DEAN OF CITY PRINTERS.

James T. Larkin Has Rounded Out Quarter of a Century.

(From North Adams, Mass. Transcript Sept 10, '02.)

James T. Larkin, publisher of the North Adams directory, completed with the ending of the day's work at 6 o'clock Tuesday a quarter of century of continuous experience in the printing business in this city. There is no other man in the harness for that length of time.

Recalling the fact for the benefit of one or two interested friends yesterday afternoon Mr. Larkin remembered very distinctly starting in on the morning of September 10, 1877, to serve his printer's apprenticeship in the Transcript office. The apprentice in those days was a "devil" and it is the belief of those who know him that no one shone more brightly in that position of inky glory than Mr. Larkin. "Jimmy" worked in the Transcript office for about nine years, and was foreman for the last two or three years and then in '86 he began business for himself.

When he started to publish the directory in '88 he was located in his present establishment at the head of Main street and has been there since. The fifteenth directory from Mr. Larkin's printing plant was issued this year. Besides being a printer Mr. Larkin has been a newspaper man and for a number of years was the local correspondent of the Springfield and Troy papers.

He has watched the city grow from the time when two local editors handled all the news to the present day when six reporters are required and has a keen insight of local affairs. The strenuous days of early papers and their makers are to him as an open book. His 25 years in the business in this city makes him the dean of local printerdom.

NORTH ADAMS is situated in the northern part of Berkshire the Western county of Massachusetts, in lat. 42 deg. 40 min. N. and lon. 3 deg. 53 min. E. It is of perfectly rectangular form, 5 miles east and west and 3 1-2 miles north and south. Its meridian lines run due north and south, and its parallels of latitude east and west. It is bounded north by Clarksburg, east by Florida and Savoy, south by Adams and West by Williamstown. Adams was incorporated as a township October 15, 1778. On April 15, 1878, the town was divided into two equal parts, the new line between them running east and west. Incorporated as a city in 1895.

Summary of Statistics

The whole number of pupils attending our schools at present is 3326, an increase of 124. The whole number enrolled during the year has been 3496, the average number attending 3066, and the average daily attendance 2829. The last three numbers show only a slight increase, accounted for entirely by the unusual prevalence of contagious diseases and the strict enforcement of rules concerning attendance in such cases. The school census shows an increase of 213 persons between the ages of 7 and 14 inclusive.

Evening Schools

Evening schools are held during the winter months in the Drury, Houghton and Greylock buildings; the sessions consisting of 40 evenings. In order to keep up the interest and to prevent the Christmas holidays from interfering with the attendance, a vacation of two weeks is granted, thus dividing up the session into two parts.

The course of study includes all the ordinary branches taught in day primary and grammar schools, as well as such branches of high school work as are most useful in ordinary walks of life.

The evening schools are under the same efficient supervision of Superintendent Hall, that is found in connection with our day schools. While the work done cannot compare in amount with that completed in the ordinary primary and grammar courses it proves sufficient in quality to be of the greatest aid to those who need, and who are compelled by law to attend the evening school.

Candidates for admission to any of the Normal schools must have attained the age of seventeen years complete, if young men, and sixteen years if young women, and must be free from disease or infirmity which would unfit them for the office of teacher. Their fitness for admission will be determined:—1, by their standing in a physical examination; 2, by their moral character; 3, by their high school record; 4, by a written examination; 5, by an oral examination.

Written Examinations.—The examinations will embrace papers on the following groups of subjects:

1. Language—(a) English, with its grammar and literature, (b) either Latin or French.

2. Mathematics—(a) the elements of algebra, and (b) the elements of plane geometry.

3. United States History—The history and civil government of Massachusetts and the United States, with related geography and so much of English history as is directly contributory to a knowledge of United States history.

4. Science—(a) Physiology and hygiene and (b and c) any two of the following: Physics, chemistry, physical geography, and botany, provided one of the two selected is either physics or chemistry.

5. Drawing and Music—(a) Elementary mechanical and free-hand drawing, with any one of the topics,—form, color, and arrangement, and (b) music.

Oral Examination.—Each candidate shall be required to read aloud in the presence of the examiners. He will also be questioned orally either upon some of the foregoing subjects or upon other matters within his experience, in order that the examiners may gain some impression about his personal characteristics and his use of language, as well as give him an opportunity to furnish any evidence of qualification that might not otherwise become known to them.

Records of Scholarship.—The importance of a good record in the high school cannot be overestimated. Reasonable allowance in equivalents will be made in case a candidate, for satisfactory reasons has not taken a study named for examination. Successful experience in teaching is allowed to be taken into account in the determinations of equivalents in the entrance examinations.

Times of Examination.—Entrance examinations for candidates wishing to enter in September will be held:—The first examination on Thursday and Friday, June 23 and 24; the second examination on Tuesday and Wednesday, September 6 and 7. Preliminary examinations are allowed in June. Candidates are advised to present themselves at the first examination.

General Two Years' Course.—This course is designed primarily for those who aim to teach in public schools below the high school grade.

Three Years' Course.—This course includes the subjects of the two years' course and additional elective studies from the mathematics, science, language, art and psychology. This course will fit graduates for highest grammar grades and departmental teaching

Kindergarten Primary Course.—This course extends through a minimum of two years and includes such studies of the two years' course as immediately pertain to kindergarten work, instruction in the history and theory of kindergartens, and practice in teaching.

Special Course for Teachers.—Teachers of several years of successful experience in teaching, who give evidence of maturity, good scholarship, and of aptness to teach, may with the consent of the principal and of the board of visitors, select a course, including the course in psychology and pedagogy, and when such course is successfully completed they shall receive certificates for the same.

Tuition.—Tuition is free to all residents of Massachusetts. For others the tuition is fifty dollars a year. Text books and supplies are free as in the public schools. State aid to a limited extent may be granted to deserving persons, citizens of Massachusetts, after they have been in attendance for at least one term, provided they do not live in towns where normal schools are situated.

The Dormitory.—The dormitory provides accommodation for sixty students. Two students occupy one room. The rooms are furnished with the exception of bedding and towels. The price of board is \$4 per week or \$160 for the school year, payable in advance, in four payments, one every ten weeks, beginning with the opening of school in September.

Rules and Regulations

—OF THE—

Board of Health

The Board of Health of the City of North Adams hereby makes and publishes, as required by the Public Statutes of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the following rules and regulations for the public health and safety:

Extract from the Public Statues, Chapter 80, Section 18.

“The Board shall make shch regulations as it judges necessary for the public health and safety. Whoever violates such regulations shall forfeit a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00).”

DRAINAGE, PRIVIES, VAULTS AND CESSPOOLS.

Chapter 74, Acts of 1890.

Section 1. No privy vault shall be established in a city which accepts this act either upon premises situated on a public or private street, court or passageway where there is a public sewer, opposite thereto, or upon premises connected with a public or private sewer, without permission in writing first obtained from the Board of Health of such city. And whenever there is in such city a privy vault so situated which, in the opinion of the Board

of Health of such city, is injurious to the public health, said Board shall declare the same to be a nuisance, and forbid its continuance, and sections twenty-one to twenty-three inclusive of chapter eighty of the Public Statutes shall apply to such nuisances so declared.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect in any city of the Commonwealth when accepted by the City Council thereof.

Adopted by the City Council April 6, 1896.

Chapter 312, Acts of 1892.

An act relating to the repair of private drains in streets or ways.

Section 1. Every owner of an estate that drains into a private drain in a public or private street or way, who shall neglect to put such drain in good repair and condition for ten days after being notified by the Board of Health of the city or town that the drain is out of repair and condition, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for every day that such neglect continues after the expiration of said ten days.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect in any city when accepted by the City Council thereof, and in any town when accepted by a majority vote of the voters of such town present and voting at a meeting of said town duly called for that purpose. (Approved.)

Adopted by the City Council of North Adams, April 6, 1896.

Rule 1. Every tenement in said city used as a dwelling house shall be furnished with a sufficient drain, underground, to carry off the waste water into a common sewer or reservoir; and also with suitable water closets, or with a privy, the vault of which shall be underground, built and kept in the manner prescribed in these rules, and of sufficient capacity for the number of occupants in such tenement.

Rule 2. Every vault or privy shall be so constructed that the inside of the same shall be at least three feet from the line of every adjoining lot, unless the owner of such shall consent or agree otherwise; and also three feet from every street, lane, passageway or public place; and every such vault or privy shall be built in a thorough and substantial manner and kept water tight, and its contents shall never be within eighteen inches of the surface of the ground. Whenever any privy or vault shall become offensive the same shall be cleansed.

Rule 3. No privy, cesspool or vault shall be opened in any manner or time than at such time and in such manner as the Board of ealth may direct; and no person shall remove or carry through any public street, highway or square of the city the contents of any privy or vault, unless the person removing the same, and the cart, wagon or conveyance in which the same is carried, shall be licensed for such purpose by the Board of Health.

All such vaults shall be thoroughly cleaned out and the contents thereof removed once in each year, and oftener if the Board of Health so direct.

