- 3.- 6 x 500# GPs fell approximately 1000' east of the target for no damage.
30 x 500# GPs fell from 600' southwest of the target to the middle of the target area.

Photographs taken 17 May show that altho both targets were extremely well covered and one revetment was hit on the outside, the guns themselves are still present.

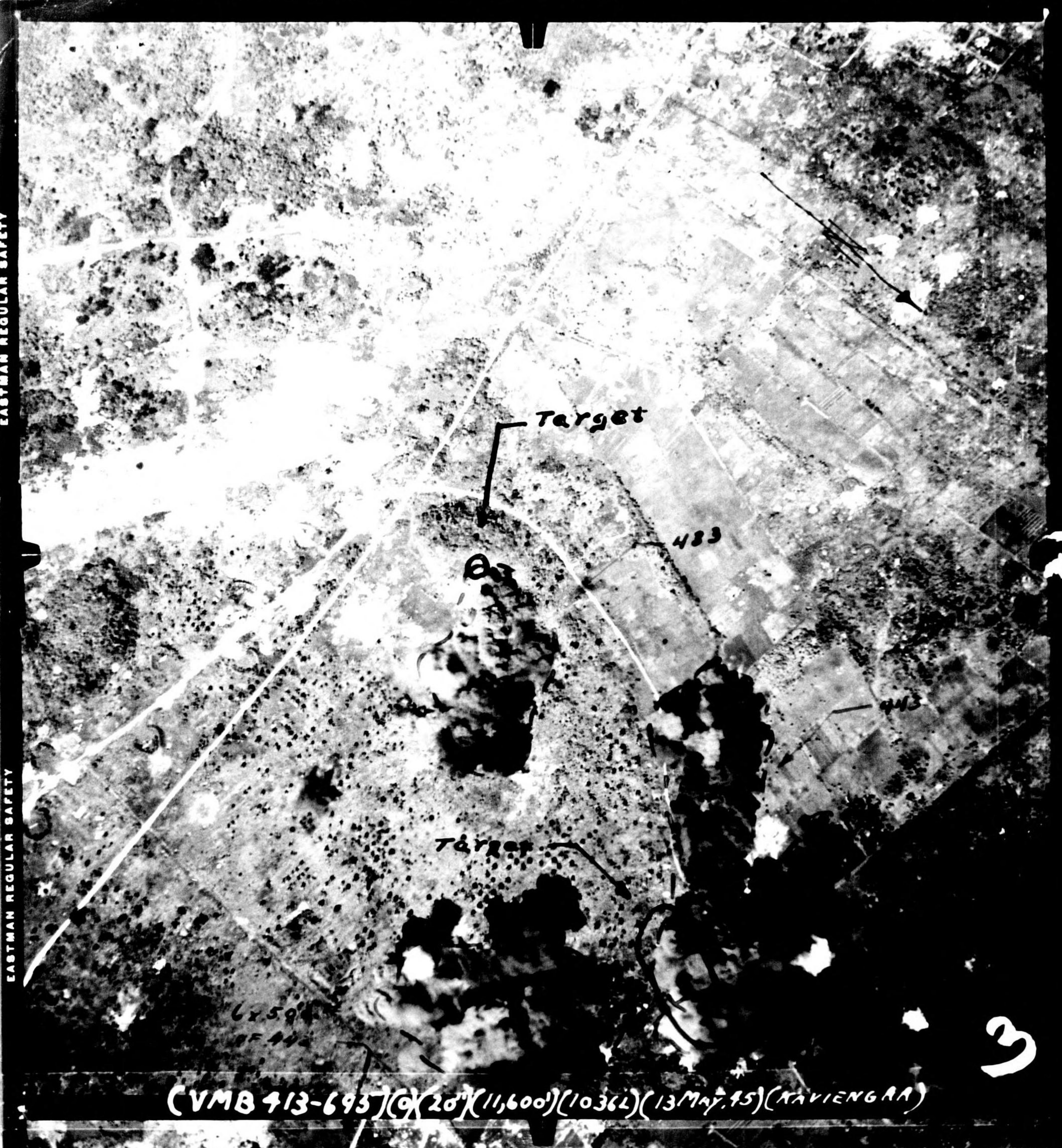
