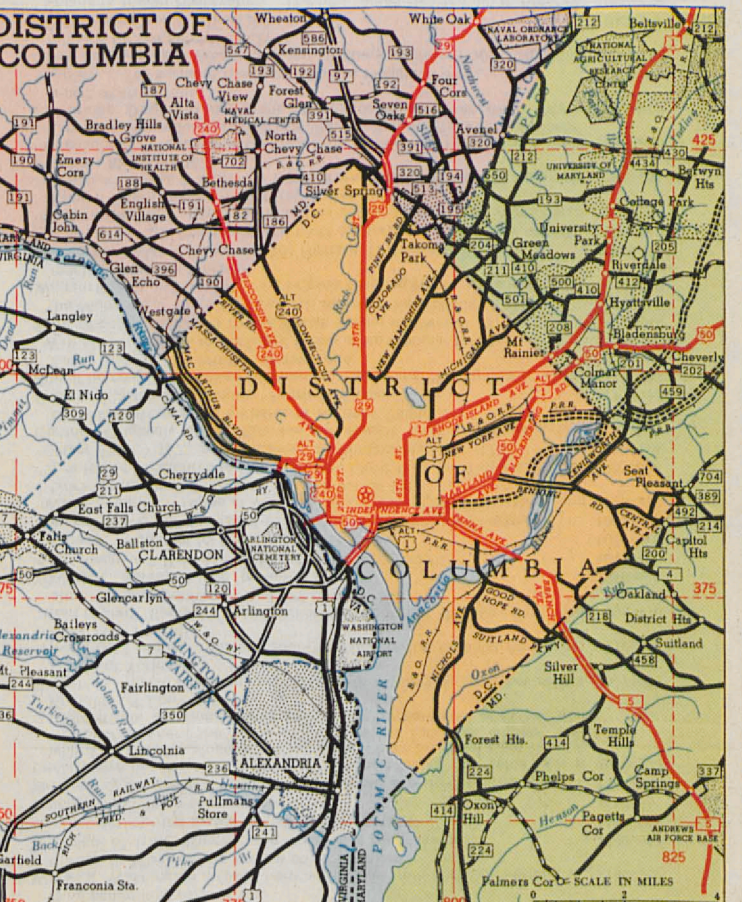

The National Park Service of the United States Department of the Interior administers several areas in Maryland, including the following:

ANTIENTIAN NATIONAL BATTLEFIELD SITE commemorates the Civil War. 553-636
Rock Hill Landing. Eastern Shore landing of the Colonial Annapolis-1010-478

CHESAPEAKE AND OHIO CANAL following the Potomac River from 321-666
to the Chesapeake Bay. It was built in 1828 and is administered as part of the National Park System.

STATE FORESTS AND STATE PARKS IN MARYLAND

The State parks of Maryland were selected for their scenic or historic values and for their recreational possibilities. The state forests are established primarily for conservation and public recreational opportunities.

THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL

THE APPALACHIAN TRAIL, the longest marked and organized footpath in the world, extending from Maine to Georgia, Maryland and Pennsylvania.

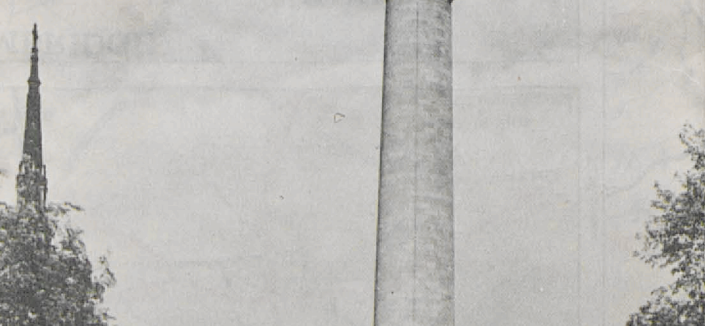
