SUBJ : Peculiar Offence Relating to Illegal Receipt of Ration Rice.

We are hereby submitting a summary report on the case of arrest made by us for the offence on illegal receipt of rice ration by reporting the quantity of harvested rice in the 1947 cereal year far less than the actual quantity harvested in the year, thereby receiving rice ration by the farmers much earlier than the actual expiration of the time of self supplying by their reserve rice.

1. Address, Name and Age of the Subject

Yamaga Mura, Ikaruga gun, Kyoto fu,
Headman of the willage, SHIROHASE KITARO (59)

2. The Clue of Disclosure of this Offence

We set out for searching of this case by the informations received that, despite the willagers of Yamaga Mura having abundant reserve rice comparing with other villages, many farmers in that village are receiving rice ration.

3. Motive of the Offence

It was the custom at Yamaga Mura that the decision on the quantity of rice delivery quota and time limit for self supplying from reserve rice to be made by quite independent view of this village from the figures worked out from their estimated harvest of rice every year regardless of the figures shown by the local office and Food Stuff Office. Thus they acted in the same way on the harvested rice in the year 1947, and this resulted the offence in question.

4. Particulars of Offence

Allotted rice delivery quota for Yamaga Mura in the year (cereal year) of 1947 was 750 koku, against 465 koku in 1946 (including second delivery). In the year of 1947, by revised allotment of delivery quota the quantity decided was more than 60% of the quantity than that of 1946, though complete farmers alone are required to deliver. The Foodstuff Adjustment Commission of Yamaga Mura not accepting the estimated figures of their crop made by the Ikaruga Local Office 3624 koku (including 134 koku various cereals) viz. yield per tan 2.42 koku, production

by the complete farmers 2412 koku, alleging too excessive, and unjustifiable, they made their Foodstuff Control Ledger deciding their arbitrary estimation of rice crop for the year of 1947 with the figures worked out by the average yield per tan for past five years which has been used in Yamaga Mura independently as the base figure for deciding the delivery quota during these years. The above estimation made by Ikaruga Local Office is the base figures for deciding the official delivery quota of 1947.

According to their own estimation the crop of Yamaga Mura is 2750 koku whereas the figures decided by the Foodstuff Office is 3307 koku, the difference is 557 koku. The estimated crop, which was the basis of the delivery quota for this year is 3624 koku. Comparing this with their own estimation there is the difference of less 874 koku. The above difference of 874 koku would mean the difference of more than one (1) koku per one household for all 546 households in this village, thus resulting the incapability of the fulfillment of the delivery quota by the complete farmers alone. They therefore, resorted to the farmer methods of working out the delivery quotas on their own figures, and thus decided the time limit for self supply of their reserve rice for partial supply farmers and started distribution of rice ration.

In consequence of the above,

- (a) The quantity of reserve rice held by the complete farmers in Yamada mura far exceeds the quantity of legal reserve rice of the usual farmers.
- (b) Incomplete farmers, even they have quantity of reserve rice, they are to receive rice ration simply by reason of the arrival of time limit for self supplying of their reserve rice so arbitrary fixed by them. According to the calculation on the estimated quantity of rice crop by the Foodstuff Office there must be surplus rice in the Yamaga village more than one Koku per each household on average.

5. Dipsoal of this Case by this Police Station

Needless to say this is the violation of the Emergency Food Administration Law of vicious nature especially under present critical food condition of our country. In case of taking up this case officially, there arises the necessity of executing warrants as well as searching of all households in the village and seizure of all

surplus remaining foodstuff. This would naturally propagate the police control over all Yamaga mura which is secretly detrimental to peaceful village autonomy. To avoid the foolish practice the "remedy is worse than the evil" this station calling Adjustment Committee in the station and pointing out this case, persuaded them to rectify the whole of their doings by their free will under the sole responsibility of the headman of the village.

By this means surplus rice in the hands of the complete farmers saved rice ration 11.2 koku cancelling the distribution for incomplete farmers about 187.2 koku; total 198.4 koku of rice was floated.

6. Effect of this Measure

- (a) Caused self reflection and recognition of dignity of police control upon all villagers of Yamaga mura.
- (b) Waked up sense of responsibility on the part of the local office, and Foodstuff Offices upon the matters of future guidance of the local peoples and allotment of rice delivery quota and food distribution.
- (c) Entirely laying aside of the past acute utilitarianism for their own village and warned the necessity of square and just dealing upon the matters of the staple food. We firmly believe that the satisfactory results as above has been achieved in the whole area under the jurisdiction of this station.

SUBJECT : Request for Assistance in Obtaining Small Boats
for Water Police Patrol

TO : Commanding General
I Corps
APO 301.

