The problem remains essentially unchanged since 2014:



 - Contains information that can be used to describe the tool
- Based on the standard established by Hay's tool directory
- The toolschema was updated in late 2022 to include a new set of fields intended to help with search refinement




The Result

- Random collection of tasks
 - What if there's a particular tool you want to edit?
- Fields aren't of equal value
 - Are we wasting time with hard-to-complete and relatively unimportant tasks?
 - E.g., icon and wikidataqid
- Some data simply can't be found
 - No way to indicate this
