

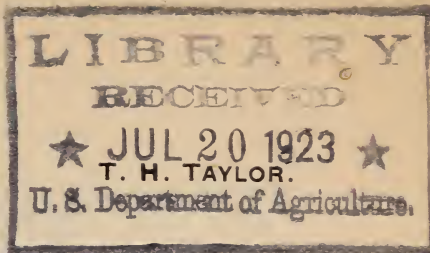

Remittances may be made in any funds current at par in Omaha, and if made payable to our order will be at our risk.
