes for Traffic Safety Week (10-16 September 1948) to release leaflets over Tokyo and vicinity towards Camp Drake. Action: Two planes to be made available during the week from 13 September 1948.

2. Surveys and Inspections:

a. The following stations (police) were inspected by Police Branch personnel:

Investigator Johnston:	Akabane - Satisfactory Submitted memo report to Chief, Police Br.

3. Miscellaneous:

a. Administrator Mulbar prepared data to justify the NRP holding presently occupied properties in 5 locations (Yamaguchi, Miyazaki, Oita, Iwate-2) used for police training. Justification for the retention of these properties requested by Civil Properties Custodian.

b. Administrator Fritz continued work on MPD Traffic Section re-organization plans.

c. Investigator Hill continued traffic survey by visiting Yotsuya and Yodabashi Police Stations.

d. Investigator Kilgore continued surveying the traffic situation at Nihonbashi Police Station and Marunouchi Police Station. Submitted separate report.

- e. Administrator Williams continued study of Japanese record system.
- f. Investigator Munroe gathered material re fingerprint technique to assist NRP in preparing a manual. Studied instruction material of several U.S. Police Departments.
- g. Investigator Jackson continued preparation of Sendai Region Report.
- h. Investigator O'Neill visited NRP for material re strength and ranks of NRP in college, Regional School and a Higher Regional School. Interviewed Mr. Yamamoto and Mr. Otsuka.
- i. Administrator Kimberling completed preparation of TDY report.
- j. Investigator Johnston (1) checked provisions of second-hand dealers law, (2) investigated crowded conditions in Tokyo jails. (1) Rough draft of law to be drawn by Attorney-General. (2) Requested weekly report of number of prisoners in each jail and number of transfers.
- k. Administrator Mulbar received motion picture scenario "New Police System" from staff member of CI&E for comment. Worked on rules and regulations that may be used as a pattern for cities, towns, and villages of small population.
- l. Administrator Fritz conducted preliminary investigation to see if there is any Traffic Safety Film in Theatre and possibility of obtaining same for Japanese orientation and education purposes. No film in Theatre available for use, however, film can be obtained through CI&E from Washington, D. C. by submitting a memo to CI&E. Film can be run in all Japanese theaters through CI&E connection.
- m. Investigators Hill and Kilgore began and completed compilation of statutes for past year on number of conferenced held with occupation forces and Japanese plus number of man-hours spent in field.
- n. Investigator Johnston checked method of replacing worn tires and possibility of obtaining tires for police automotive equipment with Foreign Trade Company of Tokyo. Investigation to continue.
- o. Investigator Johnston with Mr. Iwata, checked crowded conditions of jail cells and medical care. Submitted report to Chief, Police Branch.
- p. Investigator Bishop visited police college to witness squad and platoon drill.
- q. Investigator O'Neill visited police college to check on staff and work assigned to each police officer. Report on same will be submitted after Investigator visits Regional and Higher Regional Schools.
- r. Administrator Mulbar completed first draft of rules and regulations for small municipal police departments and submitted for typing.
- s. Administrator Mulbar checked scenario for motion picture "New Police System" for CI&E and found no material in proposed movie as objectionable. Scenario referred to Chief Administrator.
- t. Investigator O'Neill gathered material on the Honjo Case (Saitama). Interviewed Mr. R. Yamaguchi, Asahi newspaper re present activities of his reporters in Saitama who exposed this case.
- u. Investigator Johnston investigated ways and means of obtaining replacement tires for Japanese police with Japanese Government Transportation Section. Allotment of available tires made on a priority basis. Requested a detailed list of distribution of next allotment.
- v. Investigator Hill conducted further investigation of Japanese vehicle registration and gas consumption.
- w. Chief Administrator, Administrator Kimberling and Investigator McCarthy inspected, with Roche and Blankenship of CCS, MPD telephone switchboards and landline communication system. Found the system to be antiquated.

Lines for many other agencies mingled with police lines. Inadequate emergency service. CCS requests PSD support in construction of new emergency switchboards and removing lines of other agencies from among police lines. No Action. Matter to be discussed with Chief, PSD.

x. Administrator Mulbar received telephone call from Mr. Sullivan requesting return of radio script "New Police System" which had been submitted to PSD for comment. Script now being held for examination by Chief Administrator.

y. Administrator Mulbar submitted for comment and approval proposed pattern of rules and regulations for police departments of large cities.

z. Investigator Hill began school safety patrol project at Ogu Public School for experimentation purposes (to protect school children when crossing streets and intersections). Project to continue with assistance from Police Branch. Ultimate aim is to set up throughout Tokyo City after a good working example is established at Ogu.

aa. Administrator Williams contacted CID Criminal Laboratory along with Investigator Munroe re training material in FEC on fingerprints. It was ascertained that no fingerprints are filed here by classification, only by name. No other suitable training material was found. Also started preparation of report on fingerprints in Japanese Criminal Identification System.

bb. Investigator Johnston investigated improper handling of criminal case - Nihonbashi Police Station, S. Matsumoto, Chief and Y. Okada, policeman. Memo report submitted. Case will be followed up until satisfactory handling is assured.

cc. Chief Administrator attended opening ceremony of Economic Investigation Board at the Industry Club, third floor.

dd. Investigator Hill and Administrator Fritz prepared Traffic Safety material and made arrangements to assist MPD in Traffic Safety Week, 10 to 16 September, 1948. Pamphlet pertaining to pedestrians, bicyclists, and motorists prepared. Arrangements being attempted to distribute by airplane.

ee. Investigator Kilgore began and completed preparation of report on MPD Traffic Section Investigation.

ff. Investigator Johnston checked Takinagawa Police Station with Chief Suzuki re prisoner detention and condition of jail. Jail checked and memo report submitted to Chief Police Administrator.

gg. Investigator Johnston continued checking detention of prisoners in Tokyo jails with Legal Section, SCAP and MPD. Submitted memo report. Progress being made re medical care and transfer of prisoners from overcrowded jails. Also witnessed and made report to Inspector Obi of gang-fight near Imperial Hotel. Police will patrol and arrest delinquents.


hh. Investigator McCarthy checked communication sections of local police stations and status of police radio project in Research and Development Section, CCS. Manufacturers not being pushed until decision by CPC on production allotment.

ii. Investigator McCarthy checked types of tubes used in Motorola and Link radios, and procedures for obtaining spare tubes. Discussed communications plans with Police Affairs Section, Yokohama Municipal Police. Found that tubes have to be requisitioned through TIS supply. Yokohama communications plan to be submitted for consideration.

jj. Investigator McCarthy completed draft of regulations for police emergency radio stations and submitted for comments.

kk. Investigator McCarthy worked out method of obtaining replacement radio tubes for Communication equipment being used by Japanese police.

1. Conferences:

a. Chief Administrator with Dr. Aoki of Keio University
 re: Possibility of University obtaining 720th Military Police Barracks
 for branch college. Action: Informed Dr. Aoki that NRP has great need
 for training facilities and PSD will assist NRP in every way to obtain
 barracks for Central Police College use. Also possibility that Univer-
 sity can obtain present college facilities, which will be vacated. Dr.
 Aoki advised to confer with Shibata of NRP.

b. Chief Administrator with M. Gotoda, H. Kobayashi, inter-
 preter, re: Scheduled Sergeant examination. Action: Draft of examination
 announcement found to favor certain classes of policemen. At request of
 PSD same will be revised to eliminate condition, and again presented to
 PSD.

c. Administrator Mulbar with Shibata and Honda of NRP re:
 Property at Nakana (former 720th Military Police Barracks) being released
 to the Japanese Government. Action: If turned over to NRP, will be used
 for Police College and Higher Division Regional School.

d. Administrator Mulbar with Budget Director, Finance Minister's
 Office re: Property at Nakana to be released to the Japanese Government.
 Action: Urged that the property be given to the NRP to be used as training
 school.

e. Investigator O'Neill with Vice Public Procurator-General, T.
 Watanabe and assistants re: "Honjo" case. Action: Stressed the interest
 GHQ was taking in this case and requested detailed report from procurator's
 office on contemplated action to be followed by further reports till case
 is closed.

f. Administrator Kimberling with T. Manzen, M. Koynagi, Marine
 Safety Bureau re: Problems of Water Police, Dokai Bay, Kyushu. Action:
 Arrangements made for conference with interested officials at Wakamatsu
 Fukuoka, September 22 and 23.

g. Chief Administrator with Aso and T. Hirohata of NRPNHq re:
 (1) Trial and experiments with gas as possible future police weapon in
 riots, and (2) possibility of securing 200 motorcycles, 50 for MP, balance
 for NRP. Action: (1) ESS has approved allocation of experimental gas.
 They recommend CN for tear gas in lieu of chloropictrine that police are
 now using in experiments. (2) Aso told to prepare estimates of cost and
 PSD will discuss with ESS.

h. Administrator Mulbar with Captain Nealon, Chief Administrator
 and Miss Jose, CI&E re: Plan to publicize Public Safety program in Japan.
 Action: Miss Jose assured of the cooperation of Police Section. Chief
 Administrator accepted data for report on police activities and program
 in Japan by Japanese police.

i. Investigator Johnston with Dr. Lewis, PSD, Chief Police Administrator, and Mr. Appleton, Legal and Government Section, SCAP re: Detention conditions in Tokyo jails. Action: Further conference scheduled for 17 September 1948.

j. Administrator Fritz with N. Nakano, Chief, National NRP Traffic Section, re: Proposed budget. Action: Assistance from this office assured Nakano in obtaining things needed, however, this office knows nothing of the yen value and ESS will have to be contacted.

k. Chief Administrator and Administrator Fritz with S. Aso of NRPNHq re: PSD assistance to NRP in obtaining 200 British used motorcycles (150 NRP - 50 MP) at cost of ¥31,000,000, including freight and repairs. Action: Administrator Fritz to discuss with ESS Budget Branch.

l. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa and M. Morino re: Final transfer of 26 men from other agencies into NRP. Action: General discussion. PSD decision to allow no reserve list final. To be continued regarding qualifications of part of 26.

m. Chief Administrator and Kimberling with Chief Suzuki of Osaka MP re: Policing conditions in Osaka and planned installation of radios at Osaka. Action: General report of activities of Public Safety Commission and police department. Administrator Kimberling and Suzuki to confer further on radio installation.

n. Chief Administrator with Kawahara and Kitamura of Railway Security Office, Transportation Ministry, re: Status of planned RSO force. Action: Enactment of law and organization of force has been delayed. PSD will confer with CTS regarding problems.

o. Administrator-in-Charge with Mr. Aso, Chief Equipment Section, NRP re: Pistol ranges. Action: Checked blueprints for model range for prefecture police. Inadequate as to range and number of targets. Suggested revision.

p. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Otsuka of NRP re: Use of 720th Military Police Barracks for Police College. Action: Mr. Otsuka reports no opposition thus far from Finance Minister re NRP getting possession of 720th Military Police Barracks at Nakano. Administrator and NRP feel confident of getting property unless MG recommends to Finance Minister it be used for other than police purposes.

q. Administrator Mulbar with Administrator-in-Charge, and Aso of NRP re: Building of firing ranges at Regional and Prefectural Police Schools. Action: PSD recommends ranges at Prefectural School be not less than 25 yards in length large enough to accommodate 25 students or more at one time. Ranges at Regional Schools be not less than 100 yards.

