1. Subject, a former major in the SD, is the Hausmeister at 29 Neue Kraeme; he lives with his wife and 14 year old son in the apartment directly across the hall from our apartment. My wife and I meet him occasionally in the hall, and have visited him and his wife twice in their apartment. On 30 October, Frau handed an envelope to my wife and asked that she give it to me. The woman said she did not know what was in the envelope, but added that it was something her husband wanted me to consider.

2. As you already know, the envelope contained the attached letters which Subject had written on 30 October. Briefly, he states that because of his SS and SD background (from 1933 to 1945) he has certain knowledge of and connections with Hungary, Poland and Yugoslavia; he believes that these connections could be exploited now; and he would very much like to get in touch with the appropriate American authorities. After discussing this matter , I talked with Subject in briefly with you and ! his apartment on the night of 31 October. His wife left the room, he poured Steinhaegers and champagne, and we discussed his request. I told him that, unfortunately, I was no longer in the Army as a soldier, that I was merely an administrative official with no direct contact with Army S-2 or with the American Consulate. Т then asked him why he did not take this matter to the German authorities. He scowled and dismissed this rapidly with the comment that in things like this the Germanshare children ll Heethenitalked, some more about his contact with U.S. Army intelligence in 1945, and about a few brushes with CIC in 1950 or 1951. 3. At this point, I suggested to Subject that he go back to the CIC with the letter he had given me. He countered with the statement that he no longer knows anyone there, that they would probably doubt his sincerety, etc. He explained again that he had come to me with the letters because I am an American that he knows, who knows him, and might be able to help him. At this point I suggested the obvious, that I try and locate the appropriate CIC office, give them the letters, tell the what I know about Subject, and let them tak the responsibility of getting in touch with Subject. He agreed readil to this proposal. We went on to talk of other things, never referring back to a date by which I would accomplish all this for him. I am sure, however, that Subject will expect to be contacted within the next few weeks.

4. I believe that it would be worth our while to have someone contact Subject regarding the attached letters. The contact can be brief and to the point. Subject is intelligent and shrewd. He knows the intelligence game, apparently, and will be quite ready to be debriefed on his background and possible use in the present situation. Although he may have other reasons for writing the letters, I believe that the following are applicable: He is overworked, but bored, by his present job in a liquor and wine distributionship; he is disturbed by the events in Eastern Europe and believes that he might have something to contribute. He has two daughters married to Americans (both living in the States). He knows that the Americans are doing something about Eastern Europe, and that they might be able to use someone with his background.

5. COS has considerable information about Subject dating from his postwar interrogation by 3rd Army Intelligence. The following data is a summary of that information plus what I have learned about Subject:



1. In view of the apparent misunderstanding which has developed regarding the fate of the various field traces initiated on Subject, we would like to call your attention to the field dispatches which represent replies to the request contained in EGFA-13425:

- A. BOB reply to EGFA-13425, dated 20 December 1956 No Trace.
- B. EGLA-22063, forwarded EE, 16 January 1956 States "The only UMPFENBACH in our files is one Dr. Ing. Karl of East Berlin who appears in EGLA-6886, 6 January 1954 and in the Biographic Research Air".
- C. EGQA-85671, forwarded EE, 15 January 1957 (COS, OSI, MID and A-2) states "no trace".
- D. EGQA-86530, CIC Central Registry file check, forwarded to EE on 12 February 1957 accompanied by attachment, contains traces which are an elaboration of the information in ECFA-13425.

2. As regards our plans for Subject and an accounting of what has transpired since the dispatch of reference EGFA-13463, the latter can be covered by stating that we have been awaiting receipt of POA. Our plans will be based on the results of discussions with Subject, in that Subject has approached who resides in the same apartment building, and has mentioned that he would appreciate speaking with regarding the situation in the East, particularly in Hungary W and Jugoslavia. Subject has added that he feels that, as a former officer in the German GEHEIMDIENSTAS, he can be of service to the U.S.

3. Subject has implied that he still has considerable contacts in both Hungary and Jugoslavia and that reactivation of those contacts would be a comparably simple matter. He has added that he will be going to Graz, Austria this summer and could possibly be of service to the "Americans". In view of the preceding, we feel that we should speak with Subject and determine to what extent he could "be of service" or in what capacity he might be utilized in our current operational effort.







Army

- 1. The 60th Infantry Division, Field Post Number 7895, in Maribor, is under the jurisdiction of the 5th Vojna Oblast, which is in Zagreb (Agram). The division, commanded by N. Garbe, a Slovene about 45 years old, consists of the following: an infantry regiment, a motorized artillery unit, an armored unit, an anti-aircraft unit, an engineer unit, a reconnaissance battalion, a reconnaissance company, a chemical company, and an auto company (autokompagnie). The commander of the Reconnaissance Company is Captain 1st Class Sodan Jere. His company consists of approximately 120 men and is equipped with a number of jeeps. Some of the units are in Maribor, while the others are located in the immediate area.
- 2. The barracks are outside the city, south of the Drava River on Ptujska Street; others are on Ljubljanska, Damatinova, Joska, and Pariska Streets.
- 3. The armored unit is separated from the others by barbed wire. The entrance to the armored unit's garages is on Fehova Street in Maribor, where there are newly constructed garages, approximately 80 to 100 meters long, to the left of the entrance. The capacity of the new garages is about 300 trucks and 50 tanks; about 25 Sherman and T-34 tanks are housed in the garages. In this same area, eight large underground gasoline storage tanks are being constructed.