Rule 4. No sewer drain not water tight shall be allowed to pass within twenty feet of any well or other source of water used for culinary purposes, and no person shall allow any pool or stagnant water to be and remain upon his premises after notice to remove the same by the Board of Health.

Rule 5. The owners or occupants of estates abutting on a public sewer shall cause such estates to be connected by proper drains with public sewer. Whovere neglects or refuses to comply with such regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each day that such neglect or refusal continues.

Rule 6. No person shall permit the drainage of any building to enter any lake, pond or stream within the limits of the City of North Adams, the water of which is used for domestic purposes.

CLEANLINESS OF HOUSES AND PREMISES.

Public Statutes, Chapter 80, Section 24, provides: "The Board when satisfied upon due examination that a cellar, room, tenement or building in this city, occupied as a dwelling house, has become, by reason of the number of inhabitants, want of cleanliness or other cause, unfit for such purpose, and a cause of nuisance or sickness to the inhabitants or the public, may issue a notice in writing to such occupants or any of them requiring the premises to be put in proper condition as to cleanliness; or if they see fit, requiring the occupants to quit the premises within such time as the Board may deem reasonable."

Rule 7. No dwelling, or any part thereof, within the city shall be used for the sale, storage, sorting or handling of rags, without a written permit from the Board of Health.

Rule 8. No person shall collect, remove or carry in or through any of the streets, lanes, avenues, places or alleys within the City of North Adams, the contents of any cesspool, vault, privy or privy well, the drainage of any stable, dwelling house, slaughter house, or other building in the city, unless expressly licensed therefor by the Board of Health, upon such terms and conditions, and by such methods, as the Board may deem that the public health requires, and upon failure to comply therewith, the license shall be forthwith revoked and canceled. No privy, vault or cesspool shall be cleaned between 6 p. m. and sunrise.

Rule 9. No putrid, decaying or decayed animal or vegetable matter shall be allowed to remain in cellars or outbuilding. No fish, slaughter house offal or other decaying and offensive animal or vegetable matter shall be left or permitted to remain upon the land for purposes of fertilization without being plowed in or otherwise rendered inoffensive.

Rule 10. Every owner or occupant of any building in this city shall keep such building and the yard belonging thereto free from all filth and substances liable to produce offensive odors, especially fruit, meat and vegetable cans.

Rule 11. No person shall burn on premises occupied by him any garbage, refuse woolen, silk, leather or India rubber goods, kerosene or other substances so that the same shall evolve offensive odors and gases while burning.

Rule 12. No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited by any one occupying his premises, any house offal, bride, bones, dead animals, old leather, decayed fruit or vegetables, or any other rubbish in any streams, ponds, catch basin, street, lane, alley or public grounds of the city. Further, no person shall clean or wash fish or meat upon any street, lane, alley or public grounds of the city.

Rule 13. No person or persons shall deposit ashes or rubbish in any places within the city limits except in such places as shall be designated by the Board of Health.

Rule 14. No owner or occupant of land abutting on a private passageway, and having the right to use such passageway, shall suffer any filth or waste or stagnant water to remain on that part of the passageway adjoining such land.

Rule 15. No workman or other person shall commit any nuisance in the cellar of any building while the same is in process of construction.

Rule 16. The owner or lessee of any lodging or tenement house within the limits of the city shall, when in the opinion of the Board of Health or its duly authorized agent, it is deemed necessary, whitewash, paint or otherwise clean and make wholesome the walls and ceilings of the rooms and passageways of the building.

HOUSE OFFAL.

Rule 17. Every house shall be provided with a suitable water-tight covered receptacle to keep garbage and swill until the same is removed by the licensed scavengers. This receptacle shall be kept covered at all times except when depositing or removing the garbage. It shall be kept where it shall be convenient of access.

Rule 18. No person shall deposit in the garbage to be taken by the authorized scavengers any tin cans, water (dish water not excepted), ashes, glass, sweepings, oyster and clam shells, sawdust, corkdust, old boots or shoes, dead animals, lawn clippings nor any poisonous substances. Any garbage containing foreign matter of the kind enumerated above must be cared for by the owners at their expense.

Rule 19. No person shall go about, in or through the streets, squares or highways of the city collecting or removing swill, offal, butcher's waste, soap grease, rough tallow or slaughter house refuse unless duly authorized and licensed by the Board of Health.

Rule 20. All such refuse collected and carried through the streets, squares or highways as before provided shall be put and carried in a close covered vehicle, box or other tight vessel from which no odors can escape and which shall at all times, when not necessarily open for the purpose of depositing the material collected therein, be kept securely covered. If any of the contents shall be spilled or fall upon any street, walk or premises, it shall be the duty of the keeper or driver to replace the same and

STABLES.

Chapter 213, Acts of 1895.

An act relative to the licensing and regulating of stables in cities.

Chapter 220, Acts of 1891, Section 2.

No person shall hereafter occupy or use in any city any building for a livery stable or a stable for taking and keeping horses and carriages for hire or to let, within two hundred feet of any church or meeting house erected and used for the worship of God, without the consent in writing, of the religious society or parish worshipping therein.

Rule 21. The conditions upon which licenses to occupy buildings as livery or boarding stables shall be as follows:

Section 1. No person, party or corporation shall erect, occupy or use any building for a stable for more than four horses within the fire limits which the City Council may from time to time establish, unless licensed so to do by the Board of Health.

Chapter 220, Acts of 189.

Sec. 2. Every such stable shall be lighted and ventilated in a manner satisfactory to the Board of Health and the inspector of buildings.

Sec. 3. Every stable shall be provided with a manure pit of sufficient capacity, the same to be water tight and constructed of brick or stone laid in cement, and provided with a proper ventilating shaft.

Sec. 4. Every stable shall have water tight floors, and its drainage, whenever practicable, shall be properly conducted to a public sewer. When there is no sewer in the street adjoining such stable its drainage shall be conducted to the manure pit.

Sec. 5. No manure or bedding shall be allowed to remain outside any stable coming within these rules.

ASHES.

Rule 22. No person shall go about, in or through any of the streets of the city collecting or removing ashes, paper, excelsior, lawn clippings or any garbage of this nature except in a vehicle with a tight box, and said vehicle covered so that the contents cannot be scattered on the street.

ANIMALS.

Rule 23. No person shall keep any swine or goats within the limits prescribed by the Board of Health except the keeper thereof be licensed to keep the same by said Board, and when so licensed the animals shall be kept in the manner prescribed by the Board.

Rule 24. No person shall keep any fowl or animal in any part of a dwelling house or in any place in the city where the Board of Health may deem such keeping detrimental to the health or comfort of the residents of the neighborhood, or those who may pass thereby; and said Board shall have the power to remove or cause to be removed therefrom any such fowl or animal so kept.

Rule 25. No animal affected with an infectious or contagious disease shall be brought within the limits of the city.

Rule 26. No diseased animal, its flesh, or its product shall be sold or offered for sale, and no decayed, diseased or unwholesome meat, fish, fruit, or other article of food shall be sold or offered for sale, and the Board may cause the seizure and destruction of all such articles so sold or offered for sale.

Rule 27. Whoever has knowledge of or has reason to suspect the existence of a contagious disease among any domestic animals in this city shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Board of Health.

Rule 28. Whoever violates any provisions of regulations 26 and 27 shall be punished by a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or by imprisonment not exceeding one year, or both.

Chapter 491, Section 29. Acts of 1894.

Rule 29. No person shall abandon or leave in any street, alley, lot or other public place within said city any sick or injured horse or other animal. It shall be the duty of the owner of such sick or injured animal to make provisions for the care and shelter of the same, or if such sick or injured animal shall be adjudged past recovery, to kill or cause to be killed the same and removed under the rules and regulations of the Board of Health.

Rule 30. Any sick or injured animal found or abandoned upon any street, allely, lot or public place within said city without an owner, which is adjudged by the Board of Health and by any veterinary surgeon summoned by said Board, to be past recovery, shall after an interval of two hourse, if unclaimed and uncared for by the owner thereof, be killed and removed by order of said Board.

Rule 31. No person shall deposit or cause to be deposited upon any lot or in any street, alley, lake or river, or other body of water within said city, any dead animal or part thereof. It shall be the duty of any owner or other person having charge of any animal at the time of its death to notify the Board of Health immediately after its death.

CONTAGIOUS DISEASE.

Rule 32. Every person in whose dwelling there shall break out a case of cholera, yellow fever, diphtheria, membranous croup, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, typhus fever, small-pox, varioid or measles, shall immediately notify the Board of Health of the same, and, until instructions are received from the Board shall not permit any clothing or other property that may have been exposed to infection to be removed from the house, nor shall any occupant take up a residence elsewhere without the consent of the Board. Any physician who may know of or be called to a case of either of the diseases specified in the foregoing regulations, shall at once report such case to the Board of Health.

Rule 33. No person shall enter any hospital establishment for the care of contagious disease or the grounds surrounding the same without a written permit from the Board of Health.