r. Administrator Fritz with M. Nakano, Chief NRP National Traffic Section and S. Aso, Chief of Equipment Section, NRP (Nat'l) re: Proposed Traffic Budget and obtainment of 200 motorcycles from British Commonwealth Occupation Forces (150 to NRP and 50 MP). Action: Conference scheduled with Budget Section, ESS, 0900, 17 September, 1948 to discuss proposed Japanese budget.

s. Administrator-in-Charge with Administrator Mulbar, Suzuki, Chief of Osaka MP re: Training schools. Action: Desired to open new school with different curricula in Osaka. Decided to abandon idea at present. Will cooperate in present program.

t. Administrator-in-Charge with Hara, Chief of Guard Section, MPD, re: Typhoon damage. Action: Received report. Submitted written report to Chief, PSD.

u. Chief Administrator, Chief Prison Administrator and Investigator Johnston with Appleton of Legal Section, Sato et al from Attorney-General's office, and Tanaka et al from MPD re: Police detention problems. Action:

1. Tanaka will remodel two police buildings into detention hospitals (temporary). 2. Planning underway for permanent police detention hospital to be built on grounds of police employee hospital. 3. Thirty to 40 police stations will be designated for detention of women and children, partitioned from men prisoners, with 24-hours supervision by newly employed jail matrons. 4. Two temporary detention hospitals (1 above) will later be converted to juvenile detention houses. 5. Sato will approach judges second time for designation of MPD as detaining agent, without specifying specific jails for detention.

v. Chief Administrator with Suzuki of Osaka MP re: Police activities in Osaka. Action: General discussion and advice to Suzuki.

w. Administrator Fritz with Mr. E. C. Hutchinson, Finance Section, ESS, re: Proposed Nt'l. Budget for Traffic. Action: PSD assured the co-operation of ESS. To be followed up.

x. Chief Administrator with S. Izeki, Regional Director, Hiroshima Region NRP, re: General police conditions in region and release of boats to MP and MSB. Action: All boats now transferred from NRP. General discussion of police conditions.

y. Administrator-in-Charge with Shibata, Honda, and Otsuka, re: Training. Action: Reviewed program and events transpiring while Administrator-in-Charge was in United States. Outlined objectives of training material in riot control. Future conference scheduled.

z. Administrator-in-Charge with Morino and Nakagawa. Action: Requested to lecture to PSC group on new American police methods. Tentatively arranged for September 21.

aa. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Nakagawa and Honda of NRP re: Proposed inspection of Regional and Prefectural schools in 5th and 6th NRP districts. Action: Plans to be arranged by NRP so that all schools in 5th and 6th districts may be visited and inspected on this field trip.

2. Surveys and Inspections:

a. Investigator O'Neill inspected Kojimachi Police Station and Police Barracks at Kudan. Conclusion: Superintendent Shoji's appearance and manner was that of a man recovering from a "drunk." Police Barracks (150 men) overcrowded and filthy. Each man does his own cooking in rooms and corridors -- garbage dumped out of windows. As these 150 men are new police, they are likely to be discouraged by these living conditions. Superintendent Shoji warned to have this situation remedied. Barracks will be visited again in near future.

3. Miscellaneous:

c. Investigator Johnston checked detention conditions at Yatsuya Police Station, Toyotama V.D. Hospital and called at P.M.O. Made arrangements for further conference re medical treatment for prisoners

Has this been brought to chief Tanaka's attention? If not do so Done - WEP ASE

d. Investigator McCarthy discussed VHF Radio hook-up for fireworks display 18 September and supplementary Budget for police communications purposes; maintaining program for NRP radio nets. VHF radio hook-up for fireworks display recommended. NRP to furnish 3 VHF sets for occasion. All Kens except Aichi equipped with proper crystals for maintaining program.

e. Administrator Mulbar presented plan for a National Tournament of Police Judo to be held November 12 at Tokyo Regional School by Mr. Otsuka, NRP.

f. Administrator Mulbar continued working on notes for data to answer checksheet re Police Vigilantes.

g. Investigators Kilgore, Bishop and Hill checked progress of Traffic Safety Week and enforcement measures at Asakusa, Ueno, Kanda and Shimbashi and other points in Tokyo. Decided improvement noted in enforcement, efficiency and public awareness of traffic safety behavior.

h. Administrator Fritz observed dropping of leaflets from top of Post Exchange, NYK and Marunouchi buildings. Good coverage was made.

i. Investigators Russell and Hill dropped Traffic Safety Week leaflets

j. Chief Administrator delivered final list of PSD approved transfers from other agencies to NRP, to Nakagawa. Final list contained 26 names. Because of low ranks specified by PSD for 2nd Grade Government officials, such officials not expected to accept NRP positions. Others will not accept because must transfer immediately. NRP NOW CLOSED TO ALL EXCEPT RECRUIT POLICEMEN.

k. Chief Administrator, Administrator Kimberling, Executive Officer studied and approved SCAPIN draft submitted by Combs of CCS giving approval to use foreign patents in constructing police radios sufficient for all MP and NRP stations. Draft approved for PSD. Same will be submitted to CPC, and then submitted to G-2 and other concerned sections.

l. Investigator Johnston continued checking detention conditions in Tokyo jails. Called Mr. Teshiha's (Chief of Criminal Section) attention to unsatisfactory conditions. He promised more action on transfer of prisoners from overcrowded jails.

m. Investigator McCarthy continued work on procurement of radio tubes. Attended discussion with Mr. Seccombe of CCS re license for police radio operators. Consideration will be given to a special classification.

n. Administrator-in-Charge returned from TDY in ZI.

u. Investigator McCarthy (1) Discussed with Inspector Kozimachi re: Communications budget. (2) Checked frequencies used by NRP. (1) Same difficulty being encountered by NRP in obtaining necessary funds. (2) Night

v. Investigator Hill arranged with Signal Corps to take pictures of MPD motorcycles. Copies to be obtained by this office.

w. Chief Administrator, Administrator-in-Charge, Administrator Mulbar, Administrator Kimberling worked on assignment of describing TDY trips for War Manpower Committee.

x. Investigator McCarthy checked mobile radio used in police boat for fireworks demonstration on Sumida river. Radio installed in boat and was used satisfactorily.

SUBJECT: Weekly Report of Police Branch Activities for Period
23 August Through 28 August 1948.

TO: Chief, Public Safety Division

1. Conferences:

a. Chief Administrator, Captain Nealon, Administrator Fritz, and Captain Jump with General Ferrin et al at Provost Marshal Office re: G-2 request that right turns be eliminated at A and Z intersection. Action: General Ferrin will not eliminate unless ordered by Commanding General 8th Army, or traffic count and study indicates move should be made. Count and study will be immediately conducted under Provost Marshal supervision. Conference report submitted.

b. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa of NRPNHq re: lists for transfer back to NRP from other government agencies. Action: PSD policy repeated - no reserve list will be established. On list of higher officials, Nakagawa has reduced original number from 76 to 13, and expects to reduce further. This, only one of three lists. All to be ready by 1 September.

c. Chief Administrator with Hara of MPD re: Toho Studio strike situation. Action: At PSD request, Hara reported that the studio remains under ownership control. News item of 21 August (Nippon Times) incorrect in stating strikers have again taken over studio. With owner's permission strikers are allowed to enter studio and use an office there. This was also specified in court order.

d. Chief Administrator with Shimada and Isobe of Shin Nippon Gaguin (New Japan School) re: disposition of school under new law prohibiting private reformatories. Action: Complete discussion of problem. As not Police Branch problem, referred case to Prison Branch.

e. Chief Administrator with G. Tanaka of Mainichi News re: pick-pocket methods in Japan and America. Action: Off the record discussion, not for publication. General discussion.

f. Administrator Mulbar with Nakagawa of NRPNHq re: (1) NRP training program, (2) revision of text books, (3) regional schools, (4) police school promotional examinations. Action: Nakagawa reports remodeling and repair of regional schools delayed by Construction Board. Japanese Government instructed to urge immediate action on work. If advisable, PSD would

gladly meet with Construction Board to stress importance of immediate action - NRP urged to use every possible facility for training program to meet schedule. Request made for sample of various types of written examinations given to recruits and in the promotional program. Advised that PSD wished to confer at intervals with police officials working on revision of Japanese police text books. Mr. Nakagawa states final draft of the Emergency Defense Plan by NRP will be submitted shortly to PSD for comment, suggestion and approval.

g. Administrator Fritz with Hara, Chief, Patrol and Traffic Section, MPD, re: possibility of transferring remaining 25 horses to Traffic Section for parking and intersection control. Action: Opposition by Tokyo City Assembly being met by Hara to keep horses. Hara to fight to keep horses and transfer to Traffic Section. Immediate training of horses and men to begin in outlying areas. Duration 1-2 months. Horses to be then stationed in Central Tokyo Traffic Area. This office to be kept advised.

h. Administrator Fritz with M. Miyagi, Chief, Tokyo-to NRP Traffic Section, re: (1) traffic accident examples and (2) status of 5 new motorcycles. Action: (1) A considerable number of traffic accident examples were obtained for education purposes. (2) Priority has been obtained, money appropriated and arrangements made with Rikus Co. to positively deliver 2 motorcycles with side cars on 7 September 1948 and 3 motorcycles, possibly by 30 September 1948. Follow-up to be made.

i. Administrator Williams and Investigator Munroe with Mr. Takao, NRPNHq et al re: proposed NPSC regulation on fingerprints. Action: PSD revision of proposed regulation draft submitted to NRP. Another conference scheduled later this week after translation into Japanese language. Also inspected NRP fingerprint and modus operandi files. Leaks in roof of this building are causing untold damage to these irreplaceable files. NRP told to start new location or repair the present site.

j. Chief Administrator with Tanaka, Chief MPD re: Hirasawa, Sadamachi arrest on suspicion of Teikoku Bank murders. Action: Information given PSD on evidence which caused issuance of warrant and arrest of suspect. Also on progress of investigation since arrest and on treatment of prisoner since arrest.

k. Administrator Fritz with M. Nakano, Chief, National NRP Traffic Section, re: (1) outline of his traffic activities to date, (2) deplorable traffic conditions in Japan. Action: (1) impressed the administrator that he hasn't been doing much of anything. Further check to be made. (2) Informed of points made by U.S. higher headquarters and told to correct same throughout Japan. Information to be relayed to all MP and NRP stations. (3) Informed Nakano to start preparation on a 6-12 months traffic safety program for radio. Also, traffic safety education slogans for in between radio programs.

l. Investigator Munroe with Administrator Williams and Mr. Muto, Mr. Ogino, Mr. Takao et al, NRPNHq, Identification Section, re: proposed NPSC Regulations on fingerprints. Action: Two forms drafted by PSD at request of NRP submitted to NRP. Will be translated into Japanese and discussed at conference scheduled for 27 August 1948 at PSD.

m. Chief Administrator with Mr. Muto, Mr. Ogura and Mr. Morino of NRPNHq re: Activities of procurators in supervising police investigations. Action: Reports from all parts of Japan show that procurators are assuming direct command of investigations and are refusing permission for police to apply to courts for warrants in a great number of cases. Problem to be discussed with Attorney General and Staff at joint meeting at Legal Section 26 August 1948.

