ENCLOSURE "A"D R A F TINFORMAL INTERDEPARTMENTAL WORKING AGREEMENT FOR THE
DOWNGRADING, RELEASING, AND PUBLISHING OF INFORMATION
FROM CAPTURED ENEMY DOCUMENTS OR REPRODUCTIONS THEREOF

1. The provisions of this informal working agreement do not in any way alter the handling of documents of a scientific or industrial nature, as defined in Executive Order 9604.

2. In determining what information, other than that of a scientific or industrial nature, obtained from captured enemy documents (or reproductions thereof, in part or in whole) may be downgraded or released for publication:

a. Each governmental agency or department shall bear responsibility for downgrading and releasing information from documents which are in its custody. However, if any document is considered to contain information of official interest to any agency or department of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State, it shall be referred to the appropriate agency(ies) or department(s) of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State for concurrence prior to downgrading or release.

b. If, in cases of documents held by or referred to an agency or department of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State, a document is considered to contain information of official interest to the Central Intelligence Agency, the Director of Central Intelligence will be consulted (by the agency or department of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State) prior to final decision as to release or downgrading. A negative recommendation by the Director of Central Intelligence will prohibit downgrading or release.

c. The decision of the head(s) of the appropriate agency(ies) or department(s) of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State in referred cases shall be final as to whether the national security permits that the information in question may be downgraded or released.

d. A negative decision by any one of the appropriate agencies or departments of the National Military Establishment or the Secretary of State will prohibit downgrading or release for publication.

e. In addition to information from documents presently bearing a security classification, information from unpublished captured enemy documents shall be considered classified, at least RESTRICTED, prior to proper review.

f. Concurrence in declassification shall constitute presumptive concurrence in release for publication.

RESTRICTEDENCLOSURE "B"D R A F TPROCEDURE GOVERNING THE RELEASE OF INFORMATION
FROM CAPTURED GERMAN DOCUMENTS

1. Captured German documents (or reproductions thereof, in part or in whole) which refer to the following subjects, in which the armed services of the United Kingdom have an interest, must be cleared by the appropriate United Kingdom agency (British Joint Intelligence Committee, Washington) prior to release or downgrading. Similarly, those in which the U.S. armed services have an interest must be cleared by the Director of Intelligence, Department of the Army, the Chief of Naval Intelligence, or the Director of Intelligence, Department of the Air Force, as appropriate, prior to release or downgrading:

- a. British, United States, or allied, clandestine or secret intelligence activities.
- b. Cryptographic matters of any shape or kind.
- c. Soviet clandestine or intelligence services.
- d. Interrogations, by the Germans of allied personnel.
- e. The existence or activities of or intelligence obtained by German agents in allied or allied-occupied territory.

2. Requests for the release of information from captured German documents containing matter likely to prejudice the national interest of the United States or United Kingdom with respect to relations with other foreign governments should be referred:

- a. By the Director of Intelligence of the United Kingdom Ministry possessing the document to the Foreign Office for decision as to release; and, if such information is of United States interest, through established channels to the Department of State for clearance prior to release.

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RESTRICTED

b. By the appropriate U.S. service head of intelligence to the Department of State for decision as to release, and if such information is of U.K. interest, through established channels to the appropriate U.K. authority for clearance prior to release.

3. Requests by foreign governments for information of U.K. interest from captured German documents (or reproductions thereof, in part or in whole) which after examination retain their security classification, will be granted only after consent by the appropriate U.K. authority. Similarly, requests by foreign governments for information of U.S. interest from such documents (or reproductions thereof, in part or in whole) which after examination retain their security classification, will be granted only after consent by the appropriate U.S. authority. For the purpose of this agreement, the United Kingdom and the British Dominions are considered to be separate nations.

4. Concurrence in declassification shall constitute presumptive concurrence in release for publication.

5. The above agreement covering release of information from captured German documents does not supersede or modify any working arrangements now in effect insofar as such documents are concerned. However, modification or cancellation of working arrangements now in effect may be made by mutual agreement between interested United States and United Kingdom agencies.

