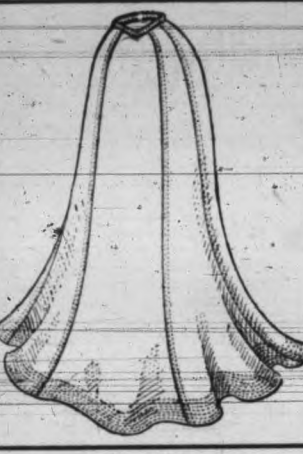

VICTORIAN RETURNS FROM MEXICAN TOUR