n. Chief Administrator with H. Meyers (Legal Section); Procurator General Fukui and staff; National Public Safety Commissioners Ubukata and Kiyose; Assistant Director-General Mizobuchi of NRP and staff re: Interpretation of procurator-police relationship under provisional criminal code and new Code of Criminal Procedure. Action: Discussion of Justice Ministry order requiring police to apply to procurator for warrants. Decision to properly adjust to allow police to apply direct to courts for warrants unless procurator is investigating concerned case and has notified police. NPSC and Procurator General will draw up joint order and meet again with PSD and LS.

o. Administrator Fritz with M. Nakano, Chief, National NRP Traffic Division, re: Traffic Education within prefectures. Action: Two prefectures doing fairly well thru newspapers (Tochigi and Saitama). Nothing could be reported on other prefectures by Nakano. Nakano to confer with two leading newspapers in Japan for cooperation and space for traffic safety education items. Pictures to be taken of all traffic and pedestrian accidents. Not done before. Newspaper cameramen to be called in to take pictures when police have none. Further conference to be held later.

p. Investigator Johnston; with Dr. Manitoff, Mr. Keshiba and Mr. Okahara at Tokyo M/G Team, MPD Headquarters, Accounting Section, Attorney-General's Office re: Long Detention of prisoners in city jails, crowded conditions and medical facilities of city jails. Action: Arranged conference for 31 August with Dr. Manitoff, M/G representatives of Tokyo-to Health and Welfare, Attorney General, MPD; and Investigator to be held at M/G Headquarters.

q. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa, S. Yamamoto and M. Morino of NRPNHq re: final transfers from other agencies to NRP. Action: Lists submitted for PSD study, with histories of officials: (1) 133 policemen to Superintendents with much police experience, direct transfer with no loans; (2) 13 Superintendents, direct transfer with no loans; (3) 11 senior superintendents and 2 chief superintendents transfer with seven to be loaned back to other agencies.

r. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Kimura, Mr. Okada and Mr. Yuyama of Imperial Guard re: their proposed rules and regulations. Action: Another conference on this subject will be held next week when complete plans and recommendations will be submitted for the Imperial Guard Rules and Regulations to PSD.

s. Administrator Mulbar with Major J.P. Napier, Government Section, re: appropriation in the police budget (NRP) for the purpose of rewards and informant fees. Approval previously refused by Finance Section, ESS, due to Legal Section and Government Section non-approval. Question had been im-

properly submitted by NRP. Action: Conference to be held on this subject this week with Finance Section, ESS.

t. Administrator Fritz with M. Higuchi, Z. Ogawa, K. Koike, Supreme Court and I. Kageyama, Attorney General's Office, re: (1) Seriousness of approximately 5000 traffic cases pending court action in Tokyo; (2) Legality of present Japanese traffic laws in a democratic court. Action: (1) A full and detailed discussion was held explaining the operation of courts in the USA re: handling minor traffic violators, (2) Definitions fail to define. Terms and descriptions will not be upheld in a court operating under democratic principles. Present laws are ambiguous and confusing. None of the above had ever been brought to their attention, however, they seemed quite interested and will study the entire problem and present their opinions to this office at a later date. "Model traffic laws and ordinances" were loaned to them for general study. Also, a copy of the California Vehicle Code.

u. Investigator McCarthy with Central Committee for police communications. Action: Report submitted separately.

v. Investigator McCarthy re: reorganization of NRP Communications Sections. Action: Report submitted separately.

w. Administrator Fritz with Mr. Craner, Prison Branch, PSD; and Captain Jump, PSD Liaison Office, at CPC re: Prison and police land and buildings. Action: Report to be submitted by Captain Jump.

x. Administrator Williams with Investigator Munroe, PSD; Chief Ogino, Mr. Mangan and Mr. Takao of Identification Section, NRPNHq re: proposed regulation on fingerprints. Action: Discussion of NRP's second draft which follows in most parts the PSD draft. Suggestions for further revisions made by PSD to clarify some portions which were vague. Will be submitted again to PSD 31 August 1948.

y. Investigator Johnston with (1) Makari, Yokoi and Hirohata of NRP re: Second-hand Store Law; (2) at Supreme Court Conference Room re: Long detention of prisoners between arrest and trial or transfer to detention prison, crowded conditions and medical facilities of city jails. Action: (1) Changes to be made in contemplated law before presenting to Attorney General. See memo report to Chief, PSD; (2) See memo report to Chief, PSD.

z. Chief Administrator with Chief, Public Safety Division, Chief, CIS; J.S. Carusi of CIS, Lt. Colonel F.M. Hosterman of CIC; J. F. Fesperman of CIS Operations; S. Romer and L. Appel of ESS Labor Division; re: Surveillance of meetings by Japanese police. Action: Labor Division claims that SCAPIN 93 is being violated. Matter will be studied by PSD and Mr. Carusi of CIS, and recommendations will be made as to necessity of requesting amendment of SCAPIN.

aa. Administrator Mulbar with T. Fujita, S. Horizaki and H. Kobayashi, Tokyo Metropolitan Police Department, re: Circumstances leading to the arrest and detention of Sadamichi Hirazawa, suspect in the Teikoku Bank mass murder case. Action: They were assured the support of PSD in their action and urged to cultivate the friendship of the press.

bb. Administrator Mulbar with Shibata, NRP Training Section, re: results of his recent inspection of police schools in Hokkaido and Sendai. Action: Reported Finance Minister has approved of the appropriation for the purchase of property in Fukuoka for the 6th NRP Regional School.

cc. Investigator McCarthy with CCS Domestic Radio Section re: size of police radio stations at Nakano and Sapporo. Correction of Shizuoka area operators. Action: Two 2-KW, six 1-KW 500 watt, six 100-watt approved for Tokyo area. Sapporo to obtain 1 KW set if possible.

with Mr. Kawahara, NRP radio section, emergency radio plan; discussed with Monji and Tsuchiya, NRP Communications Section, plans for new radio stations at Nakano, Sapporo, Osaka and Fukuoka. All original documents pertaining to communications to go to central file, copy to Police Branch. NRP motorola and link radios in Tokyo area to be used in case of flood in Kanto area. Construction Bureau to provide trucks from Headquarters at Funabashi. Possible sources of boats to be investigated by NRP. NRP requesting ¥67,000,000 for new radio stations. Plan now being translated.

c. Investigator O'Neil continued working on material in connection with replacing police with civilians (NRP) and continued working on questions and answers requested by Chief Administrator.

d. Investigator McCarthy (1) investigated subsidy by National Government to MP; and (2) wrote memo re CCS request for opinion on legality of police telephone transfer. Action: (1) NRP given power to distribute ¥1,800,000,000 among all MP allocations already made, but money will not be paid out until December. (2) Projects requested by MP must be approved by each prefectural Finance Office.

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e. Investigator Munroe conducted investigation re: progress of new crime statistics report system based on PSD recommendations, Crime Statistics Section, NRPNHq, Mr. Yoshida, Assistant Chief, Crime Statistics Section. Report being delayed by routing prefecture reports through regional offices. Investigator suggested eliminating regional offices from report route to Tokyo and NRP will report later on feasibility of this.

f. Administrator Williams continued making study of fingerprint system, NRP.

g. Investigator McCarthy investigated MPD VHF activities. Discussed alternate site for Fukuoka Police Radio with NRP, investigated special subsidy to MP by National Treasury, checked on work at new radio station site at Nakano, checked work on antenna for mobile radio at Jindai. Action: MPD radioman and assistant sent to Osaka area to observe VHF net; now using 1 Link set lacking two tubes; NRP will not permit trying substitute tubes. Fukuoka Chief Radioman reports five former Japanese army locations inspected. None suitable. Wishes to build new station at site selected for new police school. Complete statistics and allotments to every MP in Japan available. Three private contractors working at Nakano; two 2-KW and two 1-KW transmitters to be ready for operation by 1 September. Antenna experiment making no progress (no radio to work with, no suitable material for mobile radio antenna).

h. Chief Administrator lectured to CIC Basic Class, Norton Hall, for two hours on Japanese Police, past, present and future.

i. Investigator Munroe prepared two forms to be used by NRP Identification Section in advising police of criminal records of persons fingerprinted. Forms will be submitted to NRP this week at next conference re fingerprints.

j. Investigators Hill, Kilgore and Bishop prepared list of true and false examination questions on NPSC Rules and Regulations for Chief Administrator. Also prepared list of multiple choice questions on Police Law.

k. Investigator O'Neill obtained material from NRPNHq in connection with survey to replace police with civilians in NRP where possible.



Investigated availability of equipment to put all NRP lines in NRP Headquarters. Discussed with Suzuki, NRP Communications Chief, submission of revised request for funds from supplementary budget. MPD simultaneous address system approved for operational board. NRP request for ¥67,000,000 additional funds disapproved. Revised request for funds to be broken down by project. Existing equipment to be repaired.

1. Conferences:

a. Chief Administrator with Tamagawa (V-P Crime Prevention Association) and H. Isoyama, Chief Crime Prevention Section, MPD, re: crime prevention activities. Action: General discussion of activities and results in crime prevention. Reported to PSD that ESS has called for complete report on Association to establish value of organization.

b. Chief Administrator with Tomita and Kunugi of Juvenile Section, MOD, re: Ueno and Marunouchi raids of 7 September. Action: Over 200 homeless and delinquent children picked up in raids. Tokyo Municipal Office will assist MPD in handling dispositions.

c. Chief Administrator with H. Meyers of Legal Section; Morino, Ogura and Muto of NRPNHq, re: procurator-police relations. Action: NRP stated points of too much command by procurator. Meyers will use material in dealing with procurator's office. Conference report prepared.

d. Administrator Williams with Investigator Munroe, PSD; Messrs. Ogino, Takao, Manzen of Identification Section, NRPNHq; Morino interpreting, re: proposed NPSC regulations on fingerprint NRPNHq Identification Section. Action: All requests of PSD accepted and tentative approval given to the final NRP draft of regulations. Report on this subject completed and submitted to stenographer. Will go to Chief of Division for review and approval.

e. Administrator Fritz with Isoyama, Crime Prevention Section, MPD, re: Oyabun-Kobun activities in Tokyo. Complained that he lacks the proper power to take decisive action himself and can only make investigations. Hindered by higher-ups in MPD. Action: Isoyama instructed to inform this office by a confidential report of persons hindering his attempts to eradicate oyabun-kobuns. This Administrator places a lot of faith in Isoyama. He has done a good job for this office in the past.

f. Administrator Fritz with R. Wada, Crime Prevention Section, NRPNHq, re: progress in Honjo case. Action: Progress report received of investigation to date. Turned in to Chief Police Administrator.

g. Administrator Fritz with Mr. H. Passin, Public Opinion, CI&E re: Public opinion poll after dropping 500,000 traffic safety leaflets over

Tokyo City on or after 13 September 1948. Action: To be taken under consideration by Mr. Passin. Further consultation to be held 8 September 1948.

h. Investigator Hill with Lt. Colonel Crocker, PMO, re: MPD traffic safety week, 10-16 September 1948. Action: Lt. Colonel Crocker consented to provide publicity for occupational personnel and to provide extra MP's if possible to assist Japanese police.

i. Chief Administrator with Aso and Marino of NRPNHq re: Notebook design for police and plan to use tear gas ONLY for trial, study and experimentation. Action: Approved notebook design and experiments with tear gas, provided same is not used on public.

j. Chief Administrator and Investigator Johnson with H. Meyers of Legal Section, and representatives of Attorney-General's office and NRPNHq re: police-procurator relationship. Action: General discussion and planning for elimination of detention, overcrowding and improper guarding of women and children. Japanese to continue work on outlined project. Special conference report made and submitted to Chief PSD.