6. Subject to the above, requests for the release of information from captured German documents may be granted by appropriate United Kingdom or United States authorities provided that from a security point of view and in all other respects it is in the public interest to do so.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff have considered SWNCC 326/1 from a military point of view and perceive no particular objection thereto but recommend, for reasons subsequently outlined below, that an additional paragraph 4d be added and that paragraphs 4a and 4b of the Enclosure to SWNCC 326/1 be reworded as follows:

"4a. In negotiations with foreign governments regarding the immunity of members of the armed forces of the United States, who are passing through or stationed in a foreign country, with the consent of the government thereof, from local jurisdiction when charged with criminal offenses under local law, it should be the policy of the Government of the United States to obtain from the foreign government concerned an acknowledgment of the right of the United States to exercise exclusive jurisdiction over all such offenses committed by members of the armed forces of the United States or, failing that, as large a measure of jurisdiction as is possible, provided that the United States Government in an appropriate case may elect to relinquish such jurisdiction, and, in such event, shall arrange for the transfer of the accused to the local authorities for trial under local law.

"4b. Except where the matter is otherwise regulated by an existing agreement between a foreign

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government and the United States, in no case will United States Armed Forces surrender members of the Armed Forces or personnel in their custody to a foreign government for trial without appropriate reference to the Army, Navy, or Air Departments which will then consult with the Department of State.

* * * * *

"4d. The expression 'members of the Armed Forces of the United States' as used herein will include personnel of the Army, Navy, or Air Force, as well as United States civilians who are employed by, or serve with, the United States Forces and who are subject to United States military law."

In arriving at the recommendation for rewording of subparagraph 4a above, the Joint Chiefs of Staff recognize the considerations of the nature stated in subparagraphs (1) to (6) inclusive of paragraph 4a of the Enclosure to SWNCC 326/1 may well have a bearing upon the conduct of negotiations in any specific case. While such matters will of necessity have to be taken into consideration in particular cases, it is the Joint Chiefs of Staff opinion they could be dealt with as matters affecting the implementation of the policy rather than a qualification of the policy itself.

In arriving at the recommendation for rewording of subparagraph 4b above, the Joint Chiefs of Staff consider that the United States should reserve the right in a proper case to relinquish jurisdiction to the foreign government concerned.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff in defining the term "members of the Armed Forces," consider that provision should be made to include civilians under the scope of this policy statement, as well as purely military members of the Armed Forces, in view of the large numbers who now serve with the United States Forces abroad and who may be so employed in the future.

Subject: United States Policy in Korea.

In accordance with your memorandum of 14 January 1948 (SANA 5893) the Joint Chiefs of Staff have studied SANACC 176/35, a report by the Far Eastern Subcommittee of the State-Army-Navy-Air Force Coordinating Committee on "United States Policy in Korea."

The Joint Chiefs of Staff have noted the statement in the report concerning a meeting in the Secretary of State's office on September 29, 1947, at which it was agreed that:

"It should be the effort of the Government through all proper means to effect a settlement of the Korean problem which would enable the U.S. to withdraw from Korea as soon as possible with the minimum of bad effects."

The Joint Chiefs of Staff are in full agreement with this view, since from the military point of view:

a. The United States has little strategic interest in maintaining the present troops and bases in Korea;

b. The forces now deployed in Korea are sorely needed elsewhere. Therefore, it would be highly desirable to withdraw our forces from Korea and to utilize them for essential and pressing needs.

From the strictly military point of view, the Joint Chiefs of Staff perceive no objection to such of the context of SANACC 176/35 as is within their purview, although it seems desirable for note to be taken that the policies and the efforts made to date by the Commanding General, U.S. Army Forces in Korea are in general accord with a number of the various steps proposed in the SANACC report for improving the Korean situation. They would suggest, however, in view of the military implications set forth in a and b above, that the conclusions in paragraph 4 of SANACC 176/35 be amended substantially along the following lines:

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Change conclusion d substantially as follows:

d. United States occupation forces and military government agencies will be withdrawn from Korea at the earliest practicable date and every effort will be made to expedite the establishment of a government under any of the three alternatives enumerated in conclusion a above or to create conditions for the withdrawal of occupational forces prior to 31 December 1948. In any event, withdrawal will be initiated upon the establishment of a government of Korea or of South Korea. For planning purposes and for such interim and preparatory action as may appear appropriate, it may be assumed that U.S. occupation forces will be withdrawn from South Korea in accordance with the schedule set forth in paragraph 12 11 of Appendix "B" may be used.

Conclusion e states that "withdrawal of U.S. forces from South Korea under circumstances which would lead directly to Soviet domination of that area would result in serious damage to U.S. prestige * * * * " and that to "minimize" this possibility the South Korean constabulary should be augmented within the limits of available funds, equipment, etc.