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
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4. In Maribor, the Division's vehicles carry the identifying numbers: JLA - A - 69 and JLA - A - 64. These are reportedly changed constantly. In the Cadet Caserne there is a unit (each unit consists of eight to ten soldiers) of "reaction mine throwers" (reaktiven Minenwerfern).
This unit, commanded by Captain 2nd Class Cedomir Drobnjak, has three mine throwers assigned to it; the barrels are approximately 80 to 100 cm. with an average bore of 10 cm.

5. In addition, an infantry regiment, the former Proletariat Brigade is located in Maribor. This is composed of three battalions, of three companies each; there are approximately 450 to 480 men in each battalion. At company level, they are equipped with rifles and machine guns. 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1. CAECTOMY-18 has been put on spare time basis with us and his salary reduced from IM 600.00 to IM 200.00 per month. On 28 October 1959

2. Subject received this news with apparent relief, and seemed to be happy with the prospect of a job which would take his full time and give him an overt and normal employment. On about November 15 he landed a job in the shipping department of Neckerman Versand K.G. in Frankfurt. He had been given a certification of termination of employment from our cover organization, discussed below, which indicated that his engagement with us ended effectively on 31 December 1959. Therefore, he is on a probation basis with Neckermann. However, there is every indication that the job will be permanent and satisfactory from the point of view of both parties.

3. Since the beginning of his employment with us he has been on a salary of DM 600.00 per month. In addition, it has been the practice to reimburse him for his taxes and insurance and his telephone, which he obtained in order to remain on call for us. Insurance and taxes have run DM 101.25 per month, and telephone between DM 30 and DM 40 per month, and will now be eliminated. In addition, we have maintained an office for CAECTOMY 18 -- the same one which was originally procured when he started with the defunct CATADFOLE activity. Rent, phone, electricity, and maintenance on this real estate has cost DM 160 per month. The land-lord is now converting the property to a regular spartment and we have dropped it. The result of the dropping of the above expenses amounts to DM 682.00 per month from the FOB budget.

4. At the same time, the effectiveness of CAECTOMY 18 is not significantly reduced since most of the work he has done for us in the past six months can perfectly well be accomplished in his spare time. Specifically, Subject has agreed to hold himself available for us at all times when he is not tied down by his job with Neckerman. Furthermore, as was reported in <u>FROB 5651 of 29 October 1959</u>, he is now serving as accommodation address for non-operational correspondence from Poland in support of [

5. We believe we lose virtually nothing by the change in the relationship with CAECTOMY 18. Furthermore, his morale at the moment seems to be greatly improved as a result of being busy and having a job which is normal and which requires no evasion or fabrication vis-a-vis his friends and relatives.

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

2. CAECTOMY Progress Report (1 August - 31 January 1960): "CAECTOMY-18 has never been in contact with the Team or with / He was originally a member of CATADPOLE, a separate investigativesurveillance group to be set up for the work against Satellite targets. Project CATADPOLE was administratively tacked on CAECTOMY as an addendum to the Project Outline; subsequently the mascent CATADPOLES were re-named CAECTOMYS, a continuing source of confusion. CAECTOMY-18 does not presently have any investigative or surveillance function and has been of most value as a live letter drop. We, therefore, request that he be dropped from the CAECTOMY Project and suggest that he be carried under the CABATON Project."



5. A reply relative to the status of the polygraph will be appreciated



1. Forwarded herewith is the CAECTOMY surveillance report on Helmut WEISER. We pointed out in reference B that attempts to identify the person who was looking for "Frau MAKOWSKA" was Helmut WEISER of Neu Isenberg were inconclusive. They hinged upon the opinion of the son of CABATON-46 who was on vacation and had not seen the photos.

2. The son of CABATON-46 was employed by the "American Weekend" in Frankfurt. About two weeks ago this publication discharged almost their entire German staff, including the son of CABATON 46 in absentia. This communication reached the young man at his vacation spot on the French Riéviera. He is a house guest of his sister and brother-in-law and is making good money on the side as a house painter. His relatives rent bungalows and publish a periodical ballyhooing the virtues of their island paradise, which happens to be a nudist colony. It is not likely that we shall see this young man for allong time.

3. We are of the opinion that a true neighborhood investigation of Helmut WEISER would certainly come to the target's attention. Naturally, however, it is still possible to track down the two leads which the surveillance has produced. If Helmut WEISER and the door-todoor salesman are identical, the circumstantial evidence is pretty strong for his being a PIS agent and further action would seem well warranted. We have made a file search in FOB and COS/RI on the names that came up in the surveillance report and find no traces. Further action awaits Headquarters instructions.

4. We note that no further mail has come through the drop for "Fran MAKOWSKA" since 4 April 1960.