Rule 34. All persons affected with either of the diseases specified in Rule 32 and all articles infected by the same, shall be immediately separated from all persons liable to contract or communicate the disease, and none but nurses and physicians shall be allowed access to persons sick with said diseases, and no person sick with any said diseases shall be removed at any time, except by permission and under direction of the Board. All persons infected with either of said diseases who cannot be properly quarantined, may be removed according to law, to such hospital or other place as the Board of Health may direct, and no person shall obstruct, hinder or oppose such removal, and when any person dies of either of said diseases, the body shall be buried under direction of the Board of Health, and no person shall obstruct, hinder or oppose such burial.

Rule 35. All bedding or other personal property, liable to propagate any of the diseases mentioned in Rule 32 shall be at once properly cleansed and fumigated or destroyed, and the Board of Health, if they deem it expedient, may cause the same to be so cleansed or destroyed.

Rule 36. No person or article liable to propagate a dangerous disease shall be brought within the limits of the city, without special consent and direction of the Board of Health and whenever it shall appear to any person that such person or article has been brought into the city, immediate notice thereof shall be given to the Board, specifying its location.

Rule 37. No person sick with any contagious or infectious disease shall be transported in any public vehicle used for the carrying of passengers.

Rule 38. In all houses where either diphtheria, membraneous croup, scarlet fever or measles is found to exist a placard shall be displayed in a conspicuous place, informing the public of the presence of such disease, and no person shall remove such card without permission of the Board of Health under penalty of not less than ten nor more than one hundred dollars.

Rule 39. Immediately upon recovery, death or removal of a person afflicted with contagious disease the room or rooms occupied by the patient must be disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board of Health. This work is performed by Inspectors of the said Board.

Rule 40. In all cases of diphtheria and membraneous croup, the patient will be held in quarantine until the attending physician or the Board of Health shall have received a negative culture from the State Board of Health.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE.

Rule 41. No child ill with whooping cough, measles, purulent ophthalmia, chicken-pox, mumps or any other contagious disease is allowed to attend school, nor is any child allowed to attend school in the city while any member of the household to which such child belongs is ill with small-pox, diphtheria, scarlet fever, measles or membraneous croup during a period of two weeks after the death, recovery or removal of such person. The length of time must be certified to in writing by the Board of Health.

Rule 42. No pupil who by reason of the foregoing rule, has been debarred from school attendance, shall be readmitted to any school in the city without a written permit from the Board of Health. Such permit may be issued when the attending physician has certified in writing to the Board of Health that in his opinion the child may attend school without danger of communicating any contagious disease.

Early Symptoms of Measles, Scarlet Fever and Diphtheria.

The early symptoms of these disease may often be recognized by teachers in the schools and in any case a physician's opinion should at once be demanded when suspicion is aroused.

In the case of Measles the early symptoms would be as follows: some cough, suffusion of the eyes, running at the nose, feverishness and lassitude. The eruption generally occurs first about the forehead, neck and face, and is of a reddish color and of a circular or semi-circular form.

In Scarlet Fever; general lassitude, feverishness, headache, sore throat, vomiting, and a fine red eruption about the ears, neck and shoulders, are the first symptoms.

In Diphtheria: general symptoms resembling a cold, with some rise of pulse and temperature, sore throat, are first observed, and should arouse suspicion.

In fact any case of sore throat found in the schools, a physician's examination should most properly be asked.

These general facts if borne in mind might in some cases lead to the detection of a disease which would be a source of great danger to the school at large if allowed to progress until the child was actually sick enough to be obliged to stay out of school.

If the foregoing rules and regulations are carefully observed the closing of the public schools for epidemic diseases will seldom, if ever, become necessary.

With the greatest of care it is often hard to say how soon a patient may with safety return to school after once having been sick of contagious disease, and it becomes all the more necessary that the judgment in such cases should not rest with too many, but should come from the Board of Health alone.

After any child has once been debarred from school attendance it shall not be readmitted until it shall have first presented the teacher with a certificate. This certificate will in all cases be issued by the Board of Health and should alone be recognized.

Rule 43. The Principal of any school upon the receipt of information satisfactory to him that any pupil attending school under his charge has visited a household where at the time of such visit, small-pox, diphtheria, membranous croup, measles or scarlet fever existed, is authorized to suspend such pupil for a period of two weeks next following such visit.

Rule 44. When children are absent from school on account of illness, and whenever the Principal has reason to suspect the existence of contagious disease in any household, he is authorized to exclude pupils from school until the case may be properly investigated. The teachers are required to exercise caution in

sending pupils to the houses of absent pupils to ascertain the reason for such absence, specially forbidding them to enter the house to which they are sent. Pupils are not permitted to be sent where contagious diseases are believed to exist in the household of absent pupils.

Rule 45. The body of any person dying, who has previously and within twenty-four days from date of death been reported by the attending physician to the Board of Health, as having had cholera, small-pox, diphtheria, membranous croup or diphtheretic croup or scarlet fever, shall within twenty-four hours, be interred.

Rule 46. Whenever quarantine has been established by the Board of Health upon or in any house within said city in which any contagious or infectious disease exists, by a placard affixed to such house, such quarantine and all the provisions thereof shall be maintained until the recovery or death of the person or persons affected with such disease has been reported to said Board, and until the said house has been thoroughly disinfected and such placard removed by said Board.

Rule 47. Two weeks after the disinfection of any such house so quarantined has been released by the Board of Health of said city, a written permit shall be issued by said Board authorizing the return and re-admission to school of any child or children resident in such house; provided that no other case of contagious or infectious disease shall have appeared in such house in the meantime.

Rule 48. In excluding pupils from any house in which small-pox, scarlet fever, measles, diphtheria and membranous croup exists, two or more buildings must be considered as one house if there is any direct communication between them; or if it is possible to enter or leave the two residences by means of the same hall, stairway or door.

Rule 49. If it comes to the teacher's knowledge that any pupil visits the house infected or attends the funeral of any person dying of those diseases, such pupil must be excluded at once and the case referred in writing to the Board of Health.

Rule 50. Teachers in the public schools are directed to follow the letter and intent of these rules and refer all questions that may arise to the Board of Health. Superintendents and officers of Sunday schools are requested to comply with these regulations as far as practicable.

DEATHS, BURIALS, CEMETERIES, ETC.

Rule 51. It shall be the duty of every Superintendent of a cemetery or other person in charge of any cemetery or burying-ground within this city, to receive permits issued for burials in said cemetery or burying-ground; to preserve the same and to furnish the Board of Health of said city, upon Monday of each week, a written report, upon blank forms to be furnished upon application by said Board, of all burials or caused to be made by him.

Rule 52. It shall be the duty of the undertaker, near relatives or any other person having charge of the funeral or burial of the dead body of any person within said city who has died of Asiatic cholera, yellow fever, typhus fever, small-pox, scarlet fever, diphtheria, membranous croup, to keep such funeral strictly private and to permit no other person or persons excepting the immediate members of the deceased person's family who are resident at the place of death, and the officiating clergyman or minister, to be present thereat; and to convey such dead body directly from the place of death to the place of burial and in no other vehicle than a hearse, and the funeral to take place within twenty-four hours after death.

Rule 53. It shall be the duty of the undertaker, near relatives and of any other person or persons within said city, who shall have charge of the burial or shipment, or of the preparations for the burial or shipment of the dead body of any person who has died of any contagious or infectious disease, to observe and obey the following rules and regulations embodied in this section:

(a) The dead body of any person who has died of any contagious or infectious disease shall be thoroughly disinfected, and shall not be exposed to the view of any person who is not necessarily engaged in the preparation of the same for burial.

(b) The dead body of any person who has died of any contagious or infectious disease shall not be placed or kept in any receiving vault, in any cemetery or burying-ground, unless such dead body shall be first enclosed in a hermetically sealed zinc-lined or other metallic casket.

(c) No dead body of any person who has died of Asiatic cholera, yellow fever, typhus fever or small-pox, shall be shipped or carried into or from said city by any means or conveyance whatsoever.

(d) In preparing for shipment the dead body of any person who has died of scarlet fever, diphtheria or membranous croup, the said body shall be wrapped in a sheet saturated either with a solution of bichloride of mercury of a strength of one part in two thousands, or with a solution of carbolic acid of the strength of one part in forty. The said body shall then be enclosed in a tightly sealed casket, and said casket shall be placed in a zinc or tin-lined box hermetically sealed.

Rule 54. Every grave in which any dead body shall be buried within the city shall be dug to a depth of not less than five feet below the surface of the ground.

Rule 55. No new cemetery, burying-ground, vault or tomb for the reception and burial of dead human bodies shall be established within said city, without a permit so to do first being granted by the Board of Health of said city. No additions shall be made to those already in use without the same authority.

Rule 56. All licenses granted by the Board of Health may be revoked at the pleasure of said Board.

The Board of Health of the City of North Adams do hereby make and establish the following regulation:

That no person shall expectorate upon the floor, seat or other part of any coach, street car, or other public conveyance.

“Any person violating the provision of this regulation shall forfeit a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.”—P. S., Chapter 89. Section 18.