Present information indicates that withdrawal of U.S. forces will probably result in communist domination and it is extremely doubtful if it would be possible to build up the constabulary in the time and with the facilities available which would be able to prevent Soviet encroachment. Therefore eventual domination of Korea by the USSR will have to be accepted as a probability if U.S. troops are withdrawn. However, the presence of an augmented constabulary might be a temporary deterrent to overt acts by North Korean forces. It is therefore suggested that conclusion e be changed to read as follows:

e. The withdrawal of U.S. forces from South Korea under circumstances which would lead directly to Soviet domination of that area would result in serious damage to U.S. prestige, and consequently to U.S. interests, in the Far East and throughout the world. In order to minimize the possibility of such an eventuality, In order to provide the new government a measure of security upon the withdrawal of U.S. forces, the United States should take steps, within the present legally authorized limits of available funds, personnel, and equipment, to augment the existing South Korean constabulary. Such action is not deemed inconsistent with the spirit of the U.N. Resolution on Korea or with the projected eventual establishment, as envisaged in paragraph 4 (a) of the Resolution, of Korean security forces on a national basis.

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Change conclusion 1 substantially as follows:

1. Plans should be drawn up for possible United States economic and military assistance to south Korea following United States withdrawal, including necessary legislation, together with recommendations for the administration and control of such assistance. Such control should provide an effective guarantee against the diversion of United States aid to any government or group unfriendly to the United States. Determination of the amount of military assistance planned for the Korean Government should be based on assistance requirements of countries strategically of greater importance to us.

If the proposed change to conclusion d is accepted, paragraph 11 of Appendix "B" will require revision. The time table will also require revision later to bring it into accord with the conditions existing at the time final action is taken on SANACC 176/35. It should be noted that even after a decision for an election in south Korea is made it will take about 80 days to hold the zonal election.

The following is the suggested revision of paragraph 11 (exclusive of the time table to be revised later):

11. Should the terms of the United Nations resolution be carried out or should the United States acting unilaterally establish a government in south Korea in the manner anticipated it would result in a time table substantially as follows:

The Joint Chiefs of Staff would point out that portions of SANACC 176/35 may have been overtaken by events.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff have reviewed SWNCC 137/6, and the comments and recommendations thereon contained in SWNCC 137/7 to 137/10 inclusive, from the military and security point of view. They note that the subject matter of this report parallels in many respects a broader assistance study (which includes training) undertaken by the Joint Chiefs of Staff for the purpose of determining from the standpoint of national security those countries of the world to which the United States should, if possible, give current assistance (JCS 1769/1, copy of which was forwarded to SWNCC by SM-8173; also Appendix to Enclosure "B" to SWNCC 360/1).

The Joint Chiefs of Staff are of the opinion that a policy or program for the provision of training assistance to foreign nationals, from the standpoint of national security, should as far as practicable be in consonance with the conclusions and recommendations of JCS 1769/1.

It is appreciated, however, that the entire program of training foreign nationals cannot be implemented at this time in accordance with the provisions of JCS 1769/1, because of the present uncertainty of the world political situation; because of the present uncertain status of some of the countries listed therein, viz., Germany, Japan, Austria and Spain; and because of the fact that existing legal authority only provides for training of nationals from Latin America, Greece, Turkey, the Philippines and China (naval training only) at United States service schools.

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Therefore, with regard to a current policy or program for training of foreign nationals, as envisaged in SWNCC 137/6, the following comments are submitted:

a. The Joint Chiefs of Staff reiterate the desire, transmitted to you in SM-9466, that all reference to joint schools be removed from the proposed policy.

b. The priority grouping of nations contained in the Annex to Appendix "B" of SWNCC 137/6 as modified by the recommendations of SWNCC 137/8 is considered satisfactory from the military and security point of view at the present time. It is assumed that the Joint Chiefs of Staff will have an opportunity to comment on the semi-annual revision of priorities provided for in paragraph 17 of SWNCC 137/6.

c. With the understanding that the priority grouping of nations does not authorize foreign students to receive classified matter of a higher category than they are authorized to receive by the SWNCC 206 series, it is considered that SWNCC 137/6 is in accordance with present security policy. From an administrative and security point of view, however, in so far as the military departments are concerned, it would be desirable if at any one school the same treatment were accorded the foreign nationals of all countries in attendance thereat during any one course or period of training subject to the provisions of SWNCC 206/29 as amended.

d. It would be of considerable assistance to the military departments if, in addition to furnishing current guidance by means of the priority grouping of nations contained in the Annex to Appendix "B" to SWNCC 137/6, a general policy enunciating and elaborating on the "Conclusions" of SWNCC 137/6, were prepared and promulgated. The current guidance to be provided by the Annex to Appendix "B" to SWNCC 137/6, while of considerable assistance to military departments as an interim measure, does not provide the definite and detailed guidance considered necessary for coordinated control and administration of the complex problem of training foreign nationals at United States service schools.

