Recommend that an exception be made to paragraph 7, SCAP Circular No 7, dated 23 August 1946, to the effect that Army supply and maintenance facilities be permitted to recell automotive spare parts and supplies, except tops, side curtains and seat covers, which are procured from the Japanese Government. 2. This exception is believed necessary in order that maintenance of privately-owned vehicles may be accomplished without adding additional administrative details to the organizations concerned. The following factors have been considered: a. In the past it has been necessary to make procurement demands on the Japanese Government for interim supplies such as front and rear springs, cylinder head gaskets, wind shields and other articles. b. The quality of these items procured from local sources is such that it is not deemed advisable to distinguish between sources of supply since additional stock numbers, card indexing, cross referencing, storage space and special handling will be involved. Army automotive supply and maintenance facilities will probably be required to serve for an indefinite period the private vehicles, including i-ten trucks of the occupation personnel and their dependents. d. When the Post Exchange assumes operation of garages, the tentatively planned source of supply of marts for the f-ton trucks will be from local Ordnance stocks. 3. Progurement demands on the Japanese Government are not intended to supplant normal supply procedure, but to act as an emergency expedient for critical status items. 4. The tops, side curtains and seat covers were not included in this exception eince the Post Exchange has tentative plans for procurement of these items and resale through Post Exchange outlets. Also existing Army tocks and anticipated supply from local sources on procurement demands now t force would not be sufficient to meet both private and military requireonten. J. W. F.



- 1. Class has requested that paragraph 2y of SCAP Circular No. 6, pertaining to the requisition of educational institutions, be amended to require approval of GHQ, SCAP prior to requisitioning commercial and trade schools, public libraries and facilities and equipment located in educational institutions.
- 2. In many cases Japanese schools which are classified as commercial and trade schools are considered essential for the democratization of Japanese economy. Established libraries and facilities and equipment located in educational institutions should be requisitioned only after CHQ, SCAP has determined that such action will not hamper the reestablishment of education.
- 3. To eliminate any possible future interference with the reestablishment of Japanese educational activities, it is requested that paragraph 2y of SCAP Circular 6 be amended in the next published change, as follows:

Buildings and facilities occupied by educational institutions such as government, public, and bona fide private schools, colleges and universities, commercial and trade schools and public libraries, including facilities and equipment located therein.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

- 1. Cl&E requested the present list of controlled items requiring approval of GHQ, SCAP prior to requisitioning be amended to include all types of schools, public libraries, former military and naval schools when such schools have been returned to the Japanese Government and allotted to educational activities. Cl&E gave several specific instances whereby the reestablishment of Japanese education is being hampered because educational facilities of commercial and trade schools, public libraries and equipment in other schools have been requisitioned.
- 2. CI&E (Major Kief) concurs in the change to par 2y of SCAP Circular 6 as rewarded by G-4 in par 3 of check note (2). G-4 concurs in amending the list of controlled items to include commercial schools, trade schools, public libraries, facilities and equipment located in educational institutions, and military and naval schools where such facilities have been returned to the Japanese Government and are allotted to educational activities. GPA publishes the list of controlled items and changes thereto. The request is being forwarded to GPA.

Specifically excluded are former military and naval schools unless such schools have been returned to the Imperial Japanese Government and allocated to educational activities." 2. It is felt advisable to suggest the above change in wording to cover specific instances which have tended to hamper the re-establishment of education. a. Complaints, petitions etc. received in the Education Division of CIE show that furniture, equipment and supplies belonging to schools have been requisitioned; b. In Yamanashi Ken, Ehime Ken and Yamagata Ken the requisitioning of public libraries has seriously interfered with adult education; c. Commercial and trade schools, heretofore exempted from requirement for GHQ, SCAP, approval, become increasingly important, as time passes, to a well rounded educational program; d. In one or more instances former Japanese military or naval schools released by the Occupational Forces to the Imperial Japanese Government, and by them allocated to educational institutions, have been re-requisitioned for use by the Allied Forces.