Milk Ordinance

An ordinance relating to the Sale of Milk in the City of North Adams.

Be it ordained by the City Council of North Adams as follows:

Section 1—No milk shall be sold in the city of North Adams after the first day of April, 1898, except from cows that have been subjected within one year to examination that shall be satisfactory to the Board of Health and to the Inspector appointed by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Adams under Section 1, Chapter 491, of the Acts of Massachusetts of 1894, and pronounced free from the disease known as tuberculosis, or any other disease that may render the milk injurious to man.

In case an examination made by any person other than the Inspector for the City of North Adams, shall be unsatisfactory either to him or the Board of Health, a proper examination shall be made by said Inspector for the City of North Adams, and his decision shall be final.

Sec. 2—Any person selling or distributing milk, or keeping cows from which milk is sold or distributed in the City of North Adams, shall, upon the addition of any cow or cows to his dairy, immediately give notice to the Board of Health of such addition, and the Board of Health shall thereupon order an examination of such animal or animals to be made, as provided in Section 1 of this Ordinance.

Sec. 3—Each year during the months of June and December, and at such other times as it shall deem necessary, the Board of Health shall make or cause to be made, an inspection of all dairies and other places from which milk is sold in the City of North Adams, and as soon as may be after such inspection, shall

file a written report of the result of such inspection with the City Clerk, who shall safely keep the same for public examination and reference.

Sec. 4—All such premises, and all vessels and vehicles used in the business of selling and distributing milk, shall be kept in a perfectly cleanly and sanitary condition, and no person who refuses to allow such inspection to be made in accordance with Section 3 of this Ordinance, or who fails to keep his premises, vessels and vehicles as above mentioned in such cleanly and sanitary condition as shall be satisfactory to the Board of Health, or to provide such proper light and ventilation of his stables as the Board shall deem necessary, shall be allowed to sell or distribute milk in the City of North Adams.

Sec. 5—Every person keeping cows from which the milk is sold in the City of North Adams, shall have a room entirely apart from the stable, (although it may be in the same building if desired,) in which the milk shall be strained and cooled, said room to have a tight floor and the side walls and ceiling to be made of matched lumber or battened, unless lathed and plastered. No water-closet, earth-closet or privy shall be within or communicate directly with this room. The walls and ceilings of all cow-stables shall be cleaned and white-washed at least twice a year, and oftener if required by the Board of Health; nothing in this section, however, shall be interpreted to prevent the cooling of milk in spring houses when the same are properly constructed.

Sec. 6—No person who is suffering, or who is suspected of having typhoid fever, diphtheria or any other contagious disease, shall, while so suffering, be engaged in the care of cows or the handling of milk in places from which milk is to be sold or distributed in the city of North Adams.

Sec. 7—Every person selling milk or offering it for sale in a store, booth, or stand in the City of North Adams, shall keep such milk in a refrigerator or other perfectly tight receptacle entirely separated from any food or other contaminating product, said refrigerator or other receptacle to be provided with ice during the warm months, or at any other time when required to do so by the Board of Health.

Sec 8—Any person, party or corporation violating this Ordinance, shall receive notice in writing signed by the chairman of the Board of Health, or by its Agent, ordering him to at once comply with its requirements.

Any person, party or corporation after being so notified, who shall sell or distribute any milk in the City of North Adams until he receive permission in writing so to do from the Board of Health, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding twenty dollars for each offense, and his license to sell milk in this city shall be revoked.

The Board of Health of the City of North Adams de hereby determine and adjudicate, that the use of Milk Tickets more than once is a menace to health and that such articles are capable of conveying infection and creating sickness, and do therefore enact the following regulation:

That no person or persons shall on or after April 1st, 1900, issue, use or distribute within the City of North Adams, any Milk Tickets or Coupons which have been once before issued, used or distributed.

North Adams City Charter

AN ACT

TO

Incorporate the City of North Adams

See an Act to Abolish the Board of Public Works of the City of North Adams and for Other Purposes on Page Following Charter

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

TITLE I. MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT

Section 1. The inhabitants of the town of North Adams, shall, in case of the acceptance of this act by the voters of the said town as hereinafter provided, continue to be a body politic and corporate, under the name of the city of North Adams; and as such shall have, exercise and enjoy all rights, immunities, powers and privileges, and shall be subject to all the duties and obligations, now pertaining to and incumbent upon the said town as a municipal corporation.

Section 2. The administration of all the fiscal, prudential and municipal affairs of said city, with the government thereof, shall, except the affairs of public schools, be vested in an executive department, which shall consist of one officer, to be called the mayor, and in a legislative department which shall consist of a single body, to be called the city council, the members whereof shall be called councilmen. The executive department shall never exercise any legislative power, except as herein otherwise provided

Section 3. The territory of said city shall first be divided into seven wards, as hereinafter provided, but said number, upon any subsequent division of said city into new wards, may be increased

by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the city council, passed previous to and in the year of such division.

TITLE 2. ELECTIONS AND MEETINGS.

Section 4. The municipal election shall take place annually on the third Tuesday of December, and the municipal year shall begin on the first Monday of January following. All meetings of the citizens for municipal purposes shall be called by warrants issued by order of the city council, which shall be in such form and be served and returned in such manner and at such times, as the city council may by ordinance direct.

Section 5. At such municipal election the qualified voters shall give in their votes by ballot in the several wards for mayor and councilmen, and for the members of the board of assessors, board of trustees of the public library, and of the school committee then to be elected, and the person receiving the highest number of votes for any office shall be deemed and declared to be elected to such office; and whenever two or more persons are to be elected to the same office the several persons, up to the number required to be chosen, receiving the highest number of votes shall be deemed and declared to be elected. If it shall appear that there is no choice of mayor, or if the person elected mayor shall refuse to accept the office, or shall die before qualifying, or if vacancy in said office shall occur subsequently and more than three months previous to the expiration of the municipal year, the city council shall forthwith cause warrants to be issued for a new election, and the same proceedings shall be had in all respects as hereinbefore provided for the election of mayor and shall be repeated until the election of mayor is completed. If the full number of members of the city council has not been elected, or if a vacancy in the office of councilman shall occur subsequently and more than six months previous to the expiration of the municipal year, the council may forthwith elect some person or persons to fill the vacancy or vacancies until the next annual municipal election. The board of assessors shall consist of three persons, who shall be elected in a manner provided in section forty-one for the election of trustees of the public library.

Section 6. All meetings for the election of national, state, county and district officers shall be called by order of the city council, in the same manner as meetings for municipal elections are called.

Section 7. The city council may, when no convenient wardroom for holding the meetings of the citizens of any ward can be had

within the territorial limits of such ward, appoint and direct, in the warrant for calling any meeting of the citizens of such ward that the meeting be held in some convenient place within the limits of any adjacent ward of the city; and for such purpose the place so assigned shall be deemed and taken to be a part of the ward for which the election is held.

Section 8. General meetings of the citizens qualified to vote may from time to time be held according to the right secured to the people by the constitution of this Commonwealth, and all such meetings may, and upon the request in writing of fifty qualified voters setting forth the purposes thereof, shall be duly called by the city council.

TITLE 3. LEGISLATIVE DEPARTMENT.

Section 9. The members of the city council shall consist of twenty-one councilmen at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows: At the first municipal election held under this act twenty-one members at large of the council shall be elected by the qualified voters of the entire city, seven to serve for the term of three years, seven for the term of two years and seven for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing; and thereafter seven members at large of said city council shall be elected in a like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the members at large whose term then expires. At the first municipal election no voter shall vote for more than five of the councilmen to be elected for each term, that is to say, not more than fifteen in the aggregate on one ballot, and the seven having the highest number of votes for each term shall be declared elected. At all municipal elections subsequent to the first election no voter shall vote for more than five of the seven councilmen to be elected at an annual election on one ballot, and the seven having the highest number of votes shall be declared elected. The councilmen shall hold office for three years, except as herein otherwise provided, beginning with the first Monday in January next succeeding their election and until their successors shall be elected and qualified. A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. In case an election is held to fill a vacancy or vacancies in the council a voter may vote for the councilmen necessary to fill such vacancies in addition to the number above provided.

Section 10. The mayor and the councilmen elect shall annually, on the first Monday in January, at ten o'clock in the forenoon,

meet and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties. The oath shall be administered at their first meeting after the acceptance of this act, by the town clerk, and in subsequent years by the city clerk, or, in his absence, by any justice of the peace, and shall be duly certified on the journal of the city council. In case of the absence of the mayor elect on the first Monday in January, or if a mayor shall not then have been elected, the oath of office may be at any time thereafter be administered to him, and at any time thereafter in like manner, the oath of office may be administered to any member of the council who has been previously absent or has been subsequently elected; and every such oath shall be duly certified as aforesaid.

