LOCAL CONTENT

- Content related to a specific place, region, ethnical group, etc.
- It can be about local traditions, language, politics, social life, biographies, etc. related to a specific territory.
- In Wikimedia projects, local content can be archived in different ways:
 - Wikipedia: Either in the local language (if written) or any other language.
 - Commons: Audio, video and pictures of different events and occasions.
 - Wikidata: Great to archive information on people, monuments, places, etc.



Interest

- Low interest Except from enthousiats, militants or researchers.
 - Post-colonial situation adoration/complex towards the west
 - Limited perspectives of career work in the local context.

Social situation

• Editors outside of the continent will not write about it.

PARTICULARITIES OF AFRICA



Many official languages in Africa do not originate from the continent

- And yet they are the ones with most produced content in Africa!
- University studies are mostly in French/English and students tend to write in these languages.
- These languages have already their local/cultural contexts.

• Political/social tensions created between competing parts.
