SUBJECT: Transfer Recommendation for GTMO Detainee, Mohmed Allah,
ISN: US9AF-00347DP

1. (S) **Personal Information:** Mohmed Allah is an Afghan national born in 1972. He is in good health.
2. (FOUO) **Detention Information:** Subject detainee went to the Chinese Hospital in Kandahar to have a medical procedure performed on his mother. Upon exiting the hospital to go purchase medicine, armed robbers took 3 million Afghanis from him and stole his automobile. Irregular Afghanistan troops found the detainee on the street in Kandahar City and held him. The detainee was turned over to U.S. forces and later transported to Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, Cuba, arriving on 15 June 2002. The detainee was transferred to Guantanamo Bay detention facility because he was a Mullah, who led prayers at Manu Mosque in Kandahar province, Afghanistan, prior to his detention, which placed him in a position to have special knowledge of the Taliban and access to Taliban leaders. The detainee was cooperative, but JTF 170 considers the information obtained from and about him as not valuable or tactically exploitable.
3. (S) **Assessment:** Based on current information, detainee ISN: US9AF-00347DP is assessed as not affiliated with Al Qaida, and as not being a Taliban leader. Moreover, based on the detainee folder, the knowledgeability brief (KB), and subsequent interrogations by JTF 170, the results of which are available on the JTF 170 detainee database, the detainee has no further intelligence value to the United States, and will not be seen for further intelligence purposes. Subject detainee has not expressed thoughts of violence, or made threats toward the U.S. or its allies during interrogations or in the course of his detention. Based on all the above, detainee does not pose a future threat to the U.S. or U.S. interests.
4. (S) **Recommendation:** In view of the foregoing, I recommend subject detainee be considered for release or transfer to the control of another government.