Section 11. After the oath has been administered to the councilmen present they shall be called to order, at their first organization by the town clerk, and in subsequent years by city clerk, or in case of the absence of the city clerk, by the oldest senior member present. The council shall then proceed to elect one of their own number president of the council by ballot. If no quorum is present an adjournment shall be taken to a later hour or to the next day, and thereafter the same proceedings shall be had from day to day until a quorum is present. If any person receives the votes of a majority of all the members of the council, such person shall be declared chosen president thereof. If on the first day on which a quorum is present no person receives the votes of such majority, they shall proceed to ballot until some person receives the votes of such majority or an adjournment to the succeeding day is taken, and on each succeeding day a plurality of those voting shall be sufficient for an election. No other business shall be in order until a president is chosen. The president shall be sworn by the town or city clerk, as the case may be, or in case of the absence of the clerk, by any justice of the peace. The council shall then proceed to the choice of a city clerk, in the same manner as above provided for the choice of president. The president may be removed from the presidency of the council and the clerk may be removed from office by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all the members of the council, taken by roll call. The president of the council shall have the same right to vote as any other member thereof.

Section 12. The mayor may at any time call a special meeting of the city council, by causing written notification thereof together with a statement of the subjects to be considered thereat, to be deposited in the postoffice, postpaid and addressed to the persons

to be notified, or left at the usual place of residence of each member of the council, at least twenty-four hours before the time appointed for such meeting.

Section 13. The city council shall determine the rules of its own proceedings and shall be judge of the election returns and qualifications of its own members. In case of the absence of the president the council shall choose a president pro tempore, and a plurality of the votes cast shall be sufficient for a choice. The council shall sit with open doors, whether in session as a council or as a committee of the whole, and shall cause a journal of its proceedings to be open to public inspection. The vote of the council upon any question shall be taken by roll call when the same is requested by at least three members. A majority of the members of the council shall be required to constitute a quorum, but a smaller number may adjourn from day to day. The council shall, so far as it is not inconsistent with this act, have and exercise all the legislative powers of the towns, and have all the powers and subject to all the liabilities of city councils and of either branch thereof, under the general laws of the Commonwealth, and it may by ordinance prescribe the manner in which powers shall be exercised. They shall receive no compensation for their services as members of the city council or any committee thereof.

Section 14. Neither the city council nor any members of committee thereof shall directly or indirectly take part in the employment of labor, the making of contracts, the purchase of materials or supplies, the construction, alteration or repair of any public works, buildings or other property, or the care, custody or management of the same, or in the conduct of any of the executive or administrative business of the city, or in the expenditure of public money, except such as may be necessary for the contingent and incidental expenses of the city council, nor in the appointment or removal of any officers, except as herein otherwise provided; but nothing in this section contained shall affect the powers or duties of the council in relation to state aid to disabled soldiers and sailors and of the families of those killed in the civil war.

Section 15. The city council shall in the month of January choose an auditor of accounts, who shall hold office for the term of one year beginning with the first Monday in February next ensuing, and until his successor is chosen and qualified. A majority of the votes of all the members of the council taken by roll call

shall be necessary for the choice of the auditor of accounts, and he may be removed by the council.

Section 16. The city council shall appropriate annually in the months of March and April the amount necessary to meet the expenditures of the city for the current municipal year. It shall take care that no money is paid from the treasury unless granted or appropriated, and shall secure a just and proper accountability by requiring bonds with sufficient penalties and sureties from all persons entrusted with the receipt, custody or disbursement of money. It shall as often as once in each year, ten days at least prior to the annual election, cause to be published for the use of the inhabitants a particular account of the receipts and expenditures of said city and a schedule of all city property and of the city debt. Any appropriation made by the city council for the erection of a city hall, or for land for a location for such building, shall be subjected to ratification by the legal voters of the city voting in their respective precincts at an annual municipal election. The city council may appropriate money from time to time in aid of the North Adams Hospital, and in return for such appropriations and said hospital shall receive persons for the reception of whom the city may erect, establish and maintain a hospital; but such appropriations shall not exceed in any one year a sum amounting to one-tenth of one per cent. of the valuation of the city for the preceding year.

Section 17. The city council shall have the power within said city to make and establish ordinances and by-laws, and to affix penalties as herein and by general law provided, without the sanction of any court or justice thereof: provided, however, that all laws and regulations now in force in the town of North Adams shall, until they shall expire by their limitation or be revised or repealed by the council, remain in force. Complaint for the breach of any ordinance or by-law may be made by the mayor or any head of a department or any resident of the city.

Section 18. No vote of the city council granting or bestowing an exclusive franchise of any description to any person or corporation shall be valid unless the same shall be approved by a vote of the qualified voters of the city, voting at large in their respective precincts at the annual municipal election.

Section 19. The city council shall not authorize the erection of school house, or of any addition thereto, nor pass any appropriation for such purpose until plans for the same have been approved by vote of the school committee, and such approval has been certified in writing to the chairman of said committee.

Section 20. The city council shall establish a fire department for said city, to consist of a chief and of such officers and members as the city council by ordinance shall from time to time prescribe; and said council shall have authority to define their ranks and duties and in general to make such regulations concerning the conduct and government of such department, the management of fires and the conduct of persons attending fires, as they may deem expedient, and may fix such penalties for any violation of such regulations or any of them as are provided for breach of the ordinance of said city. The appointment of all the officers and members of such department shall be vested in the mayor exclusively, who shall have authority to remove from office any officer or member for cause. The chief and officers shall be the firewards of the city.

Section 21. The city council shall have power to establish fire limits within the city, and from time to time change or enlarge the same, and by ordinance they may regulate the construction of all buildings, erected within said fire limits, stipulating their location, size and the material of which they shall be constructed, together with such other rules and regulations as shall tend to prevent damage by fire; provided that such rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the laws of this Commonwealth.

Section 22. The city council shall establish by ordinance a police department, to consist of a chief of police and such officers and men as it may prescribe, and make regulations for the government of the department. The appointment of all the members of such department shall be vested in the mayor exclusively, who shall have power to remove any member for cause.

Section 23. The city council shall, with the approval of the mayor, have exclusive authority and power to order the laying out, locating anew or discontinuing of all streets and ways and highways within the limits of said city, and to assess the damages sustained by any person thereby, and further, except as herein otherwise provided, to act in all matters relating to such laying out, locating anew, altering or discontinuing. Any person aggrieved by the assessment of his damages, or other action of the council under this section, shall have the right and privileges now allowed by law in such cases in appeals from decisions of the selectmen of towns.

Section 24. In case any ordinance, order, resolution or vote involves the appropriation or expenditure of money to an amount which may exceed two hundred dollars, the laying of an assessment or the granting to a person or corporation of any right in, over or under any street or other public ground of said city, the

affirmative votes of a majority of all the members of the city council shall be necessary for its passage. Every such ordinance, order, resolution or vote shall be read twice, with an interval of at least three days between the two readings before being finally passed and the vote on its final passage shall be taken by roll call: provided, however, that upon and after the written recommendation of the mayor, the city council may pass such ordinance, resolution or vote upon the same day, by a two-thirds yea and nay vote.

Section 25. At any meeting of the city council it shall be in order for any member thereof to give written notice, seconded in writing by a majority at least of all the members of the council, of his intention to move at the next meeting thereof, occurring within not less than ten days, a resolution that the mayor be removed for official misconduct or neglect of duty. Such notice shall specify as particularly as possible the acts of misconduct or the instances of neglect of duty complained of, shall be entered at large by the clerk in the minutes of the council, and the clerk shall, within two days, serve a copy on the mayor and mail a copy to each of the members of the council at his residence. At such next meeting of the council the mayor shall have the right to speak in his own defence and to be heard by counsel. The vote on the resolution shall be by roll call. If the resolution fails to receive the affirmative votes of three-fourths of all the members of the council it shall have no effect and shall not be re-introduced during that meeting of the council. If it receive the affirmative votes of three-fourths of all the members of the council it shall, upon the recording of such vote, take effect, and the office of mayor shall thereupon become vacant. The council shall thereupon order a warrant for a new election for mayor to be issued, and such further proceedings shall be had as are provided in section five of this act in case of a failure to elect a mayor.

Section 26. No member of the city council shall during the term for which he is elected, hold any other office in or under the city government, have the expenditure of any money appropriated by the council, or act as counsel in any matter before the council or any committee thereof; and no person shall be eligible for appointment to any municipal office established by the council during any municipal year within which he was councilman, until the expiration of the succeeding municipal year.

Section 27. Every ordinance, order, resolution or vote of the city council, except such as relates to its own internal affairs, to its own officers or employes to the election or duties of the auditor of accounts and any city clerk, to the removal of the mayor or to

the declaration of a vacancy in the office of mayor, shall be presented to the mayor for his approval, and like proceedings shall be had thereon as are in such case provided by the general laws relating to cities

TITLE 4. EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT.

Section 28. The executive powers of the city shall be vested solely in the mayor, and may be exercised by him either personally or through the several officers and boards of the city in their departments, under his general supervision and control. In case of a vacancy in any office to which appointment is made by the mayor he may personally perform the duties thereof, but he shall not be entitled to receive any salary or pay attached thereto. The mayor shall hold office for the municipal year beginning with the first Monday in January following his election unless sooner removed, and until his successor is elected and qualified.

