Terms. Prices named herein are subject to the following discounts: Five per cent. allowed, to be deducted when cash accompanies order. To customers of improved credit accounts are payable 60 days from date of invoice, except where special prices and terms are arranged for. Potatoes, Grass, Grain, Clover and Bird Seed, Implements, Fertilizers and Insecticides are subject to no discount whatever, but are strictly net cash.

Orders are filled promptly upon reccipt or a reason given with acknowledgment of same.

Prices. As it is impossible to predict our exact demand, our prices are made subject to change without notice and goods being unsold when order reaches us. We, however, carry very large stocks, and if orders reach us in good season, full satisfaction may always be expected.

C. O. D. orders can be sent only by express. Such orders should be accompanied by a remittance in part payment, to guarantee charges.

20 per cent. Reduction in Express Rates on Plants. Under the new ruling of the leading express companies, Plants, Bulbs and Seeds, packed in closed boxes or baskets, will now be carried at the "GENERAL SPECIALS" rate. This rate means a reduction of 20 per cent. from the regular merchandise rates to all points where no "General Specials" exists. To points where a "General Specials" rate is in force the companies make a special reduction. Shipments weighing less than 100 lbs. receive the benefit of the rate per 100 lbs., but the minimum charge is 35 cts. For instance, where the regular merchandise rate is \$4.00 per 100 lbs., a box of plants weighing 100 lbs. will be carried for \$3.20, a saving of 80 cts. on one shipment.

If the purchaser does not accept the seeds and bulbs on these terms and conditions, they must be returned at once, and the money that has been paid for same will be refunded.

Cold Storage or Retarded LILIUM LONGIFLORUM.

With us the retarding of Lilium Longiflorum in cold storage is no longer an experiment, but an unqualified success. No stronger proof of this fact is required than the increasing demand we receive.

Grow Them Cold at First to Get Root Action. This is the principal secret and the point to be watched most closely, and is where growers sometimes make a failure at any month of the year. We do not recommend planting during June and July (on account of the temperature only), some growers not

having a proper location in which to start them.

We can undertake to deliver sound, firm bulbs, any time during the year, and have demonstrated this fact for the past three years at the Society of American Florists' Convention, where we have exhibited (during the month of August) Lilium Longiflorum bulbs grown in Japan the year previous, and kept in cold storage for 12 months after being harvested.

The bulbs, when properly treated after planting, usually flower in 2 or 3 months, and coming into flower, as they generally do, out of season, they bring very fancy prices, and from the fact that very little heat is required, there is no expense for coal, which makes them a very profitable article to grow.

The individual flower is very large, has much substance and lays close to the stems when cut, which makes it an excellent variety for shipping to market, as they can be packed closely without injury to the flower. They spread and open out readily when put in water.

It will stand slow forcing and if the flowers are brought in before outdoor Gladiolus are ready, they command very high prices. We have watched the variety for a number of years, but were never before able to get a sufficient quantity of bulbs to offer it to the commercial grower at a reasonable price. It is a sure money-maker and no florist will be disappointed who gives it a trial. Most other good whites are unproductive and do not give more than 95 per cent. of bloom, for which reason they do not pay to grow; but the **Augusta** will return upwards of 200 per cent. of large, handsome spikes of flowers.








