FOREWORD

When the list on the Islands of the Pacific, to which the present list forms a supplement, was prepared in the spring of 1943, a year and a half after Pearl Harbor, the Polynesian islands were being converted into bases for American troops. Most of Melanesia and all of Micronesia--including the American "stepping stones," Midway, Wake and Guam--were held by the enemy. The campaign in New Guinea for the defense of Australia had begun.

During the two intervening years the tide of battle has moved from defense to assault, from New Guinea and the Solomons to the Gilberts, Marshalls, Marianas, and, as this compilation is completed, beyond the Japanese mandated islands to the islands of Japan proper. The attention of American readers and the work of American scholars and investigators have kept pace, and significant books, as well as a flood of magazine articles, appear among the new publications.

In supplementing the earlier list, the compiler has searched all new material on the islands. The selection from the mass of war reporting stresses accounts of the lands and the natives, and their contacts with American forces, rather than details of campaigns. A few older works have been added, including some omissions which had become apparent after the release of the 1943 list, and a group of early sources on the Japanese mandated islands.

The 1943 list, out of print for over a year, has now been re-issued in an edition identical with the original except for the omission of the index pages. For the sake of economy it seemed advisable to combine the author and subject indices of the original with those of the supplement, and the joint indices are placed at the end of the present pamphlet, pages S37 to S68. Items in the supplement are numbered in continuation of those in the original list, beginning with No. 1748.

The scheme of classification of the supplement is like that of the earlier list, except that the numerous references on World War II have been transferred from the subheading under the General Section, and placed in a separate section at the end, itself subdivided according to campaigns.
