I. Subposens subject of testimony - The witness was an interpreter attendant on the Ex-Emperor PU-YI and will testify regarding the attitude of the Ex-Emperor toward Japan.

II - Information from the Investigative Division - The Curriculum Vitae indicates that the witness is a career diplomat, having served throughout his life in the service of the Foreign Ministry.
