Established Radio Relay link (2-AN/MRC-62) from Phu-Bai (Hill 180) to Cam Lo. This link provided the following circuits:

(c) Headquarters Battalion Civil Action program continues to support the Buddhist Orphanage in Hoa Phat Village (BT 988767). During the month of July, 250 bags of cement and two trucks of sand were procured and delivered to the Orphanage to be used in the school construction project. A cash donation of 20,000 piasters was given to the venerable THICH THANN HUU to be used for the procurement of materials for the school. Classes have already begun in the school which is very near completion. The school is large enough to accommodate some 350-400 students. Captain HUNTER, the Officer in Charge of the "I" Corps Security Detachment is currently teaching English to 35 Vietnamese students, two hours a night on Monday, Wednesday and Friday in downtown Danang.