Section 29 The mayor shall have the sole power of appointment to all municipal offices established by or under this act, unless herein otherwise provided; and he may, except as herein otherwise provided, remove from office by written order any officer so appointed hereunder, for any cause which he shall in his official discretion deem sufficient, which cause he shall assign in his order of removal. Such office shall become and be vacant upon the filing with the city clerk of such order of removal and the service of a copy thereof upon the officer so removed either personally or by leaving the same at his last or usual place of residence. The city clerk shall keep such order of removal on file, where it shall be open to public inspection.

Section 30. Whenever by reason of sickness or other cause the mayor shall be disabled from performing the duties of his office he may designate by a writing filed in the office of the city clerk, either the city treasurer, the city clerk, or the city solicitor, to act as mayor or in case of failure of the mayor to make such designation, the above mentioned officers in the order above named, then performing the duties of his office, shall act as mayor. Such officer shall during the continuance of such disability have all the rights and powers of mayor, except that he shall not when so acting have the power of removal, unless thereto in any instance authorized by vote of the city council, nor any power of appointment unless such disability of the mayor has continued for a period of thirty days, and then subject to the approval of the city council, nor power to approve or disapprove any ordinance, order, resolution or vote until within twenty-four hours of the time when it

would take effect without the approval of the mayor. In case such disability of the mayor continues for a period exceeding sixty days the city council may at any time after the expiration of that period declare a vacancy to exist in the office of mayor.

Section 31. Whenever there shall be a vacancy in the office of mayor the president of the city council shall act as mayor and possess all rights and powers of mayor during such vacancy, except that when so acting as mayor he shall not have the power of appointment or removal unless thereto in any instance authorized by vote of the council.

TITLE 5. SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

Section 22. The management and control of schools of said city shall be vested solely in a school committee, consisting of six members at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows: At the first municipal election held under this act six members of the school committee shall be elected by the qualified voters of the entire city, two to serve for the term of three years, two for the term of two years and two for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing, and thereafter two members at large of the school committee shall be elected in like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the members at large whose term then expires. The school committee shall at its first meeting in each municipal year, or as soon thereafter as may be, choose a chairman from among its members by ballot, and the votes of a majority of all the members of the board shall be required in order to elect.

Section 23. The school committee shall on the first Monday in June, or as soon thereafter as may be, choose by vote of a majority of its members, but not from their number, a superintendent of schools, who shall be under its direction and control. Such superintendent shall hold office until the first Monday in June next ensuing, unless sooner removed, and until his successor is chosen and qualified, and he may be removed at any time by the school committee by a majority of its members. The school committee shall, in case of a vacancy in their number, forthwith notify the city council, and the council shall call a joint convention of the members thereof and of the school committee, and at such convention the vacancy shall, by a vote of a majority of all the members of the two bodies, be filled until the end of the municipal year in which the warrant for the next ensuing annual municipal election

is issued, and at such election the vacancy shall be filled for the remainder, if any, of the unexpired term, in the same manner as the member whose office is vacant was elected. The school committee shall fix and establish the compensation of all persons employed by them.

TITLE 6. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS.

Section 34. There shall be the following administrative officers, who shall be appointed by the mayor and who shall perform the duties by law and hereinafter prescribed by them respectively, and such further duties not inconsistent with the nature of their respective offices as the city council may prescribe: I. A board of public works, consisting of three persons, who shall also be overseer of the poor and commissioners of public burial places. II. A city treasurer, who shall also be the collector of taxes. III. A city solicitor. IV. A chief of police. V. A chief of the fire department. VI. A board of health, consisting of three persons. VII. A city engineer, who shall also be inspector of buildings. VIII. A city bookkeeper, who shall also be clerk of the board of public works and shall keep the accounts of all departments except as herein otherwise provided. The above named board and officers shall be appointed on or before the first Monday in February and shall hold their respective offices for the term of one year beginning with the first Monday in February, unless sooner removed, and until their respective successors, or in case of boards, until a majority of the members thereof, are appointed and qualified; provided, however, that the appointment of the chief of police shall not be for any specified time, but shall hold good until his death, resignation or removal by the mayor, who shall have power to remove him for incompetency or cause. They shall be sworn or affirmed to the faithful discharge of the duties of their respective offices, which oath or affirmation, or a certified copy thereof, shall be filed in the office of the city clerk. IX. A board of license commissioners, as prescribed in chapter four hundred and twenty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four. The board of assessors shall be entitled to choose a clerk, who shall not be one of their own number. The board of public works shall appoint a superintendent of outdoor work who shall hold no other municipal office and a superintendent of the water works, neither of whom shall be of their own number, and who shall severally hold their offices for one year unless sooner removed by said board, and until their respective successors are appointed and qualified.

TITLE 7. POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

Section 35. The city clerk shall have charge of all journals, records, papers and documents of the city, attest all warrants, and

do such other acts in his said capacity as the city council may require of him. He shall be the clerk of the council and shall keep a journal of all votes and proceedings. He shall engross all the ordinances passed by the city council, in a book provided for that purpose and shall add proper indexes, which book shall be deemed a public record of such ordinances. He shall perform such other duties as are required by law or shall be prescribed by the council. In case of the temporary absence of the city clerk the president of the council may appoint a clerk pro tempore, who shall be duly qualified.

Section 26. The auditor shall have charge of all revenue and expenditure accounts of the city and shall keep a set of books showing in detail the revenues and expenditures of the city. He shall examine all pay rolls, bills or demands rendered against the city, and all orders or votes of the city council for the payment of money, shall see that they have been incurred with due authority, that they are properly approved by some person authorized thereto, and that the clerical computations are correct. He shall see that vouchers are prepared in proper form, and that the same are duly recorded and distributed to their proper account. If he approves of a bill, pay roll or demand, he shall endorse it with his certificate of approval and shall cause an abstract of the same to be entered on a book kept for that purpose, and shall pass it to the treasurer for payment. He shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned him by the city council. In case of the disability or absence of the auditor the president of the council shall appoint an auditor, pro tempore, who shall be duly qualified.

Section 37. The board of public works shall exercise the powers and be subject to the duties prescribed for boards of overseers of the poor by the laws of the Commonwealth. The board of public works shall have cognizance, direction and control:— (a) Of the construction, alteration, repair, care and lighting of streets, ways and sidewalks. (b) Of the construction, alteration, repair and care of public buildings: except that the care, construction, alteration and repair of all school buildings shall remain under the control of the school committee. (c) Of the construction, alteration, repair and care of public sewers and drains. (d) Of the construction, alteration, repair, care and maintenance of public bridges. (e) Of the laying out and caring for public burial places and public parks, and of all the work in or upon the same. (f) Of the construction, extension, alteration and repair of the public water works. (g) Of the care, superintendence and management of the public grounds belonging to said city, except such grounds as are under the control of the school committee, and of the shade and

ornamental trees standing and growing therein. (h) Of the supervision of fire alarm, electric light, power, telephone, telegraph and trolley wires, and electric light, telegraph and telephone poles and gas pipes. The said board may require that no person or corporation authorized by the city council to dig up any public street or sidewalk in said city shall begin such digging before furnishing to such board of public works security satisfactory to them to restore such street or sidewalk to its former condition. The said board shall also, except as herein otherwise provided, have exclusively the powers and be subject to the duties, liabilities and penalties which may be by law given to or imposed upon road commissioners of towns. They shall as overseers of the poor appoint a city physician.

Section 38. The city treasurer shall collect all the water rents and charges and all moneys due the city, and shall receive, have the custody of and pay out all moneys, upon the certificate of the auditor, and cause an accurate account of the same to be kept in proper bookkeeping form, or such form as the city council may prescribe. He shall make to the council annually or oftener, at such time or times in each year as it shall prescribe, a full and detailed statement of the receipts and expenditures of the city during such portion of the financial year as it may direct, and of the cash balance or surplus; and in every such statement the different sources of the city revenue and the amount received from each, the several appropriations made, the object for which they were made and the amount of moneys expended under each, the money borrowed on the credit of the city, the authority under which each loan was made, and the terms on which the same was obtained, shall be clearly and particularly specified. He shall cause to be reported weekly to the auditor a statement of all the receipts and disbursements in order that the proper entries may be made in the books kept by the auditor. No person who is a bank official or employe shall be eligible to the office of treasurer.

Section 39. The city solicitor shall for the salary herein provided perform all legal services in matters in which the city is interested, and attend to all proceedings at law or in equity in which the city is a party and all claims made to the council. For these purposes he shall have sole charge of all such matter and proceedings. He shall give in writing his legal opinion upon any of the municipal affairs of the city upon the request of the mayor or council, and in addition give his opinion upon the law relating to the municipal affairs in any department upon request made by the head of such department.

