(C) 3rd class Whose form and size are made with some difficulty, or which possesses a specified physical property, or whose tensile strength is over 19 kg/mm and under 22 kg/mm.
 (D) 4th class Whose form and size are made with difficulty; or which possesses a specified physical

property and chemical composition, or whose tensile strength is over 23 kg/mm.

(E) 5th class Whose form and size are made with great difficulty, or which possesses a special physical property and chemical composition.

(2) Standards articles under the classification of the preceding clause shall be in accordance with the exemplification of the following classification table.

(3) When the number of articles ordered is less than 5, 15% is allowed to be added to the controlled selling price. But the rule is not applied to the case when the expense for metal mould corresponding to the expense of wooden mould is demanded.

(4) Concerning castings for internal combustion engine such as cylinder block, silencer, cylinder, crank case, etc. made in accordance with special standards or design and pressure resisting castings such as a high-pressure pump, valves, compressors, etc. manufactured in accordance with special standards and design, for which application of the standards of the abovementioned 5th class is difficult, the price for which the permission of the Director-General of Price Board is obtained shall be applied.

(5) This controlled selling price signifies casting cost only and the price of article to be delivered at the factory of maker does not include the expense for making wooden mould and packing.
