

I wish you would compare my prices with those of other dealers, so you will not feel that I want unreasonable prices. I have increased facilities for filling orders. I keep 75 to 85 hands at work, and they often fill fifteen hundred orders per day both large and small for mail, express, and freight. I solicit your orders as soon as possible after receiving this catalogue, so there will not be delay during the spring rush of orders. It would equalize the work better than to have a great rush all at once
