

Working on the Wikimedia CH IT Strategy

Preamble

In September 2022, Wikimedia CH finalized a discussion about the concrete need to have an IT Strategy plan that reflects Wikimedia CH's five-year Strategy.

At this stage, the WMCH CEO Jenny Ebermann and Ilario Valdelli, Innovation programme lead, involved Valerio Bozzolan in this processing, as IT infrastructure consultant for Wikimedia Switzerland since 2019, and as lead developer of a program that the community calls WMCH Tech Boost.

Expected results

The expected results will be the production of the IT Strategy document for Wikimedia CH, covering the five-year strategic plan. Including:

- coverage of Innovation Hub/Experimental Space
- coverage of Education
- coverage of GLAM
- coverage of Community Areas
- comprehensive of internal WMCH IT infrastructure
- IT risk assessment
- feedback and consensus from employees and involved people about the coverage of their area of knowledge of WMCH
- an overview document, easy to be updated
- release under a Free license compatible with Wikimedia (proposed: CC Zero)

Working Phases

Phase 0: Exploration

Definition of the scope and of the goals of the strategy.

Gather documentation materials, knowledge, also in terms of people to be involved, needed for the next phases. Meeting with IT suppliers.

This phase will also include an exploration of potential IT risks.

Input: WMCH Tech/Assistance/Consulting contracts, staff info, etc.

Output: first visualization of the current state, needs, challenges.

Working time: 2 days

Phase min. duration: 2 weeks

Phase 1: Survey to stakeholders and experts

Design and submit a survey to people in WMCH and people whose feedback may have benefits for WMCH IT Strategy. The survey helps in identifying needs, expectations and potential problems in the IT infrastructure.

Note: The questionnaire itself has no specific hosting cost: we already deployed a LimeSurvey instance, GDPR-friendly.

Input from WMCH: Share the survey to internal relevant users

Output: current status and collection of critical areas.

Working time: 4 days (setup survey, collect, process data).

Survey min. duration: 1 week

Phase 2: Interviewing relevant stakeholders and experts

Plan, do and rationalize interviews with relevant people involved in WMCH and people whose feedback may have benefits for WMCH IT Strategy.

The interviews are shaped following individual needs. Public testimonies are not generalized but appropriately cited in the output document, still protecting any requests for anonymization.

Input from WMCH: Contacts of already-known stakeholders and experts

Working time: 4 days

Phase min. duration: 2 weeks

Output: collection of interview cards and IT stakes.

Phase 3: Write-up and early RFC

Write the first structure of the document (majority of the invested time); land the document on a shared and collaborative platform (proposed: Meta-wiki) with a progress checklist of the current state to be observed on Wikimedia Phabricator;

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proactively invite early changes, contributions and review by people or experts not necessarily involved in step 1, as Request for Comments/Collaboration.

Working time: 4 days

Min. duration: 2 weeks

Output: IT Strategy structure (min 10 pages ~ 3200 words)

Phase 4: Peer review

The draft is submitted to 2/3 experts and to one person of Wikimedia CH for peer review and to identify weaknesses and inconsistencies.

Input from WMCH: 1 person for peer review

Output: Reviewed IT Strategy structure (min 10 pages ~ 3200 words)

Working time: 2 days

Phase min. duration: 1 week

Phase 5: Finalization

Finalize the document and bring it to the attention of WMCH for the final review.

Working time: 2 days

Input for WMCH: final review

Output: Final IT Strategy

Phase min. duration: 1 week

Time

In order to conclude the job in 3 months (12 weeks); after the confirmation of the start of work, is proposed to allocate 8 hours each Tuesday + 4 hours each Thursday, each week. This can be discussed by evaluating other timing or change in phases.

The expected end date without interruptions is December 2023, starting in October 2022. To consider local holidays and time breaks between interviews, we can agree on the postponement of the delivery date to January 2023.