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k. Chief Administrator and Investigator Johnston with S. Ozono, M. Gotoda, S. Yoshitake, N. Tsuji, (H. Kobayashi, interpreter), of MPD, re: Nihonbashi Station gangster police investigation. Action: Chief of MPD at PSD request has appointed a Board of Inquiry (first in history of Japanese police) of top rank officials to investigate and report findings on case. Board briefed by Chief Administrator. Will conduct investigation and question all witnesses. PSD will be advised of findings.

l. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Miwa and Yoshinaga of NRP re: Appropriation for police budget for rewards and informant fees.

m. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. A. Yoshitomi, Chief Communication - Sub-section, Police Bureau, Osaka Police, re: interest in radio communication; Action: Referred to Mr. Kimberling, Police Administrator, PSD, who has supervision of police communications.

n. Investigator O'Neill with Captain Jackson, Saitama CIC re: "Honjo" case. Action: Capt. Jackson reports that CIC have dropped the case as there is nothing in it of interest to CIC as such (I.E. political - Communist), but a Military Government affair (i.e. blackmarket and corruption).

o. Administrator Fritz: with Miss D. Jose, CI&E, re: traffic safety program for Japanese citizens. Action: Miss Jose was much in favor of such a program and suggested that this office work up a staff study on same. Miss Jose to furnish outline for information needed. 

Mr. Nakagawa also assured PSD would support the plan for the replacement of civilians in positions now held by police not requiring police authority or training; that PSD would not pass on actual number of civilians to be employed or yen to be appropriated. Colonel Battey with Mr. Nakagawa of NRPNHq and Mr. Yayama of Imperial Guard re: recent press release telling of cultural subjects being taught in the Imperial Guard Training School. Action: After discussion, requested Mr. Yayama to submit to PSD detailed report covering activities and personnel of the I.G. School.

r. Administrator Mulbar with T. Maeda and K. Kawai, Identification Section and T. Hirohala, Planning Section, NRP, re: problems in operating the National Bureau of Identification. Action: General discussion.

s. Administrator Mulbar with Mr. Murai re: refusal of Government and Legal Section to approve of budget to pay rewards as may be offered by NRP in connection with criminal investigative work. Action: Mr. Murai was informed that Administrator Mulbar was to discuss matter with Mr. Napier at the earliest opportunity.

t. Administrator Fritz with K. Hasimoto, Chief, 1st Traffic Section, MPD, re: results being obtained as result of conference held 14 August 1948. Action: Results progressing. Detailed report to be submitted 23 August 1948.

u. Investigator McCarthy with (1) Col. Johnson and Capt. Price of Domestic Radio, CCS re: testing program for police emergency radios. Action: Final draft of testing program approved - to start 4 October. (Attempt will be made to start sooner).

v. Administrator Fritz with H. Isoyama, CID, MPD, re: group of thugs committing violence and trespassing. Action: Case being properly handled by MPD. Report submitted by MPD. Case closed as far as this office is concerned.

s. Investigator Bishop compiled weekly report of activities for week 9-14 August.



h. Chief Administrator with M. Gotoda of MPD re: Proposed Assistant Inspector and Inspector examinations scheduled for 1 September and (2) results of sergeants' examination. Action: MPD plans examination for Assistant Inspector with automatic promotion to Inspector after 4 years, limiting examination to those recommended by superior officer. Requested immediate delivery of English translation of circular on examination. Sergeants' examination questions delivered to PSD for PSD records. Statistics on examination will be ready 15 September.

i. Chief Administrator with E. Tanaka, Chief of MPD, and T. Matsumoto of MPD re: Proposed Assistant Inspector examination and (2) discipline of members of Setagaya Station. Action: (1) Refused PSD approval of scheduled examination as selection of candidates not in keeping with democratic principles. MPD will draw up new plans. 

a. Chief Administrator with Allen of CCS Postal Branch, I. Koike, S. Kasai, N. Takenaga (of MOC Postal Unit), and F. Muto (of NRPNHq) re: Establishment of Postal Inspection Service and Police Cooperation therewith. Action: Organization and activities of Postal Inspection service outlined. Inspectors to have investigation power but not power of arrest. Assistance and cooperation of NRP requested and promised.

b. Chief Administrator with K. Honda and Y. Hosoya of Construction Ministry re: Allocation of cement for construction of NRP buildings. Action: Discussed projected construction of NRP Hq Bldg in Hokkaido; construction at Crime Lab in Tokyo; and construction at Tokyo Regional School. Approved all three jobs. Sent men back to ESS. Hart was only interested in determining that requests were not duplication of former request for cement for 1600 police stations.

c. Chief Administrator re: Phone calls from other SCAP Agencies: (1) From ESS on gasoline allocation request from NRP for boats; (2) From Moss of ESS re restricted firms requesting permission to make contributions to Crime Prevention Associations for vigilante protection; (3) From Colonel Creel IG Office re small arms problem in Kobe-Osaka area; (4) From Hart of ESS re cement allocation for NRP. Action: Informed ESS that NRP is to have no boats as of 1 August and that no gasoline necessary for this purpose; (2) Moji firm requests permission to give ¥3,000 annually; PSD does not approve vigilante groups; ESS will deny such requests; (3) Made appointment to visit Colonel Creel at Dai Ichi, Room 26, 0930 hours 4 August; (4) Hart requested PSD to examine NRP requests for cement, unofficially; as result of phone call see above conference with Construction Ministry men.

d. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa and M. Morino of NRPNHq re: Personnel transfers. Action: Approved transfer of Superintendent Kaihara of MPD to NRPNHq. Received for study and consideration proposed transfers of three men from other governmental agencies.

e. Chief Administrator with H. Otsu and Y. Niwa of Yokohama Municipal Police re: Police training. Action: Yokohama is now operating an in-service school for supervisory officers. Before recruit training is undertaken PSD will be consulted. Present recruits will continue at NRP School as per PSD policy.

f. Chief Administrator with T. Kitamura of Transportation Ministry re: Railway Security law. Action: Law has been redrafted with minor changes at Government Section request. Delivered to PSD for study. Same will be submitted at next session of Diet. Changes appear to be technical only, and not contrary to PSD policy.

g. Chief Administrator with A. Nakagawa re: Transfers to NRP to replace three loans to Economic Investigation Board. Action: Approved three men from other agencies with previous police experience, to be transferred to NRP provided they are included on list of others to be transferred in accordance with PSD - NRP agreement.

h. Chief Administrator with Chief Tanaka of MPD re: Request of MPD for PSD approval of opening additional nine police stations. Action: Crime and population statistics in districts to be sub-divided under plan; will be submitted to PSD for study. No action.

i. Chief Administrator with J. Murai and I. Kojo of NRPNHq re: (1) Request of Special Procurement Board that NRP increase Occupation guard personee; (2) Government Section objections to local legislation at Fukui and Osaka to regulate parades and mob action; (3) Legal Section to police secret fund budget because not mentioned in Police Law; (4) NRP boat transfer to municipalities and Marine Service. 



1. Conferences:

During the week, Police Branch personnel attended the following meetings:

a. Chief Administrator, with M. Ogawa, Mayor of Kodaira-machi; T. Nakato, Mayor of Kokubunji-machi; I. Yamamoto, Mayor of Hoya-machi; C. Shimizu, Mayor of Higashimurayama-machi; S. Ogawa, Mayor of Koganei-machi; and S. Koyama, Assistant Mayor of Higashimurayama-machi re: (1) Use of factory housing reparation machinery as municipal police station, and (2) joint police department for Kodaira, Kokubunji and Koganei. Action: (1) Room for machinery in wing. Use by police would relieve three civilian guards. PSD to discuss with concerned SCAP agency. (2) Three towns touch each other. Fire Department now joint. No PSD objection. Three mayors will study further.

b. Chief Administrator, with A. Nakagawa and M. Morino re: NPSC rules and regulations. Action: NRP wishes to retain privilege of transferring administrators from other agencies. No action. Further conference 0900 20 July 1948.

c. Administrator-in-Charge, with Mr. Otsuka, NRPNHq re: Training. Action: Submitted roster of committee for revision of textbooks.

d. Investigator Johnston with Mr. Maeda, et al, NRPNHq. re: (1) Second-hand Store Law; (2) preparation of report on Hokkaido Field Trip. Action: NRP asks help of PSD with CI&E on Second-hand Store program. Will arrange conference with CI&E.

e. Chief Administrator and Executive Officer, with A. Nakagawa and M. Morino of NRPNHq re: Articles 68, 68B and 68C of NPSC Rules and Regulations. Action: NRP notified of PSD policy on employment, reinstatements, and transfers of NRP personnel. Mp can be transferred into NRP until 8 March 1949. Reinstatements of resigned personnel to be at rank of "policeman" only. NRP personnel may be loaned to other agencies for not more than one year. Imperial Guard personnel cannot be transferred into NRP.

f. Chief Administrator, Executive Officer, Captain Nealon, Lt. Reinfeld, with T. Kabayama and J. Murai of NRPNHq and K. Yamasaki and H. Obata of Marine Security Board re: Termination of water patrolling by NRP.

Action: As NRP has no budget for water patrol expenses, beginning July 1948 MSB to take over all water patrol responsibility adjacent to NRP territory. NRP to release boats and crews to MP and MSB by 1 August. List of releases will be submitted to PSD, with no boats remaining under control of NRP. NRP to loan one or two policemen to each boat for short time, until MSB men are trained.

g. Chief Administrator, Administrator-in-Charge, Executive Officer, Mr. Mulbar, regular monthly conference with National Public Safety Commission. Director General Saito and Dr. Morino present. Action: Report by Mr. Kanemasa on Fukui earthquake. Report by Saito on attempted assassination of Communist Party leader. Discussion of rules and regulations draft. No agreement on provision that all NRP personnel be recruited at "policemen" rank and serve at least one year in each rank, with promotion by competitive examination. Conference continued to 27 July.

h. Administrator-in-Charge, with Onazawa of NRPNHq. and Mr. Bishop of PSD re: Translation of book. Action: Requested assistance in getting CI&E clearance to distribute "Advance Police Training" publication of Pennsylvania State Police which has been translated. Mr. Bishop assigned to handle with CI&E.

i. Administrator-in-Charge, with Mr. Nakahara, Police College re: Emergency Training at Police College. Action: Discussed Emergency Civil Disturbance training for present class of 200. PSD will prepare course of 30 hours. This to be given in October. Mr. Bishop will observe drill and fit American methods into their system of maneuver.

j. Chief Administrator, with Mr. H. Isoyama of MPD re: Report on Crime Prevention Activities of MPD. Action: Statistics given on crime prevention. Bicycle theft prevention drive will start 26 July with public participation. Bike thefts number 125 daily, in the city of Tokyo.

k. Chief Administrator, with Mt. Gotoda of MPD re: Sergeant's examination scheduled for 31 July. Action: Examination open to all with three years experience. MPD anticipated 2 to 3,000 candidates. Approximately 200 positions are to be filled. Written and oral examinations will be given with standard weights for each. Written examination to cover "Essay, Common Sense, Police Regulations and Law, Police Practice". PSD to receive copy of announcement and copy of written examination.

l. Chief Administrator and Executive Officer, with N. Saito, M. Mizobuchi and M. Morino of NRPNHq at NRP Director-General's Official residence re: NPSC Rules and Regulations. Action: All NRP objections to Articles 68, 68B and 68C overcome without change in PSD policy or wording of articles. NPSC will be requested by NRP to approve rules and regulations.

m. Chief Administrator and Executive Officer, with M. Morino of NRPNHq re: NPSC action on Rules and Regulations. Action: NPSC adopted this date the Rules and Regulations for procedure in the NRP.