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e. It is noted that frequent reference is made in SWNCC 137/6 to the "War and Navy Departments" and to the "three departments (State, War, Navy)". It is assumed that the Department of the Air Force will be included in such references when the implementation of the National Security Act of 1947 is accomplished.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff have reviewed a study prepared by the Department of State entitled Program for the Investigation of Japanese Technology (SANACC 216/5). While recognizing the desirability of carrying out the United States policy for the dissemination of Japanese technology, the Joint Chiefs of Staff would point out that the method suggested in the study of introducing foreign investigators into Japan would have serious security implications in that, regardless of any pledge or agreement to the contrary, these foreign agents operating as authorized technical investigators could obtain for their respective governments special information outside the scope of Japanese technology and establish contacts in Japan which would be inimical to United States security interests in the Far East.

In view of the present critical world situation, the Joint Chiefs of Staff do not favor the adoption of this method at this time. The adverse security implications of the proposed investigation of Japanese technology would be removed if United States personnel, preferably individuals from the Department of Commerce, under supervision of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers were used to collect the technological information, which could be screened and then disseminated through the Publication Board to the interested Far Eastern Commission governments.

They note that existing legal authority provides only for training of nationals from Latin America, Greece, Turkey, the Philippines and China (naval training only) at U.S. service schools and therefore consider that comprehensive legislation or authorization for the instruction and training of foreign nationals at U.S. service schools is necessary for implementing an adequate and satisfactory program for national security.

With regard to the proposed bill contained in SWNCC 137/11:

a. It is noted that in amending Section 1 to include the Department of the Air Force and the United States Coast Guard, the phrase, "or jointly", was included (page 54, Section 1, line 10). This phrase, literally interpreted, would indicate that the joint colleges (National War College, Industrial College of the Armed Forces, and the Armed Forces Staff College), are available for training and instruction of foreign nationals. Many of the courses and lectures at these joint colleges discuss frankly and freely matters of very high security classification, and the Joint Chiefs of Staff therefore consider that the phrase, "or jointly", should be deleted from the proposed bill in order to obviate any indication of the possibility of attendance at these joint colleges.

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b. The amendment to the proposed bill recommended by the Army member of SANACC in SANACC 137/12 appears to be desirable from the point of view of the military departments. Notwithstanding the stated policy of the Bureau of the Budget in connection with disposition of dollar receipts, SWNCC 137/11, page 58, last paragraph, it appears desirable to amend the procedure and phrasing used in the proposed bill as contained in SWNCC 137/11 to incorporate instead the procedure and phrasing suggested by the Army member in SANACC 137/12. This procedure acts as a positive safeguard against the possible depletion of the military departments' appropriations and has been incorporated in other legislation approved by the Bureau of the Budget.

Therefore, subject to a above, the Joint Chiefs of Staff consider SWNCC 137/11 as amended by SANACC 137/12 to be satisfactory from a military point of view.

CHIEFS OF STAFF

Subject: Proposed Oil Pipelines to the Mediterranean
from the Middle East Oil Areas

1. The Anglo-Iranian Oil Company in partnership with an American company proposes to construct an oil pipeline from the Persian Gulf to the Mediterranean, and to erect a refinery at its western terminal. The British Chiefs of Staff have completed an examination of the strategical factors governing the location of oil pipelines to the Mediterranean from the Middle East oil areas. In the course of this examination, the British Chiefs of Staff were informed that the choice for the Mediterranean outlet of the Anglo-Iranian Company's pipeline lay between Egypt, Palestine and the Lebanon or Syria. Regarding the eastern end of the pipeline, the intention was that lines from both Kuwait and the Persian fields should be linked to a main line having a terminal near Basra. The routes which were considered from Basra can be summarized as follows:

a. To Egypt

Through Saudi Arabia and Southern Trans-Jordan, skirting the northern edge of the Arabian Desert and south of the Judean Hills.

b. To Palestine

Through Iraq and Northern Trans-Jordan to the neighborhood of Haifa, or via Haifa to a terminal near Gaza.

c. To Syria

A relatively direct route to the Lebanese or Syrian coast entirely through Arab territory.

2. The views of the British Chiefs of Staff on the strategic aspect of deciding which of the routes listed in paragraph 1 above would be most desirable are given below in paragraphs 3 to 7 inclusive.

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3. The British Chiefs of Staff consider that from the military point of view the security of the pipeline, refinery and pumping stations will be increased the further South the pipeline is aligned, and that a terminal in Syria/Lebanon or northern Palestine is militarily undesirable.

