led six Paje in a medium altitude daylight raid on Rataval target #127. The formation was composed of two three plane sections in columns stepped down.

The flight was airborne by 0902 and after joining up as described above proceeded to Cape Bena, New Ireland. From Cape Bena the formation flew on a heading of 2600 magnetic to Watom Island where the flight turned on a heading of 1730 magnetic for nine miles and turned into the bombing run.

The bombing run of the formation was made on a heading of 063° magnetic. First section bombing from 9,800 feet and the second section from 9,800 feet. The air speed for both sections was 160 knots indicated.