SUBJECT: Prison Branch Weekly Report of Activities
(26 June - 2 July 1948)

TO: Chief, Public Safety Division

1. Personnel

a. On 28 June, Major C. E. Tremper and Capt. L. J. Fomenko returned from temporary duty following inspections of penal and correctional institutions in Kyushu. The following main prisons were visited: Fukuoka Prison, Nagasaki Prison, Kumamoto Prison, Kagoshima Prison, Miyazaki and Oita Prisons. The Saga Juvenile Prison was also inspected on this trip.

b. On 28 June, Capt. Raymond Graves assigned to Prison Branch, PSD.

c. On 29 June, Col. Pulliam informed the Branch that G-2 had approved a title change to permit the employment of a Co-ordinator of Administrative and Financial Codes.

2. Projects

Revision of Correctional laws

a. On 26 June Dr. Oppler telephoned that the Diet had stated to GS that it could not act this session on the huge newly amended Code of Criminal Procedure unless the session was extended to 10 July. This, he said, would leave the present mess in the courts and procurators' offices unsolved and would still further congest the detention prisons. Dr. Lewis urged that LS and GS, being directly concerned, take the lead in urging the Diet to support the Japanese AG and the Courts by passing that Bill, the Family Court Bill, the Reformatory Act, and the OPARS Bill substantially as the latter would be changed by the textual changes now agreed upon by LS and GS.

b. On 28 June Dr. Lewis drafted report covering two documents concerning revision of the prison laws and will submit to Col. Pulliam. If approved, will hand a memo on the subject to CARGAB and ACARB Directors of AG Office.

c. Family Court Bill. Report of Saburo Saito, Judge Naito and Kasiwagi, Director and members, Legislative Group, respectively JUCARB of AG Office on Diet Committee,

Welfare and Judiciary, respectively, on Family Court Bill was presented orally and to effect that Diet probably would ask GS to find attitude of SCAP sections about amending Article 2, Paragraph 2, and Article 24, Paragraph 1 by striking them out or modifying the first. They will report any further action if they hear of it. They were told Family Court Bill should be saved.

d. Offender Prevention and Rehabilitation Service.

(1) On 29 June Dr. Lewis requested instructions to P.B. about exchanging information suggested by Howard Meyers, L.S., concerning attitudes of A.G. by G.S. and L.S. so as to conform to ideas - also of P.H.&W. Section. We could exchange information with no comment at this time. (2) Director Saito, JUCARB, and Otsubo, JUCARB Legislative group, brought in revisions of Articles 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 of OPARS Bill for conference and received the suggestions of Dr. Lewis for amending the same sections. Will confer about the same at 1000 11 July at Prison Branch. (3) On 29 June, Dr. Lewis wrote amendments to OPARS Articles 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 to assist AG's legislative group comply with L.S., G.S., and P.H.&W. Section suggestions without emasculating the bill. Will give to the A.G. at conference 30 June.

3. Private Reformatories.

a. On 28 June, Saburo Saito, Director JUCARB, with T. Ikeda of his official secretariat brought in the Executive Committee on the Abolition of Private Reformatories, made up of four members and owners of such institutions, chaired by Pres. Shimada of Shinn Nippon Gakuen, to ask Prison Branch help with J. R. Mossler, Public Finance Branch, ESS, in securing his withdrawal of opposition to the item in the present pending budget in the Diet which proposes the appropriation of 6,500,000 yen. It is to pay a dismissal wage of about 3,000 yen to each of the some 1,500 employees of the private reformatories, who cannot be employed as public employees when the few private reformatories are taken over as public institutions on or before 31 March 1949. Director Saito stated that in Japan for years in the public service it had been customary to pay a dismissal wage of from five to eight years pay. Dr. Lewis stated that he would report the matter to Col. Pulliam for such action as PSD would be authorized to take.

b. On 29 June, Dr. Lewis received advice from Col. Pulliam that PSD could hardly ask ESS to change its position on public finance matter such as the proposed dismissal wage.

c. On 29 June, in response to conference Friday, 25 June, Mr. Otsubo, JUCARB legislative group, Directors OGawa and Saito, of AG came in with written statement signed by Asst.

A.G., Mr. Tsuneco Sato, saying that they need right to use private rehabilitation agencies for considerable period just as the Child Welfare Act allows the M/W to use them indiscriminately for delinquents as well as other children such as orphans. If compelled to end, will need three fiscal years to secure public facilities or probation and parole substitutes.

d. On 30 June Mr. Cranor reported receiving first copy of Japanese plan for absorbing private reformatories and began studying plan.

e. On 2 July Major Tremper submitted report on two private reformatories in Fukuoka City about which some complaints had been registered.

4. Prison Labor

a. On 30 June Mr. Dowd went to Kanto District Warden's conference at Kosuge Prison to discuss Prisoner Wage and employment opportunities. (1) It was explained to all the Wardens present and members of A.G. office, CARGAB, the various steps leading up to the insistence that prisons require the the payment of prevailing wages, as published by M/L, for prisoners being worked on outside contracts. Statement was made that ESS, Labor Relations, was now asking for a compliance with the original SCAP regulation of 1946 in this respect. Also, a need for some action in the matter of establishing a form of Government use was imperative at this time owing to the apparent disposition on part of free labor to complain about prisoner competition. Some very definite action was promised in regard to both of these questions.

5. Juvenile Program

a. On 30 June Director Saito brought in the longer range report on juvenile institution program for Attorney General's executive assistant's scope of activities. In absence of Major Kimmel, matter referred to Mr. Cranor. Listed for staff conference as soon as Major Kimmel returns from leave and while Major Tremper is in Tokyo.

b. On 1 July Dr. Hayao reported to Mr. Cranor relative to a visit made to Juvenile Reformatory which he thought was very satisfactory. Operated by the M/W in Tokyo area.

c. On 1 July Mr. Cranor discussed with Mr. Kusinoki, Architect, plans for reformatory in Hokkaido, suggesting some changes in the arrangements of the interior of the cottage.

6. National Reformatories

a. On 1 July, Major Tremper had conference with

Mr. Akita and Mr. Shidehara of JUCARB relative maltreatment of children committed to Fukuoka National Reformatory. Content of a letter from Chief Public Procurator's Office, Fukuoka, to Attorney General's Office has only partly been translated to English. The entire text of this letter will be completed and submitted to Major Tremper on 3 July for information and further discussion with Director of JUCARB.

7. Government and Discipline, Fuchu Prison

a. On 26 June, Mr. Cranor made special trip to Fuchu Prison to investigate a letter reported "confidential" - writer unknown at the prison - neither officer or guard. Mr. Ogawa will investigate at Hachioji as that was the place from which the letter originated.

b. On 28 June, Mr. Cranor reported writer of letter above referred to has been located at Hachioji. He is a young man who has been employed only 20 days. Was writing to his brother. Mr. Ogawa will make further investigation and report. Letter did not refer to Fuchu Prison.

c. On 29 June, Mr. Cranor made routine visit to Fuchu Prison. (1) Warden has started competition among shops to find "model shop." Standards: cleanliness, orderliness of both shop and inmates. (2) To break up traffic in yard, he has talked to kitchen men asking them to serve 3000 men "instead of a few." (3) Says spirit is fine. Kitchen will probably become first "model shop."

8. Yokohama Prison Classification Project

a. On 29 June, Mr. Dowd and Capt. Graves visited Yokohama Prison on routine inspection. (1) Warden says 229 Ordnance at Shinojujo, Tokyo, desires about 300 prisoners as laborers but it is in Kosuge area and that institution claims no trusty prisoners available. (2) Warden Kakehi explained the handling of all trusty prisoners working at 229th. Ordnance and Signal Corps, Kanagawa Prefecture, thru the Kuwajima Contracting Co., which, aside from furnishing the wages for prisoners per day, also provided food, housing, transportation, etc., none of which had been paid for by the Prefectural Government since December 1947. As regards the Prefectural Government, it is not unusual in its practice to withhold payments of this kind for a period of time. The Warden desired that the "extras" paid by Mr. Kuwajima over and above wages should be taken into consideration when matter of prevailing wages is discussed at Warden's conference, Kosuge Prison, 30 June.

Miscellaneous

a. On 26 June, Dr. A. C. Oppler, Chief, Law & Courts,

Legal Section, telephoned that the bill referred to in his telephone message to Dr. Lewis, 25 June, was the "Juvenile Guidance Bill" and not the Family Court Bill, Juvenile Division, as had been stated by his assistants in that message. As to his question concerning PSD attitude toward postponing the effective day of its going into effect, which the Diet has suggested to G.S. legislative and parliamentary division, Lt. Col. Battey was replying to G.S. as shown under results: (1) The Juvenile Guidance Bill originating with a special Commission of lawyers and having failed to pass the previous Diet, was amended as requested by PSD and re-introduced early in the present Diet. (2) If the passage of the Family Court Bill is not further delayed as to its effective date. (3) If the Reformatory Bill is not postponed beyond the presently proposed date of December 1948. If the OPARS Bill can be put into effect not later than December 1948, or the latest 31 March 1949, when the private reformatories come to end, then PSD would feel that no great harm would be done if the effective date of the Juvenile Guidance Bill were made June 1949.

b. On 26 June, Toshio Kurata, Liaison Officer for CARGAB of AG Office reported that Mrs. Azuma, wife of former Warden of Osaka Prison, had heard that one of the basic charges against her husband, now in Sugamo Prison, expecting to be transported to Batavia, Java, 10 July 1948, is that: whereas the normal death rate of Java Prisons was 1500 per month, during Occupation by the Japanese, this rose to 38,000 per month.

c. On 29 June Mr. Cranor reported that transaction for surplus clothing and bedding at Kure has been completed with exception of final message from textile officer of Ministry of Commerce who will return to Tokyo 1 July. This Officer has already given oral approval to the deal. Telegrams have gone, M/C to B. of Trade and AG to Governor Prison District.

d. On 28 June Dr. Lewis received back from Col. Pulliam memo prepared by Mr. Dowd on long term prisoner program for Japan. Comment: Probable that Sugamo Prison will not be returned to Japanese while occupation forces are in Japan; hence Japanese must provide other facilities for long termers.

e. On 29 June Prison Branch received brief memo from AG telling of efforts being made by that department to reach prison in yesterday evening's earthquake area, especially Fukui City. On 2 July Mr. Nishi, AG, brought in drawing and report showing virtual complete destruction of the Detention Prison at Fukui City.

f. On 29 June Mr. Ohi, Director of Custody, CARGAB, brought report to Prison Section relative to escape of two lifers from Miyagi Prison, Sendai, 11:40 PM, 24 June. The prisoners, using a ruse that one of them was sick, causing guard to leave cell house for aid, broke out of their cells, attacked

the guard on his return and escaped into the yard. Overpowering the gate guard, attacking him with a sharp metal instrument and relieving him of his unloaded pistol, they reached outside and managed to elude the searching posse. One prisoner was captured 8:40 AM 28 June and the pursuers were closing in on the other. Mr. Ohi said some action against the cell house guard for carelessness in exercise of his duty was considered.

