- 1 mailing list



Iberocoop general data

- Similar local contexts and one language
- Same necessities
- Mutual support among chapters and affiliates.
- Non-hierarchical
- Chapter with staff (WMAR) supports the ones without it
- Every organization cooperates with their own resources (human resources, knowledge, etcétera)

Iberocoop basics



- Improves the relations between chapters and other affiliates
- Generates synergy in common projects
- Increases the presence of the common language inside the global level
- Motivates the sharing of best practices
- Generates feedback

- To ensure that groups keep connected with the global community
