Our collections are hand made, as orders are shipped out from our regular stock. They are not just junk that we want to get rid of. Remember mixed sizes will give you bloom over a longer period than if all bulbs are same size.

INSPECTION AND ROTATION

Our stock has been state inspected and pronounced clean. Many large growers are obliged to rent land outside their home places, often having to go many miles to find suitable soil, because it is found on careful trial that glads should not be grown on the same soil oftener than once in 4 or 5 years for best results. We usually grow 2 to 3 acres each year and have 30 acres of upland sandy loam just right to grow them on so will not have to put them back on same soil for many years and can still grow them on our home place under our personal attention.

CUT FLOWERS BY MAIL

We cut in bud and pack for shipment at 75c a dozen, and we ship postpaid at \$1.00 a dozen up to 500 miles. If distance is short we add more flowers to equalize the less parcel post rate. In other words, you always get your money's worth. Peonies and gladiolus ship well and open up finely on arrival when placed in water.

We can supply peonies from very early in June to June 25 or later, and Gladiolus blooms from July 15 to severe frost in late September or early October.

DELPHINIUMS - BELLADONNA AND BELLAMOSUM
