



Live plants and like perishable stock should be sent by express; we cannot assume any responsibility whatever for safe arrival when such plants are ordered by freight by the purchaser. For example, if the general rate is \$5.00 per 100 lbs., a box containing 25 lbs. will cost \$1.00, which is a saving of 25c.
