

Shipping Facilities.

My Railroad facilities are good, and I can obtain the lowest Freight Rates possible. I ship via M., h. & T. Bailroad, (Junction City branch of the M., K. & T.), Kansas City, Fort Scott & Memphis Railway, Kansas City & Pacific Railroad, and all their branches and connections. Also, by Adams and Pacific Express Companies.

Terms and Conditions.

TERMS OF PAYMENT.—Cash or satisfactory security before shipment of Stock. All orders to be sent by Express, C. O. D., must be accompanied by ONE-HALF THE AMOUNT IN CASH.

CONDITION OF SALE.-1. When Stock is to be boxed or bailed I charge for cost of labor and material.

- I deliver all Goods Free of Drayage to Railroad or Express Offices, after which my responsibility ceases.
- At these prices selection of varieties must be left with me, but I will always give purchaser his choice, so far as consistent with our Stock, 50 at 100 rates and 500 at 1000 rates.
- 4. I prefer parties ordering should indicate the route by which they wish Stock sent. In the absence of particular directions, I forward to the best of my judgment; but in no case will I assume any responsibility after consignment to purchaser, unless for my own mistakes. When losses occur from detention en-route, claims should be made on the carriers immediately.

All claims for shortage, etc., to receive attention, must be made within five days from receipt of Goods.

SHIPPING.-We usually commence shipping in the Spring about the 15th of MARCH
