Compilation example

Collections are a compilation of different works. While we see them all together we are able to still divide them apart.

When making a collection you are not adapting a specific work. You need to attribute all the original works that you used and you can choose a new license only for your additional contribution (if any) to the collection itself.

REMIXES/ADAPTATIONS

Remixes are works that derive from mixing different pre-existing works to the point that one can't really tell where one work ends and the other begins, and/or add significant personal contribution in order to create something new.



When remixing different works its important to attribute the original works that you used to make your derivative work.



- always attribute the original work in your derivative work
- if the original works contain the **SA** (ShareAlike) element, when licensing your derivative work use a compatible license with the ones that the original works use.
- if the original works contain the **ND** (NoDerivatives) element you cant publicly distribute your derivative work
