

Planting Table for Beds of Bulbs

A circular bed 6 feet in diameter, with bulbs 6 inches apart, requires 110 bulbs; 5 inches apart requires 160 bulbs; 4 inches apart requires 300 bulbs.

Depth at Which Bulbs Should be Planted



Many of our customers are frequently puzzled to know the proper depth and distance apart at which bulbs should be planted. The accompanying diagram, reproduced from Popular Gardening, conveys the information much more clearly and briefly than we could describe it. The chart will bear careful study. Outdoor planting should be done early in the Fall to secure healthy plants, vigorous foliage and beautiful flowers.

Growing Bulbs in Prepared Fiber

The following bulbs may be grown in Prepared Fiber: Hyacinths, Early Tulips, Narcissus, Jonquils, Crocuses, Scillas, Freesias, Snowdrops and Spiræas. Our Prepared Fiber is mixed with Charcoal and only needs to be moistened before use. Bulbs may be grown in vases or bowls as drainage is unnecessary when using fiber.

TO succeed with bulbs it is necessary to begin right, by getting sound bulbs of good size, and we would warn intending purchasers against buying cheap undersized bulbs and expect the fine results obtained from such as we offer. Our sources of supply are the best in the country and abroad.

HYACINTHS

POT CULTURE.—Planting may be made at any time from September to December, though October is the best time. A light, rich soil, with a mixture of well-rotted cow or sheep manure, is most suitable. Use a 4- or 5-inch pot, and have the top of the bulb just above the surface. After potting, give a good watering and set away in a cool cellar or outhouse, and cover over with coal-ashes or some litter until thoroughly rooted; they may then be brought as wanted for a succession of flowers into a moderately warm, light room.

CULTURE IN GLASSES.—When it is desired to grow Hyacinths in water, they should be placed so that the base of the bulb merely touches the water. The glasses should then be set in a cool, dark closet, or in the cellar, until filled with roots, when they may be brought into the light. Give as much fresh air as possible without letting the plants stand in a draught and as nearly as possible at a temperature of 60° until the spikes are developed. To put them at once into a room with a temperature of, say 70°, would cause them to flower prematurely.

OUTDOOR CULTURE.—The bulbs may be planted any time from October to December—the earlier the better. They succeed in any good, well-drained garden soil. Set the bulbs so that the tops will be 3 or 4 inches below the surface and 6 to 10 inches apart. Before very severe weather comes on, cover the beds with straw, leaves or manure, to protect them from the frost, but care should be taken that this covering is not too thick; as the bulbs are as likely to be injured by being kept too warm as by freezing, this should be removed in March, or when danger from hard frost is past.

The flowers are delightfully fragrant, and each bulb will throw up three to four spikes. For forcing, three or four bulbs are generally planted in a pot. The pots must be kept in a cool and dark place until they fill with roots, when the flower spikes can be rapidly developed by exposure to light and moderate heat. They are very easily grown and extremely early; and, by making successive plantings, they may be had in flower all through the Winter.



TULIPS

Tulips for bedding are the most popular and effective of all hardy, bulbous plants. In our descriptions we give the color and average height to which they grow. For pot culture and forcing for Winter cut flowers they are invaluable.


The cultural directions given for Hyacinths on page 3 are equally applicable to Tulips, except that the bulbs, being smaller, must not be planted quite so deep. Four inches to the bottom of the bulb is deep enough, and a distance of 5 to 6 inches between the bulbs is sufficient. They may be planted in October and November, before the ground freezes. For pot culture, a compost of two parts loam to one part light manure, with some sand intermixed, is suitable. From three to five bulbs, according to size, in a 5-inch pot, are very effective. The pot should be buried until the bulbs are well rooted in the manner recommended for Hyacinths.

A, B and C indicate season of flowering. A and B may be planted to flower about the same time in the open ground; C flowers later. The figures indicate average height in inches.

Marshall's Selected Double Tulips

While not equal to the single in brilliancy, double varieties last much longer in bloom. The early varieties, such as Murillo, Imperator, Rubrorum, and the Tournesols, are excellent for forcing. The latter sorts will not bear forcing, but are very effective in beds or borders.



Narcissus

The very beautiful species and varieties of Narcissus are among the most popular and largely grown of Spring-flowering bulbs, and that deservedly, too. Their exquisite grace, beauty and charm of habit have been immortalized in the poetry of all times. No garden should be without them.

They are all of the easiest cultivation, thriving in almost any soil and situation, and they may be left alone for several years after once being planted. They do best, however, in a deep and somewhat stiff soil, and in a partially shaded position. They are well adapted for planting by the sides of streams, or lakes, or ponds, and in mixed flower or shrubbery borders. They are also suitable for naturalizing in the grass, by the side of woodland walks or in open spaces between trees and shrubs. With the exception of the Polyanthus section, they are all perfectly hardy.

Narcissus are also very suitable for growing in pots, requiring about the same treatment as Hyacinths, with 3 or 4 bulbs in a 5-inch pot. Some of the varieties are grown in large numbers by florists for Winter cut-flowers.