g. On 30 June Major General Holmes Degner, retired, of G-2, was introduced by Col. Pulliam for orientation conference concerning PSD and Prison Branch in particular and was introduced to the members of Prison Staff present. Significance of programs of projects and scope of problem were the subjects reviewed.

h. On 30 June Mr. Cranor talked with Mr. Isobe about conference on Crime Prevention to be held 6 July, sponsored by People's Society for Security, Social Workers Association, and Association for Private Reformatories.

i. On 1 July, Major Tremper conferred with Mr. Furuhashi, Director, CARGAB, concerning deficiencies found in prisons in Kyushu during recent inspection trip.

j. On 2 July Mr. Ogawa, ACARB, came in to assist Mr. Cranor prepare report on the confidential information concerning Fuchu Prison which came from CIS this week.

k. On 2 July Mr. Cranor attended meeting of joint committee on Correctional Education at Radio Tokyo, where Mr. Moss, vocational advisor, CI&E, stated that he must withdraw from work as the committee is launched. He expects that Dr. Lewis will confer with Japanese about the next meeting. They want our approval of the minutes of 3 April 1948. Mr. Hanakawa read a report on the progress at Kawagoe Juvenile Prison which is the real seat of half the work.

l. On 2 July Major Kimmel read complaint letter by "alias Kiyoshi Ono," inmate of Nagano Prison. Plans to check this complaint on next visit to the prison in August per instruction EX. Officer, PSD.

m. On 2 July Major Kimmel studied Dr. Lewis's memo to Chief PSD, subject: Japanese Summary of Proposals concerning Revision Prison Law," dated 28 June 1948 and Japanese documents attached to memo. Attached comments to this document suggesting a course of procedure for the Prison Branch.

1. Conferences

During the week Police Branch personnel attended the following conferences.

a. Chief Administrator with J. W. Renchard, Legal Section Chief, 8th Army MG Hqs; re: Coordination of Prefectural MG Teams on Police Decentralization Program. Conference at Yokohama office of MG. Action: 8th Army MG Hqs has issued copy #1 of periodic bulletin to teams. Copy #2 will contain policy articles on (1) MG support of Chief of Police and PSC Associations if same are democratic in nature; (2) NRP not to be used to direct MP in MG sponsored economic drives; (3) MG Teams to arm civilian guards at their compounds with U.S. Arms instead of borrowing police pistols; (4) MG Teams to recognize shortage of police personnel before detailing police for extraneous duties.

b. Administrator in Charge conferred with PSC of Kyoto, Nagoya, Osaka, Yokohama, and Kobe re: Equipment Shortages. Action: PSC submitted to Public Safety Division detailed request for equipment and were advised of difficulties in securing material under present circumstances.

c. Administrator in Charge and an investigator conferred with Mr. Fujii, Equipment Section, NRPNHq re: Ammunition Distribution. Action: Fujii advised to make immediate distribution of ammunition recently turned over to Japanese Police, and proper forms for R.R. transportation for regional distribution were certified.

d. Chief Administrator conferred with Chief, Public Safety Division, and Saito, Director-General of NRP re: Assignment of NRP Personnel to Regional Schools Under Plan Involving 9,000 Capacity. Action: NRPNHq and Public Safety Division will confer on method of filling schools to capacity.

e. Conferences were held by Chief Administrator; and Administrator in Charge with B. Mazo, Wages Branch, Labor Division, ESS; Nakagawa and Moreno, NRPNHq; Tsuji, NPSC; re: Police Salaries. Action: Agreement between Public Safety Division and Labor Division that increase in pay is necessary. Japanese want same under special grades which Labor Division opposes. ESS desires were reported to NRPNHq and pay schedules

were discussed. NRP will submit alternate schedules to Public Safety Division to be followed by meeting between NRP, ESS, and Public Safety Division for final decision. Progress was outlined to NPSC.

f. Chief Administrator conferred with Chief Fire Administrator; Executive Officer, PSD; Miwa and Yoshinagi, NRPNHq; Kimura, Yuyama, and Kato, Imperial Guard; re: Judicial Police Powers of Imperial Guard and Fire Fighting Duties of Imperial Guard. Action: (1) NRP conferred with Attorney General and received agreement giving full police powers to all guard members. Will submit draft of law for same to Legal Section, Mr. Meyer; (2) Tokyo city will take over Imperial Guard fire stations and man equipment with skeleton crews. Imperial Guardsmen will augment fire fighting force in case of fire.

g. Administrator in Charge held conferences with Chief of Division, and with Shibata, Chief, Education Section, NRP; re: Foreign Correspondents tour of Police Training Schools. Action: Arrangements made, Japanese notified, and tour made on 24 June 1948.

h. An investigator conferred with N. Hashimoto, MPD Traffic Section, and Y. Matsuhashi, Assistant Chief, NRP, Traffic Section, re: Traffic Violations Covered by G-2 IOM 19 June 1948. Action: Police furnish protection to all festivals to prevent a recurrence. Copy of instructions furnished by this office to be read at all roll calls.

i. Chief Administrator conferred with S. Suzuki, Chief, MP, Osaka, City, re: Disciplinary rules for Osaka City Police. Action: Delivery to PSD of copy of rules and discussion of same. Sets up trial boards, right of appeal, and other democratic disciplinary provisions.

j. Chief Administrator and Administrator in Charge conferred with Dr. Piersel, S&A, and Chief Prison Administrator; re: Branch Reports for PSD Monthly Report. Action: Decision on responsibility for preparation of articles by 28th of each month.

k. Chief Administrator and Administrator in Charge conferred with Administrator Williams, and Investigator Munroe re: Crime Statistics Reports to be Required of Municipal Police by NPSC. Action: Elimination of unnecessary reports and classification of other reports as "required" and "voluntary".

l. Chief Administrator conferred with S. Aso of NRPNHq re: Uniform Materials. Action: Reported to PSD that ESB has surplus rejected yardage to be allocated to governmental agencies for uniforms. NRP wishes PSD assistance to secure large allotment. Informed NRP that settlement with ESB must be made without PSD assistance due to requirements of other agencies sponsored by GHQ Sections and possible conflicts on actual needs.

m. An investigator conferred with Muto, Director, Criminal division, NRPNHq; Makan, Chief, Crime Prevention Section, NRPNHq; and Maeda, Chief, Identification Section, NRPNHq; re: Progress Being Made to Revise The Second Hand Shop Law. Action: Law awaiting Ministry of Justice action.

n. Action: Conference extended one month pending NRP completion of English translation of various forms to be used in identification work.

p. Chief Administrator and Administrator in Charge conferred with T. N. Allen, CCS; Y. Koike, S. Kasai, N. Takanaga, MOC; E. Tanaka, J. Fujita, S. Urashima, and H. Kobayashi, MPD; re: Establishment of Postal Inspection Agency and Cooperation Between Said Agency and MPD. Action: General discussion of proposed organization, stressing cooperation necessary between it and the police. Chief Tanaka and MPD were requested for the present to assist in arresting money order thieves.

q. Administrator Fritz with T. Mizuno, Chief Culture Section, Tokyo Regional Hqs, NRP re: Judo Matches to be Held 3 July at Imperial Palace Grounds. Action: PSD personnel invited to attend.

r. Chief Administrator conferred with Nakagawa, and Morino, NRPNHq re: Yamaguchi, Municipal PSC Complaint That NRP is Directing City Police. Action: City PSC and Prefectural Troop Commander misunderstood NRP orders. Both will be given correct information. Detailed report made to PSD Executive Officer for answer to letter of Yamaguchi City PSC.

14 June Thru 19 June 1948.

TO: Chief, Public Safety Division

1. Conferences

During the week Police Branch personnel attended the following conferences:

a. Chief Administrator with Administrator-in-Charge and Mr. Mulbar re: NPSC Rules and Regulations draft. Action: Discussion on each section of draft was held and agreement reached on recommended changes.

b. With Chief, Public Safety Division, re: NPSC Imperial Guard Rules and Regulations and "authority" law draft for same. Action: Discussion of drafts and recommended changes was held.

c. With Messrs. Kogure and Arimatsu of the Japanese Diet re: suggested revisions in police law. Action: Agreement reached that no revision of the police law will be effected for one year from the date it was enacted. PSD was requested to permit the material concerning a former discussion between PSD and Mr. Kogure to be reported by Mr. Kogure to the Diet Committee on Public Safety.

d. With Mr. A. Nakagawa, NRPNHq. re: police salary program. Action: Mr. Nakagawa reported that Labor Section, SCAP, refuses to allow grade increase for police in order to effect a small increase in salary, on the grounds that police must be classed the same as general Governmental employees, in accordance with existing Japanese law.

e. Chief Administrator and Administrator-in-Charge held the regular monthly PSD-NPSC meeting re: current police problems. Action: Discussion was held on problems involving salaries, offenses of foreign nationals, travel difficulties of NPSC members on official business, and needed changes in police law. No further action.

f. With Messrs. Nakagawa and Kashiwamura, NRPNHq. re: proposed police budget items. Action: With reference to the included item for informers' fees, agreement was reached that such fees will not be used except

for securing only criminal information. Another item - "3000 police over limitations" - included among budgeted salary items refers to police students who actually are not considered police unless they have completed basic training and have been sworn in and should read "2000" instead of 3000.

g. With K. Nakabayashi of Commerce and Industry Ministry re: distribution of bicycles. Action: Police will be allotted an additional 5000 bicycles during the current fiscal year, for a total of 25,000 bicycles.

h. With C.C. Mitchell and P.E. Richers of CTS re: problems arising in securing enactment of Railway Security Law. Action: CTS requested PSD assistance in presenting material to overcome objections to immediate enactment. Special conference report was transmitted to Chief, PSD.

i. With Messrs. M. Yanagi and K. Kobayashi of "People and Police Association" re: publishing magazine on police work. Action: PSD was advised of plans to publish magazine. No PSD action planned.

j. With Messrs. Kimura, Kato and Yuyama of Imperial Guard, and Messrs. Miwa and Moreno of NRPNHq. re: NPSC regulations establishing Imperial Guard as a function under NPSC, and law draft giving Imperial Guard police authority in protecting palaces and Imperial family. Action: PSD changes in the drafts given Japanese conferees. (1) All guards of all ranks should have judicial police officer powers, (2) Suggestion that drafts include protection of visiting dignitaries and their property was made, (3) Superintendents in charge of guard houses should be changed to Superintendents and Inspectors in charge, (4) PSD believes that fire fighting should be handled by municipalities instead of Imperial Guards. Further discussion in reference to #4 above will be held at a future meeting.

k. Administrator-in-Charge with Chief, PSD, and Captain Newton, S&A Branch, PSD, re: training chart on "Flow of Police Information". Action: Agreement reached on form of chart and Capt. Newton will arrange for artist to prepare graphic presentation.

l. With Mr. Magari of NRPNHq. re: status of Fuzoku Business Law draft. Action: Law draft has been submitted to the Diet which desires to make drastic changes in same to the affect that a Chief of Police shall issue and revoke permits instead of the Public Safety Commission. PSD's objections to such changes were presented and Mr. Magari will so inform the Diet Committee with whom he is discussing this proposed change.

m. With Messrs. Y. Saro and T. Morika of Yokohama Municipal Police re: Shortage of pistols and other equipment in Municipal Police Departments. Action: General discussion of subject was held and Chief Administrator was requested to attend meeting on same subject of Public Safety Commissioners of Yokohama, Osaka, Kobe, Kyoto and Nagoya at Yokohama on 21 June 1948 at 1030 hours.

n. With Miss D. Ho, CI&E, re: two scripts submitted by two motion picture concerns concerning delinquent children, burglars, pick-pockets etc. Action: Miss Ho was advised to refer script writers to CID and Juvenile

Section of MPB for strengthening, and return to Public Safety Division.

c. With Mr. Nakahara of Central Police College re: training.
Action: Mr. Nakahara requested that Police Branch supply personnel to lecture to students at Central Police College on 1 July regarding "Police System in the USA", and on 8 July re "Investigation Methods in USA". He further requested that the emergency control phase of the training course be covered in September. PSD agreed to these requests.

