- originally developed for fundraising campaigns (~2012), adjusted for WLM campaigns, since then also used by community
- low coordination, barely improved by developers

Functions (beginners)

- each campaign can be focused on:
 - the current Wikimedia project
 - language of user settings
 - geolocation of IP address (national and regional)
 - full or partial display
 - logged-in or anonymous users
 - mobile or desktop version
- various statistics (tracking)
- campaign types (which can be disabled in user settings): advocacy, article writing, photography, event,

fundraising, governance (+maintenance, special)

Functions (experts)

- display JavaScript or CSS
 - often just a clickable graphic are given in the request
 - various adjustments would be possible because <u>magic</u> words as well as <u>MediaWiki configuration values</u> can be used, e. g.:
 - edit count
 - registration date
 - page title

- user groups
- gender

- banner for all accounts with gender female set which have been created less than 3 years ago or just made between 10 and 50 edits per month in the last year
- invitation of active editors who read Wikipedia articles on chemistry to the WikiProject Chemistry
- notification for all functionaries to join the UCoC functionary meetings
- theoretically displayed for individual users or pages
- etc.

WMDE project

Background

- WMDE has identified topics and matching methods for promoting their <u>volunteer support program</u>
- one topic is LGBT content on German Wikipedia which can be found on <u>Category:LGBT</u> and subcategories

Goal

Display of banners in articles in Category:LGBT and subcategories for active community members



WMDE project

- <u>√ Development of script and banners</u>: a prototype script was developed and works appropriately (<u>test</u> <u>code</u>)
- ✓ Combinability: usable with other parameters like activity, magic words, MW configuration
- <u>Documentation</u> (planned): step by step manual for creating your own (sub-)category tree, transfer into the banner code and CentralNotice request



Ideas for use in marginalized contexts

- notifying readers of articles on marginalized topics in a region to a nearby edit-a-thon on the same topic
- pointing new editors who browse through articles on marginalized topics to a matching WikiProject or user group
- inviting active users with female gender settings to a WikiWomen user group