Section 40. The city engineer shall give his whole time to the city and shall have sole charge and control of and shall attend to

all the engineering work of the city. He shall, at the request of the board of public works, prepare plans and estimates of any proposed alterations in or construction of public sewers and drains and conduits, streets, sidewalks, water works and other public works. He shall assist the city solicitor as far as possible in defending the city against suits and claims brought against it for damages sustained by reason of any defect or want of repair in any public way, or for any cause whatever. He shall perform such other duties as the city council shall prescribe, not inconsistent herewith. As inspector of public buildings he shall have the control of the enforcement of the regulations regarding plumbing and shall perform such other duties as shall be from time to time prescribed by law and the ordinances of the city council.

Section 41. The trustees of the public library shall consist of three members at large, who shall be elected by the inhabitants of the city as follows. At the first municipal election held under this act one trustee shall be elected to serve for the term of three years, one for the term of two years and one for the term of one year, beginning with the first Monday in January then next ensuing, and thereafter one trustee at large shall be elected in like manner at each annual municipal election, to serve for the term of three years, beginning with the first Monday in January next ensuing, in place of the trustee at large whose term then expires. The trustees of the public library shall have the care and management of the public library.

Section 42. The auditor shall also be the city almoner, and shall keep a record of the settlements of all paupers or persons who are or may become a city charge, and shall, under the direction of and by the authority of the overseers of the poor, relieve the wants of such paupers outside of the almshouse as may be necessary and proper. He shall, as aforesaid, see that the paupers who are chargeable to other cities and towns are maintained by such cities and towns at their own expense, and that the city shall be reimbursed for outlays made for the paupers chargeable to the Commonwealth or other cities or towns. He shall, under the direction of the overseers of the poor, report all cases needing legal attention of the city solicitor, and shall furnish him with all the information possible in controversies arising over pauper settlement or otherwise. He shall perform such other duties as the overseers of the poor may from time to time direct.

Section 43. All city officers not hereinbefore mentioned shall perform such duties as are or may be from time to time prescribed by law, and such other duties, not inconsistent herewith or with general laws, as the council may from time to time prescribe.

Section 44. The administrative officers and boards above named in this title, and all administrative officers and boards hereafter established by the city council and not coming within the department of any officer or board so above named, shall have the power except as herein otherwise provided, to appoint or employ, and to remove or discharge, all officers, clerks and employees in their respective departments. Such appointment shall not be for any specified term, but shall hold good until removal or discharge. Orders of removal shall state the reason thereof and shall be entered upon the records of the officer or board making the same, and removals shall take effect upon the filing of a copy of such order with the city clerk in a book provided for the purpose and open to public inspection. The above named administrative officers and boards shall, in their respective departments make all necessary contracts for work and for the furnishing of materials and supplies for the city and for the construction, alteration, repair and care of public works, institutions, buildings and other property; except such property as shall be under the control of the school committee, and shall have, subject to the mayor, the direction and control of all the executive and administrative business of the city. They shall at all times be accountable to the mayor, as the chief executive officer, for the discharge of their duties.

Section 45. Every board, and every officer above named, not a member of a board, shall keep a record of all official transactions and such record shall be open to public inspection.

TITLE 8. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

Section 46. The following salaries shall be paid, viz: Mayor one thousand dollars each year. City clerk, thirteen hundred dollars each year. Tax collector and treasurer, two thousand dollars each year. City solicitor, nine hundred dollars each year. Members of the school committee, seventy-five dollars each, each year. Members of the board of assessors, four hundred dollars each, each year. Clerk of board of assessors, one hundred and fifty dollars each year. City physician, two hundred and fifty dollars each year. Members of the board of health, one hundred dollars each, each year. Chief of the fire department, three hundred dollars each year. Assistant chiefs of the fire department one hundred dollars each, each year. Superintendent of the water works, twelve hundred dollars each year. City engineer and inspector of plumbing, eighteen hundred dollars each year. Chief of police and keeper of lockup, three dollars and a half each day. Captain of police, three dollars each day. Keeper of the almshouse, seven hundred and fifty dollars each year. Members of

board of public works, five hundred dollars each, each year. Clerk of the board of public works, nine hundred dollars each year. Superintendent of outdoor work, twelve hundred dollars each year. Auditor, one thousand dollars each year. Members of the police force, two dollars and a half each day. Firemen, hose and hook-and-ladder men, sixty-five dollars each, each year. The compensation of all persons not employed by boards or heads of departments and not herein provided for shall be established by the city council, but no new salaried office shall be established except those required by law, nor any increase of salaries made unless approved by a vote of the citizens at large in their respective precincts at an annual election.

Section 47. No person shall be eligible to any of the offices of the city government, except superintendent of schools, chief of police, chief of the fire department, or city engineer, unless he is a citizen and has been a resident of the city for at least two years.

Section 48. Any office established under or by this act shall become vacant if the incumbent ceases to be a resident of the city. The conviction of the incumbent of any such office of a crime punishable by imprisonment shall operate to create a vacancy in the office held by him.

Section 49. The provisions of chapter three hundred and twelve of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-five and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto shall not apply to the city of North Adams until the first day of January in the year nineteen hundred.

Section 50. The administrative officers and boards above-named shall, annually on or before the first Monday of January, furnish to the mayor an itemized and detailed estimate of the moneys required for their respective departments or offices during the ensuing financial year. The mayor, president of the council and chairman of the board of assessors, shall examine such estimates and shall submit the same to the city council on or before the first day of March, with their itemized and detailed apportionment, which shall be the appropriations which the several departments and officers may expend during the current municipal year, but said city council at any time prior to May first, of each year, may, subject to the approval of the mayor as provided by law, strike out or decrease, but not increase any item in said report.

Section 51. Every officer of the city shall, at the request of the city council, give it such information in writing as it may require

in relation to any matter, act or thing connected with his office or employment or the discharge of the duties thereof.

Section 52. No sum appropriated for a specific purpose shall be expended for any other purpose, and no expenditure shall be made, nor liability incurred, by or in behalf of the city, until an appropriation has been duly voted by the city council sufficient to meet such expenditure or liability, together with all prior unpaid liabilities which are payable out of such appropriation, except in accordance with the written recommendation of the mayor to the city council, approved by the yea and nay vote of two-thirds of the council; provided, however, that, after the expiration of the financial year and until the passage of the annual appropriation, liabilities payable out of a regular appropriation to be contained therein may be incurred to an amount not exceeding one-third of the total of such appropriation for the preceding year. Every bill, pay roll or other voucher covering an expenditure of money shall be approved by the signatures, on the back of such bill or voucher, of the majority of the board or committee having control of, or incurring such expenditure, and after such approval such bills, pay rolls or vouchers shall be turned over to the auditor. The financial year shall begin with the first day of December in each year.

Section 53. Nothing herein contained shall affect the enforcement of the provisions of chapter three hundred and twenty of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-four, being "An act to improve the civil service of the Commonwealth and the cities thereof," and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, or of the rules made by the commissioners appointed thereunder; and the city council shall make sufficient and proper appropriations for the carrying out and enforcement of said act and such rules in said city.

Section 54. Whenever mechanical or other work is required to be done, or supplies are required for the city, at a cost amounting to five hundred dollars or more, the board or committee having the matter in charge shall invite proposals therefor by advertisements in not more than two newspapers published in said city, such advertisements to state the time and place for opening the proposals in answer to said advertisements, and reserving the right to said board or committee to reject any or all proposals. Every proposal for doing such work or making such sale shall be accompanied by a suitable bond, or certificate of deposit, for the faithful performance of such proposal, and all such proposals shall be kept by the officer or board inviting the same, and shall be open to public inspection after said proposals have been accepted or rejected.

Section 55. All contracts made by any department of the city shall, when the amount involved is five hundred dollars or more, be in writing, and no such contract shall be deemed to have been made or executed until the approval of the mayor is affixed thereto. All such contracts shall be accompanied by a bond with securities satisfactory to the board or committee having the matter in charge, or a deposit of money or other security for the faithful performance of such contracts; and such bonds or other security shall be deposited with the city auditor until the contract has been carried out in all respects, and no such contract shall be altered except by a written agreement of the contractor, the sureties on his or their bond, and the officer or board making the contract, with the approval of the mayor affixed thereto.

Section 56. No loan except such as may be incurred in anticipation of taxes shall be made except upon and after the written recommendation of the mayor, made to the city council and passed by a two thirds yea and nay vote. All bonds and notes issued by the city shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the mayor, and any coupons attached thereto shall bear the signature of the treasurer either in the original or a fac simile.

Section 57. The board of public works shall fix and establish the prices of rents for the use of water, which shall not be made less in any instance than the prices and rents now established by the prudential committee of the North Adams Fire District, until the bonded indebtedness now or hereafter created by said district or city for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said district or city with pure water shall have been paid; and the income received therefrom, in each year, after deducting all expenses and charges of distribution of such year, shall be applied as follows: First, to the payment of the interest on the debts and loans now or hereafter incurred by the said city and by the North Adams Fire District for the purpose of supplying said city and said district and the inhabitants thereof with water, and of such part of the principal sum thereof as shall become due in such year; second, after paying such interest and principal sums the residue of such income shall be used to supply the city and inhabitants thereof with pure water in the discretion of said board and any balance of such residue not so used shall be paid into the treasury of the city for general city purposes. As long as there shall be any debts of the city that shall have been incurred in supplying said district or said city or the inhabitants of either with water there shall be raised each year by taxation a sum which, together with the said income, shall be sufficient to pay the interest on all such debts and such part of the principal sum as shall become due in such year.