3. Miscellaneous Activities

a. Administrator Williams and Investigator Munroe attended a meeting of all prefectural chiefs of Crime Prevention Sections, NEP, re: draft of pending Diet law on control of restaurants and amusement places employing females. Action: Draft of pending law was read and discussed in anticipation that it will be enacted into law soon.

b. Chief Administrator prepared a list for Chief, PSD, reflecting names of all regional chiefs and regional detective chiefs; prefectural chiefs and prefectural detective chiefs; and chiefs and detective chiefs of ten largest Japanese municipalities.

c. Chief Administrator gave a lecture at Norton Hall CIC class re "Decentralized Japan Police System" and "Police Law of Japan".

d. The Administrator-in-Charge prepared a press release re Japanese police training program, and submitted same to Chief, PSD, for approval.

e. Captain Arenschield completed preparations for the Joto police area juvenile delinquency control program and will submit special memorandum covering same later.

f. Captain Hill completed his investigation on distribution of bicycles and submitted report covering same to Chief Administrator and initiated an investigation on distribution of tires for police automobiles.

g. Administrator Williams and Investigator Munroe continued their study of NRP proposed "Crime Statistics Report" forms. Forms were devised to reflect cost of police service according to various population groups, and a statement regarding "Basic Concept of National Crime Statistics" was prepared and submitted to AIC for approval.

h. Lt. McCarthy continued work regarding Japanese police communications and during the week engaged in the following activities:

(1) With all PSD investigators attended orientation by Capt. Blankenship on police wire and radio systems.

(2) Had 30.5 and 31.5 m.g. frequency crystals tested by experimental VHF stations at Kudan and Shibabashi and sent crystals to Osaka via Miwa and O'Neill.

(3) Attended a meeting of Police Communications Technical Committee re MOC work on police VHF radio. Action: Complete report will be submitted by Capt. Blankenship. Discussion was held on method of paying MOC for police work and agreement reached that MOC will submit a monthly bill for expenses incurred on this VHF project.

(4) Attended a meeting of MOC Tokyo Construction Bureau representatives, NRP and MPB Communications Section Chiefs. Action: MOC Construction Bureau will organize MPB outside maintenance men into 4 or 5 construction crews for the purpose of supervising rehabilitation of police lines in Tokyo.

(5) Investigated status of change of frequency of Nagoya and Takamatsu police radio stations. The frequency which has been approved by Radio Wave Bureau awaiting removal of Osaka Police Radio Station to Fukae.

(6) Attended a conference of Japanese radio manufacturers and submitted separate report concerning same.

(7) Discussed with Col. Johnson of CCS the change in policy covering activation of emergency police radio stations. Separate memorandum covering same was submitted to Chief Administrator.

(8) Investigated application of NRP to move its Hokkaido radio stations from Otaru to Kuchan, and its stations at Muroran, Tomakomae and Abashiri to Kitami. NRP wishes to move these stations from M.P. territory to NRP controlled territory. Kitami is one of five new NRP district headquarters in Hokkaido and does not now have a radio station.

(9) Investigated status of standard operator personnel requirements for police radio stations being compiled by Radio Wave Bureau. Action: Mr. Moriya of Radio Wave Bureau is now working on new personnel requirements for all police radio stations.

SUBJECT: Weekly Report of Police Branch Activities for period
7 June thru 12 June 1948

TO: Chief, Public Safety Division

1. Conferences

During the week Police Branch Personnel attended the following conferences:

a. With Executive Officer, PSD, and Mr. Nakagawa, NRPNHq, re: Replacement of Chief of NRPNHq Communications Section. (Moreno, interpreter). Action: Agreement reached that Chief will be replaced, and MOC will be asked for man to fill the position. At end of week Mr. Nakagawa reported in another conference that the MOC wants the Chief, Mr. Kanemitsu, for a position in that agency, and will furnish an experienced replacement 1 July.

b. With Mr. Nakagawa and Mr. Moreno, NRPNHq, re: Training Program. Action: NRP request to construct branch schools at Sapporo and Takamatsu to accommodate 500 each of the 1500 capacity planned for Asahigawa and Hiroshima was not approved. Total 9000 capacity of Regional schools to the NRP personnel, no NP personnel.

c. With Mr. Shibata, Honda, NRPNHq, and Mr. Hakaoka, NRP Region Headquarters, Sendai, re: Property for Regional Training Schools. Action: IX Corps has definitely refused to release Sendai property to Japanese Government for Regional School. 2nd choice - former Japanese Army Aviation School at Tamaura-Mura, Natori-Gun, Sendai - accommodates only 800 and is in poor condition. Will need construction to meet 1,500 police student requirements.

d. With NRP officials, re: Draft of proposed "Firearms Law" (for control of sale, manufacture of firearms, weapons, etc) Action: Changes suggested by NRP previously approved by PSD and GS. None of changes contrary to PSD policy or common-sense legislation. NRP will discuss the draft now with GS. Assignment on this matter now complete.

e. With Messrs. Shibata, Honda and Onazawa, NRPNHq, re: Training Schedule. Points of training schedule were clarified. NRP was advised of PSD policy on 9,000 NRP police in Regional Schools and was urged to expedite program.

f. With Mr. Kiriya, Chief Crime Statistics Section, NRPNHq, re: Proposed Crime Statistics Report Forms. Action: In response to PSD request Mr. Kiriya submitted a grouping of cities, towns and villages, designed to

obtain crime statistics according to five different population groups: under 5,000, from 5,000 to 30,000, 30,000 to 100,000, 100,000 to 200,000 and six big cities over 200,000. Kiriyama also submitted remainder of translations of proposed forms, and report covering this study will now be drafted.

g. With Mr. Shibata, NRPNHq. re: Appropriation to remodel and re-pair Regional schools at Kadaira, Osaka and Hiroshima. Action: Conference scheduled with Mr. Takano, Chief of Construction Bureau, Economic Stabilization Board, to call his attention to the importance of this program.

h. With Mr. Takano, (see above) re: Regional School repairs. Action: PSD was assured of cooperation of Construction Bureau, ESB.

i. With Mr. Murai, NRP, re: Use of Japanese police for guard duty in Tsushima. Action: Was advised that civilian guards should be utilized for this duty.

j. With Mr. Miwa, NRPNHq. re: Draft of "Act Concerning the Execution of Duties of Police Officials." Action: Final draft submitted and approved by Mr. Moeller, PSD Legal Officer, and Chief Administrator, Police Branch. Mr. Miwa stated draft has received verbal approval of Col. Frank Hayes of GS.

k. With Mr. Murai, NRPNHq. re: \$20,000,000 budget item for payments for information and miscellaneous travel expenses. Action: Discussion was had of methods of paying for information and accounting for such payments. PSD approved item provided piece-work payments are made only. NRP will also discuss with Mr. Middleton of ESS.

l. With Mr. Kanemitsu, Chief Communications Section, NRPNHq. re: Police Communications Workers unions. Action: Advised that Nagasaki and Kagoshima unions are not the only ones. Police communications workers have had unions in all prefectures since 1946. PSD will make further study.

m. With Mr. Kimura of Imperial Guard, re: Acreage of Imperial Mausoleums. Action: Kimura submitted tables on acreage of 21 mausoleums.

n. With Mr. Otsuka, NRP, re: Training. Action: Submitted report covering the number of students in advanced recruit training, totalling 7,284.

o. With Mr. Miwa, and others, NRP, re: Rules and Regulations, legislation for the Imperial Guard. Action: Copy of proposed rules and regulations left for PSD study.

p. Chief Administrator with AIG and Mr. Mulbar, re: (1) Draft of NPSC Procedure for Meetings, (2) Draft of NPSC Regulation Establishing Imperial Guard Unit, and (3) NPSC regulation establishing officer and civilian strength of NRP. Action: Discussion was held as to all three matters. Recommended changes on (1) and (2) agreed, and further study will be made of (3).

q. With Mr. Yasuoka, NRPNHq. re: Draft of Proposed "Foreign Deportation and Alien Registration Law." Action: New law purposes (1) increased

penalties, (2) prison officials will handle deportation, relieving NRP of travel, and (3) Attorney-General's Office would have authority to conscript and command NRP personnel. Both NRP and PSD object to the third provision above, and NRP will confer with Attorney-General on this matter.

r. With Mr. Kanemitsu, Chief Communications Section, NRPNHq, re: Transfer of police phone lines to MOC. Action: He reported that the Cabinet had made the long-awaited transfer as of 11 June 1948. Section of Cabinet Order prohibiting strikes was removed, but PSD and CCS will work to have this section inserted in new MOC law.

s. With Chief Sakai, Joto Police Station, Tokyo, re: Juvenile Program. Action: Sakai fears drop in Joto's intensive activity with Capt. Arenschield leaving, but he was assured PSD will give all assistance.

t. Chief Administrator with Chief, PSD, re: Labor Division request on added section to Railway Police Law restricting anti-labor activities of railway officers. Action: PSD concurred on this request and same day was advised by phone call from Mr. Richers, CTS, that CTS had also concurred.

u. With Mr. Matsumoto, et al, MPB, re: Training. Action: MPB desires to set up an emergency course, and will discuss with NRP Culture Section and report back to PSD.

2. Surveys and Inspections

a. During the week Investigator Johnston was absent on TDY for the purpose of inspections in the Sendai Region.

b. The following police stations in Tokyo-to were inspected by Police Branch personnel:

All stations were found to be satisfactory. A separate report was submitted covering detention periods at Mukajima station.

3. Miscellaneous Activities

a. Chief Administrator received a report from Mr. Tomita of MPD on the police raid at Ueno Station tunnels on 8 June 1948 at 4 A.M. 851 persons, including 180 children, were removed from the tunnels by 208 uniformed and 170 plain clothes police. Criminals were arrested and others were sent to municipal dormitories.

b. Chief Administrator, Administrator-in-Charge and Mr. Mulbar attended the dedication of the National Crime Laboratory with Executive Officer, PSD.

c. Chief Administrator delivered a speech to the Equipment and Personnel Section Chiefs, NRP, in the 5th floor auditorium at MPB. Building. Fukunaga interpreted.

d. Capt. Arenschiold visited the Joto Police Station and discussed juvenile program to be scheduled for next week. Same also was discussed with the MPB Juvenile Section.

e. Administrator-in-Charge held discussion with Mr. Cardruner, S&A, PSD, re: Duties deleted from new police system. Police Branch will determine who now performs each function formerly allotted to police, for inclusion in PSD history.

f. Administrator-in-Charge spent considerable time during the week in preparation of an outline of the training program.

g. Mr. Mulbar submitted the final draft of NPSC Rules and Regulations to Chief, PSD.

h. Mr. O'Neill continued his investigation of the OZU case, arising from a published account in Stars and Stripes.

i. Capt. Hill continued his investigation of Motorcycle Equipment for MPD. Remainder of MPD's order on motorcycles will be delivered in June.

j. Mr. Munroe submitted report on his investigation at MPD re: Exercise of Censorship by Japanese Police.

k. Lieut. McCarthy continued work concerning police communications, and during the week engaged in the following activities:

1. Checked with CCS, Tel. and Tel. Division, and Domestic Radio Division, as to developments during previous week. It was found that work on police telephone system was at a standstill until action was obtained on awaited cabinet order transferring police lines to MOC.

