Silver medal issued in 1667 by the city of Amsterdam for the peace of Breda, July 31, 1667, between England, France and Denmark, by which New York was ceded to England. Very fine and rare. 44.
- 240 5 1730. Queen watering a plantation of palm trees, etc., the so called Jernegan or "Clatern medal." Silver; fine. 24.