Section 58. Upon an acceptance of this act, as herein provided, the selectmen of said town shall forthwith divide the territory thereof into seven wards, so that the wards shall contain as nearly as may be consistent with well defined limits to each, an equal number of voters, and they shall designate the wards by numbers. They shall, for the purpose of the first municipal election to be held thereunder, which shall take place on the third Tuesday of December next succeeding such acceptance, provide suitable polling places in the several wards, and give notice thereof, and shall at least ten days previous to such third Tuesday in December appoint all proper election officers therefor, and they shall in general have the powers and perform the duties of the mayor and board of aldermen of cities, under chapter four hundred and seventeen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, the provisions of which shall so far as applicable apply to said election; and the town clerk shall perform the duties therein assigned to city clerks. The registrars shall cause to be prepared and published according to law lists of qualified voters in each of the wards established by the selectmen.

Section 59. All laws relating to the town of North Adams when this act shall be accepted as herein provided, shall, until altered, amended or repealed, continue in force in the city of North Adams, so far as the same are not inconsistent herewith.

Section 60. All special laws heretofore passed concerning the fire district in the town of North Adams, which shall be in force in said fire district when this act shall be accepted, as herein provided, shall, so far as the same are not inconsistent herewith, be extended to and continue in force in the city of North Adams until altered, amended or repealed.

Section 61. Upon the first day of January next after the acceptance of this act, as herein provided, the North Adams Fire District in said town shall cease to exist, and all the property, powers and privileges of the said district shall vest in the city of North Adams, and all the debts, duties and liabilities of the said fire district shall become the debts, duties and liabilities of said city.

Section 62. The passage of this act shall not affect any right accruing or accrued, or any suit, prosecution or other legal proceeding pending at the time when this act shall go into operation, and no penalty for forfeiture previously incurred shall be affected thereby. All persons holding office in said town or in the fire district in said town at the time this act shall take effect shall con-

tinue to hold the same, notwithstanding the passage thereof, until the organization of the city government hereby authorized shall be effected and until the successors of such officers shall be respectively elected or appointed and qualified.

Section 63. The selectmen shall notify the persons elected at such first election, and shall provide and appoint a place for the first meeting of the mayor and city council on the first Monday in January next ensuing; and shall by written notices left at their respective places of residence at least twenty-four hours prior to such meeting notify thereof the mayor-elect and councilmen-elect, who shall immediately proceed to organize and carry into effect the provisions of this act, which shall then have full force and effect. The selectmen shall, in like manner, appoint a place and time for the first meeting of the school committee and notify the members thereof. Nothing herein shall affect the annual meeting in said town for the election of national, state, district and county officers, which may be held next after the acceptance thereof.

Section 64. The question of the acceptance of this act may be submitted to the legal voters of said town at any time within two years after the passage thereof at an annual meeting or any meeting called for that purpose, except in the months of November and December. At such meeting the polls shall be open not less than eight hours, and the vote shall be taken by ballot in accordance with the provisions of chapter four hundred and seventeen of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three and acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, so far as the same shall be applicable, in answer to the question: "Shall an act passed by the general court in the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, entitled 'an act to incorporate the city of North Adams,' be accepted?" and the affirmative votes of a majority of the voters present and voting thereon shall be required for its acceptance. If at any meeting so held this act shall fail to be thus accepted, it may, at the expiration of three months from any such previous meeting, be again thus submitted, but not after the period of two years from the passage thereof.

Section 65. So much of this act as authorizes submission of the question of its acceptance to the legal voters of said town shall take effect upon its passage, but it shall not take further effect unless accepted by the legal voters of said town as herein provided. [Approved March 22, 1895.]

An Act to Abolish the Board of Public Works of the City of North Adams and for Other Purposes.

CHAP. 76. ACTS 1897.

Be it enacted as follows :

Section 1. The board of public works of the city of North Adams is hereby abolished, and the powers and duties now exercised and discharged by said board, except the powers and duties exercised and discharged by the members of the board as overseers of the poor and commissioners of public burial places, shall hereafter be exercised and discharged by one commissioner of public works, who shall be appointed by the mayor without confirmation by the city council, during the current year upon the passage of this act, and thereafter on or before the first Monday in February in each year. He shall hold his office for the term of one year unless sooner removed from office by the mayor in the manner prescribed in section twenty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and until his successor is appointed and qualified. He shall receive a salary of eighteen hundred dollars each year. A person not a citizen or resident of said North Adams may be appointed such commissioner or superintendent of outdoor work.

Section 2. The mayor of said city shall appoint without confirmation by the city council of North Adams during the current year upon the passage of this act, and thereafter on or before the first Monday in February in each year, one overseer of the poor, who shall exercise and discharge all the duties and powers prescribed by law for overseers of the poor, and shall also be the city almoner of said city and exercise and discharge all the duties and powers now exercised and discharged by the auditor of said city of North Adams as city almoner. He shall also be the commissioner of public burial places of said city. He shall hold his office for the term of one year unless sooner removed by the mayor in the manner prescribed in section twenty-nine of chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, and until his successor is appointed and qualified. He shall receive a salary of one thousand dollars each year. The city physician of said city shall hereafter be appointed solely by the mayor.

Section 3. The chief engineer of the fire department of said city shall also be assistant inspector of buildings, and as such assistant inspector be under the direction and control of the inspector of buildings. He shall devote his whole time to the city and shall receive a salary of nine hundred dollars each year.

Section 4. Anything contained in chapter one hundred and forty-eight of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and ninety-five, so far as it interferes with this act, is hereby repealed.

Section 5. This act shall take effect upon its passage. (Approved

City Clerk's salary increased from thirteen hundred to sixteen hundred dollars a year.—By vote of city, December, 1904.

Firemen's salaries increased 1901. Chief Engineer's salary increased 1904.

City Ward Lines

Ward 1.--Includes the villages of Blackinton and Greylock east to the point where the old Williamstown road crosses the Hoosac river near the Fitchburg railroad crossing in Braytonville. The line then runs north to Clarksburg town boundary. From the railroad crossing the line follows the Hoosac river eastward past the fair grounds to Brown street, passing southward along that street and along the east boundary of the cemetery, thence due south to the Adams line.

Ward 2.--The western boundary of Ward 2 begins at Clarksburg and runs south to the junction of the old Williamstown highway and the Hoosac river, with the river from that point to Brooklyn street for the southern boundary. Thence the line runs northerly along to Liberty on Liberty to Philips street and northerly along Phillips street across the hospital grounds due north to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 3.--The easterly boundary of Ward 3 starts at the Clarksburg line and follows Franklin street to Eagle, down Eagle to the Hoosac river, thence westerly along the river to Brooklyn street, up Brooklyn to Liberty, to Phillips thence due north to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 4.--The easterly boundary of Ward 4 is the line between Florida and North Adams south to a point opposite the Five Roads thence due west to the East Mountain school, then north-westerly to East Main street, down East Main through Willow Dell to the Hoosac river, thence along the river to Eagle street, up Eagle and Franklin streets to the Clarksburg line.

Ward 5.—Bounded on the east by the Florida town line, on the south by Adams as far west as the south branch of the Hoosac river, thence northerly along the river to a point opposite J. H. Flagg's property on State street. The boundary line then runs due east to Ashland street and north-westerly along Ashland street to Washington avenue, to Church, down Church to the junction of Main, thence in a general easterly direction along East Main to the East Mountain school and thence due east to Florida line.

Ward 6.—Starting at the Holden street bridge the lines of Ward 6 run alongside the north branch of the Hoosac river to and through Willow Dell to East Main, thence to the junction of East Main and Church, and down Church to Washington avenue; thence along Washington avenue to Ashland street; thence northerly along Ashland street to Quincy, westerly through Quincy to its termination thence northerly across Summer street to and through Holden street to the bridge.

Ward 7. Starting at the Brown street bridge the boundary of Ward 7 runs along the north branch of the Hoosac river to Holden street thence through Holden across Main to the western terminus of Quincy street; thence through Quincy to Ashland southeasterly through Ashland to the point opposite J. H. Flagg's property on State street, thence southerly along the south branch of the Hoosac river to the Adams line; thence westerly to a point equi-distant from the Adams turnpike to the Notch road; thence due north through the Tinney and Witherell properties to the easterly boundary of the cemetery; thence along Brown street to the bridge. the point of beginning.

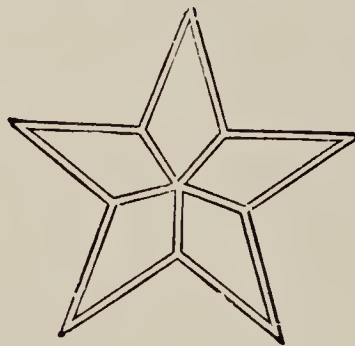