2. Checked with Mr. Roche, CCS, re: Plans for obtaining action on police communications project. Found that Mr. Roche had arranged conferences on 12 June with Mr. Sone to ascertain status of pending Cabinet Order of transfer of lines to MOC, and also a conference on 14 June with Director-General, NRP, and Chief of Engineering Bureau, MOC, to inform them that the transfer must take place with or without the Cabinet Order; further, that if immediate compliance was not given a new SCAPIN would be issued. (See Item (r) under Conference above).

3. Conducted an investigation re: New switchboards being designed by Nippon Denki for police and fire departments. Found that Nippon Denki has completed drawings of switchboards and will have cost estimates prepared by 24 June 1948.

4. Attended Police Communications Committee Conference. Will submit separate report covering this conference later.

5. Discussed with Capt. Price and Mr. Seccombe, CCS, revision of regulations on Emergency Radio Service. Article 3 will be revised to include civil disturbances as well as natural disasters with provisions that police emergency stations only will be activated, and only urgent police operational business may be handled.

1. Conferences

During the week Police Branch personnel attended the following conferences:

a. With Mr. Nakano, NRPNHq, re: Establishment of National Traffic Safety Council. Action: Mr. Nakano was advised that NRP and MP may support the organization but should not take part in organizing same.

b. With Mr. Kaneko, NRPNHq, re: Theater and Hotel Control Laws. Action: Two laws give prefecture governors (instead of PSC) authority to issue permits for such businesses, and this was found to be good policy.

c. With Mr. Ase, Mr. Saburo, Mr. Iwai, of MPB and NRP, re: Ammunition and pistols. Action: Four major types of pistols used by Japanese police were examined and decision was reached that Type 14 is the most suitable as training weapon. This type will be used in police training schools.

d. With Mr. Kiriyama, Chief of Criminal Statistics Section, NRPNHq, re: Proposed Crime Statistic Report Forms. Action: NRP submitted a portion of the forms proposed for study by Police Branch personnel. Remaining forms to be submitted next week as soon as translations can be completed.

e. With Mr. Miwa, Chief of Planning Section, NRPNHq, re: Proposed Rules and Regulations for NRP. Action: Several conferences on this matter were held during week, and typing of final draft was delayed at end of week by NRP's submission of additional articles for consideration by PSD.

f. With Mr. Miwa, NRPNHq, re: NRP request for approval by PSD of extended titles for Superintendent of NRP. Action: Mr. Miwa was informed of PSD approval for titles of Chief Superintendent, Senior Superintendent, and Superintendent.

g. With Mr. Miwa, NRPNHq, re: Rules and Regulations proposed for National Public Safety Commission. Action: Proposed rules and

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regulations accepted with correction to be submitted to Chief, PSD, for final approval. However, at end of week, NRP proposed several changes which were taken under advisement, thus delaying final draft on this matter.

h. With Mr. Noboru Arimatsu, Police Specialist for Diet, and Diet (House of Representatives) member, Tosaburo Kogure, re: Amendments to Police Law desired by Japanese. Action: Nine (9) proposed changes in the law were discussed. At PSD request the Japanese agreed to a one-year trial of the law before planning changes in same. Report covering proposed changes will be submitted.

i. With Messrs. Matsumoto, Saito, et al, NRPNHq, re: Central Police College Activity. Action: General discussion was held re: plans for future program of college.

j. With Messrs. Shibata and Honda, NRPNHq, Training Section, re: Obtaining Appropriated Funds for Remodelling Kodiara School. Action: PSD informed them that representative will attend any meeting NRP calls with any other Japanese agency to expedite delivery of funds.

k. With Messrs. Shibata and Honda, NRPNHq, re: Training Program. Action: Discussed program outlined in memo to Chief, PSD. Advanced recruit training has started. Detailed instructions have been sent to prefectures, and progress is deemed satisfactory.

l. With Captain Taylor of Stars and Stripes Newspaper, re: S & S news item on release of OZU. Action: PSD advised that this news item was incorrect, that OZU is now imprisoned at Kosuge Prison. Arrangements made for Editor Hathaway to contact PSD. Correction was made.

m. With NRP and CCS representatives re: Police Radio Communications. Action: Report submitted to Chief, PSD.

2. Surveys and Inspections

a. During the week the following investigators were absent on TDY for purpose of inspection in the specified areas:

a. Mr. Jackson completed his inquiries concerning seashore guard posts (civilian manned) and submitted report to AIC.

b. The Chief Administrator, Administrator-in Charge and Mr. Mulbar conferred with Chief, PSD, and held a general discussion on the advisability of limiting enrollment at Regional Police Training Schools to 9,000 NRP personnel, with no MP officers to attend. Further discussions scheduled.

c. e. Mr. Munroe conducted an investigation (classified Secret) at Setagaya Police Station and Tokyo District Procurator's Office and submitted report thereon to AIC.

f. Chief Administrator prepared drafts of Check Sheet, G-2 to ESS, Memo for Record, and Inter-Office Memorandum recommending approval of Japanese Government request for glass and cement to build 1,500 police stations. Drafts sent to typist.

e. With Mr. Nakano, NRPNHq, re: Traffic Reference Material. Action: Reference material loaned to Nakano on previous occasion was returned and additional material for study was turned over to him.

f. With Mr. Miwa of NRPNHq, re: draft of "Act Concerning Execution of Duties of Police Officer". Action: Changes in wording of draft made and same will now be referred to Courts and Law Division, GS, by NRPNHq.

g. With Chief, PSD, and Executive Officer, re: Chain of Command NRP. Action: Decision reached on PSD approval for nine (9) ranks in chain of command.

h. With Mr. Yero and Mr. Kataoka, NRP, on proposed rules and regulations for the NRP covering sections pertaining to employment ranks and grades, disciplinary action and trial board procedure. Action: Further discussions scheduled for June 1.

i. With Mr. Miwa, NRPNHq, re: Chain of Command and Rank Titles

NRP. Action: PSD policy of title for each of eight supervisory and administrative ranks explained. NRPNHq will submit suggested titles for two un-named ranks June 1. He also will submit on same date an article for PSD approval creating the approved titles to be included in the proposed rules and regulations for NRP. Final conference between PSD and NRP scheduled.

All three stations were regarded as satisfactory. Inquiries were made to determine average length of detention periods and reports thereon submitted. At the Maranouchi station cells were found to be crowded by prisoners awaiting trial and it was determined that prisoners there awaiting trial by Japanese courts average 3 months detention prior to trial while those awaiting trial by American courts average 1½ months.

3. Miscellaneous Activities

a. Mr. Mulbar received for information and study a summarized report by Prefecture on the training of recruits and distribution of recruits to police of autonomous entities and NRP.

b. Administrator-in-Charge supervised the transfer of 969,000 rounds of pistol ammunition from the IKEGO arsenal to the Japanese police. Excellent storage was found available at Yokohama Arsenal with adequate guards for protection. Ammunition appeared in good condition, judging from exterior of cases despite average age of nine (9) years. Each lot will be tested by Japanese police to determine condition.

c. Mr. Mulbar received request from Mr. Miwa, NRPNHq, that permission be given to create a new title of Senior Superintendent in NRP for Superintendents who serve as Section Chiefs on National level and Division Chiefs on Regional level. This request taken under advisement.

d. Mr. O'Neill continued work in connection with the Teikoku Bank robbery-murder case, concerning photostats of handwriting of the suspect.

e. Administrator-in-Charge lectured at NRP Regional Headquarters to 50 training directors and associates re: Training Program in Japan.

f. Administrator Group V completed an assignment concerning

preparation of a job description (duties and responsibilities) for Police Investigators. Report submitted to AIC.

g. Chief Administrator, Administrator-in-Charge and Mr. Mulbar attended a meeting of Training Section Chiefs from all prefectures at MPB 5th floor auditorium and gave information and advice on training to the assembly.

h. Administrator-in-Charge completed and submitted to Chief, PSD, a report covering the training program for 1948.

i. Chief Administrator, with Chief Prison Administrator, met and discussed with Juvenile Court personnel, social agencies and police, problems concerning juvenile police activities and parole for juveniles at Harajuku Police Station.

j. Mr. Jackson conducted an investigation and submitted report to Chief Administrator re: Strength of Seacoast Observation Guard Posts (Civilian manned).

k. Lt. McCarthy continued work on Police Communications and accomplished the following:

1. Studied list of police radio operators submitted by Radio Wave Bureau to Domestic Radio Division, CCS, and suggested several changes in assignment of personnel to Mr. Ishida, Chief Radio Engineer, RRP. The Wave Bureau was requested to submit new requirements for all police radio stations.

e. With S. Yoshikawa of NRPNHq re: new regulations on fingerprints and criminal records. Action: Only change from old regulations eliminates regional Offices' maintenance of files. Same to be issued with provision that after translation, PSD will request necessary changes and so later revisions will be made.

f. With Nakagawa and Lt. Col. Battey re: names of regional training schools. Action: Former district colleges to be consolidated with regional schools and known as Advanced Division Regional Schools.

g. With T. Maeda, Identification Section, NRP, re: NRP crime detection laboratory. Action: Appropriation has been granted authorizing a maximum personnel of 52 persons. Temporary quarters for the laboratory being sought. Further conference to be held re: location of laboratory equipment available etc.

h. With Yasuoka of NRPNHq re: difficulties at Osaka, Hyogo, Okayama, and Yamaguchi in closing Korean Schools by CI&E order. Action: NRPNHq wishes to withhold police from action in matter until criminal acts occur or until the courts order police to take action. Same approved for PSD.

i. With Mr. Ogura and Mr. Nakano of NRPNHq re: Fire Service Law. Action: NRPNHq wishes to deny fire service primary responsibility for arson investigation. PSD will not support NRP in this.

j. With Messrs. Kaneko, Mori, and Shimizu of Yokkaichi, Mie Ken, re: Korean threats and robbery at that city. Action: Further report on case of robbery involving 13 bbls of fatty acid valued at ¥ 1,040,000.

k. With Nakagawa re: qualifications for commander of Crime Laboratory. General qualifications for position discussed. Action: Nakagawa will contact man with qualifications.

l. With Mr. Nakano, Chf, NRP Traffic Division re: traffic material available at this office for their assistance. Action: Information pertaining to traffic law enforcement, education, and engineering lent to Nakano. To be returned to PSD.

m. With Supt. Isoyama, Chief Crime Prevention Section, MPB, re: J. Shibata, Mayor, Onuki, Machi, Ibaraki Ken. Action: Detailed report submitted by Isoyama has been turned in for translation.

n. With Saito and Muto of NRPNHq and Fujita of MPB at NRPNHq re: search for Korean suspects in chaplain murder. Action: PSD requested that full effort of all Japanese Police be made for speedy apprehension.