4. From the point of view of defence against ground and air attack, a terminal in Egypt would have great advantages. As, however, they understand that a terminal in Egypt is likely to be unacceptable economically and might also involve an increased risk of sabotage and, as southern Palestine so nearly meets their defence requirements, the British Chiefs of Staff recommend that a site be chosen near Gaza.

5. The British Chiefs of Staff consider that the suggestion of supplying a terminal at Gaza by a pipeline crossing the Great Rift Valley near Lake Tiberias and thence south is, for the reasons given above, militarily undesirable. From the military point of view, the only satisfactory route for such a pipeline would be through Saudi Arabia and Southern Trans-Jordan skirting the northern edge of the Arabian Desert and south of the Judean Hills, but turning northward when to the west of the Judean Hills. This would also facilitate the construction of a branch pipeline to the Red Sea.

6. In view of the growing economic importance of the Kuwait oil fields and others in Saudi Arabia, the strategic importance of the southern route will increase proportionately. The British Chiefs of Staff therefore consider it important that at the eastern end of the pipeline, the junction of the pipes between the Kuwait and the Persian oil fields, should be kept as far to the South as possible.

7. The risk of damage by enemy action might be further reduced by consideration being given, during surveying and construction, to physical protection of the pipe and pumping stations, more particularly from air attack.

8. Since the British Chiefs of Staff examined the subject and expressed their views as given in paragraphs 3 to 7 inclusive on the strategic aspect of the problem, two further factors have arisen:

a. The technical and constructional disadvantages of the southern pipeline would mean expenditure very much in excess of that for a northern line.

b. The recent decision by His Majesty's Government to refer the problem of Palestine to the United Nations Organization implies the possibility that British forces may not be located in either Egypt or Palestine in peacetime.

9. The British Chiefs of Staff discussed the subject of the proposed pipeline with Sir William Fraser, Chairman, Anglo-Iranian Oil Company, immediately prior to his departure by sea for New York on 28 February 1947. Although Sir William Fraser was aware of the original views expressed in paragraphs 3 to 7, the British Chiefs of Staff informed him that after taking into consideration the two further factors given in paragraph 8 above, their present views could be summarized as follows:

a. The strategical aspect of the problem is unaltered whether or not we are in future present in either Palestine or Egypt.

b. In the event of a threat to the Middle East, we should have to go back into Egypt, and Egypt is best defended from northern Palestine and Syria.

c. To keep the pipeline within this defence, it remains true that both the pipeline and refinery will be less vulnerable and more defensible the further South it is aligned.

d. The chief factor applicable to the defence of the Middle East on outbreak of war is to gain time to prepare our defences as far North as possible. Hence the further South the oil pipe is situated, the greater the possibility of conducting its successful defence.

10. His Majesty's Government has agreed that Sir William Fraser should be advised by the Foreign Office to press the American partners of the Anglo-Iranian Oil Company to agree to the construction of an oil pipeline through Saudi Arabia and Southern Trans-Jordan, skirting the northern edge of the Arabian Desert but turning northwards when to the west of the Judean Hills and terminating at Gaza; and that the eastern end of the pipeline, the junction between the pipes of Kuwait and the Persian oil fields, should be kept as far to the South as possible.

11. The British Chiefs of Staff wish to inform the United States Chiefs of Staff of their views on the strategic aspect of the problem as expressed in this paper in the hope that, if the United States Chiefs of Staff concur, they will be prepared to take appropriate steps to influence the American partners of the Anglo-Iranian Oil Company to accept Sir William Fraser's advice.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff have considered the request of the State Member, State-War-Navy Coordinating Committee, in SWN-5536 and request that the Secretary of State be informed as follows:

"The proposal of the British Government to grant the United States sharply limited long-term rights at Oakes and Windsor Fields, Bahama Islands, contingent upon the United States acceptance of the responsibility for the full cost of maintenance of the latter as communicated in British memorandum of 25 June 1947 appears unnecessarily restrictive.

"Peacetime rights at either Oakes or Windsor Field limited to transient and emergency traffic and training flights of units not larger than one squadron together with the right to maintain necessary personnel, materiel and supplies are adequate to meet U.S. military requirements. The British proposals relative to Oakes Field are acceptable provided such rights are not contingent upon a lease at Windsor Field under the proposed terms.

"It is therefore requested that the State Department continue negotiations with the British Government for an agreement for use of these two fields along the following lines:

a. Under peacetime conditions the United States will enjoy rights at Oakes Field, Bahama Islands, limited to transient and emergency traffic and training
