It is recommended that application be made to the Treasury Department to have the following described silver, required in the fabrication of the marksman's insignia authorized fabricated by your letter of the 29th ultimo, sent to the Arsenal from the Mint of the United States, viz:-

756 Troy ounces Sterling silver plates, 92-1/2 per cent fine, in sheets 4 inches wide, 24 to 36 inches long, to be well and evenly rolled to a uniform thickness of 58/1000 of an inch, and not to vary 1/1000 of an inch, more or less, from that thickness; the sheets to be smoothly and evenly trimmed, with straight parallel edges; the silver to be evenly annealed as soft as possible for die work.

16 Troy ounces Silver wire, 45/1000 of an inch in diameter, 92-1/2 per cent fine.

12 Troy ounces Silver solder.
