This Valuable and Celebrated Collection was formed by Thomas Earl of Pembrofe in the early part of the last century, and was engraved and published in the year 1746, in a thick quarto, having the following title :-
" Numismata Antiqua, in tres partes divisa. Collegit olim et æri incidi vivens, curavit Thomas Pembrochies et Montis Gomerici Comes. Prelo demum mandabantur, A.D. mDCCXLVi."


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