1. Large scale illegal activity in fish and fishing supplies takes place in coastal waters, often in plain sight of land. The Economic Control Police have been almost powerless to interfere in this activity at sea, because they lack small boats in which to patrol coastal waters and to investigate suspicious activity observed from land.
2. Japanese police authorities have requested aid in obtaining small boats to supplement the water-patrol boats now in their hands. The situation and needs as reported by the Japanese, are shown by prefecture in Inclosure 1 to this letter.
3. It is desired that military government teams give assistance to the police in carrying out the following program:
 - a. In some instances boats held by the water police are beached for want of repairs. The chief reason given for failure to put these boats in condition is that prefectural governments must finance the repair out of the general prefectural fund and the prefectural authorities are reluctant to allot money for this purpose. Prefectural governors should be encouraged by military government teams to make this expenditure.
 - b. In some instances the Japanese say they can obtain needed boats through their own efforts. The police in each prefecture should be encouraged by military government teams to get these boats into operation without delay.
 - c. In other instances the Japanese report they are unable to obtain needed boats through their own efforts, and seek assistance of the military government authorities. This assistance can be rendered in many ways. Some suggested methods are: to encourage prefectural governors to obtain small boats for this purpose from stocks of boats confiscated by the courts when found engaging in smuggling and blackmarket activities; to encourage Occupational Forces to release small boats, held by them but not needed, to the local water police; to encourage

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prefectural governments to obtain for this purpose the release of former Japanese navy small boats known by them to exist and to be of a type adaptable to this use.

4. Inclosure 2 to this letter lists in detail boats now berthed in each prefecture. This list is not complete, but is inclosed as an aid to military government teams in the checking on small-boats now in the prefectures.

5. It is desired that military government teams inform this headquarters of difficulties encountered in carrying out the program of assistance recommended in this letter.

1. Reference is made to memorandum to the Japanese Government, file AG 386.6 13 February 48, CPC/LP SCAPIN 1858 13 February 48, subject: "Responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the Packaging Transfer and Deliveries of Property Being Restored to Claimant Nations Under the Restitutions Program" from General Headquarters Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.

2. The Japanese Government is directed to retribute to the Government of the Republic of China, Buddhist images and temple bells designated by the Japanese Government as having been removed from China and now looted property warehouses in Otaru, Fukuoka, Kyoto and Tokyo. Inclosed is a list of the items to be restituted including information as to the present location of each.

3. Subject property located in Otaru, Kyoto and Tokyo will be packed for shipment as freight, delivered at Maizuru and stowed aboard the SS "Yung Yuan" on or about 16 August 1948. Subject property located in Fukuoka will be packed for shipment as freight delivered to Mjoi and stowed aboard the SS "Yung Yuan" on or about 20 August 48. Each box will be marked as indicated in inclosure.

4. Mr. T.S. Wu has been designated by the Government of the Republic of China as the authorized agent to receive and give receipt for the subject property.

5. The Japanese Government is to designate by name an authorized representative to execute receipt forms and will notify general Headquarters Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers of his appointment prior to 16 August 48.

6. The inclosed receipt forms, consisting of the original and five (5) copies, are to be signed by the authorized representatives of the Government of the Republic of China and the Japanese Government and are to be distributed as follows:

2. Reference is also made to CPB No. 533, 7 May 1948, subject, "Reports on the Progress of Repair and Refitting of Restitution Vessels."

3. The Japanese Government is directed to sail the SS "Yung Yuan" from Maizuru, Japan, to Shanghai, China, via Moji, Japan, on or about 16 August 1948, for restitution to the Government of the Republic of China. Sailing dates from Maizuru and Moji are to be no later than 3 days after completion of loading the cargoes directed in references 1b through 1g above.

4. It will be the responsibility of the Japanese Government to fully fuel, water and provision the vessel prior to its final departure from Japanese waters.

5. Prior to the departure of the subject vessel from Malzuru, a representative of the Japanese Government will report to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, for final instructions regarding the restitution.

6. The inclosed receipt forms, and original and five copies, are to be delivered to the Captain of the SS "Yung Yuan," who has been designated the authorized representative of the Japanese Government to execute the receipt forms in its behalf. 1. A conference with the Kumano Chief of Police revealed that the information turned over to the Military Government Office in Kyoto was incorrect.

2. Mr. Ito, the president of the Kawakami Food Adjustment Committee, remarked in one of the meetings of the committee that it would probably be bad for the farmers of the town if they turned in over one hundred thirty percent of their potato quota, the quota would probably be raised next year.

3. When the chief of police heard of this he sent a letter to each Mayor under his jurisdiction asking them to encourage the farmers in their villages to turn in all over the quota that they could. The average turn in for Kumano Gun is 160% and the turn in for Kawakami-Mura, Mr. Ito's home, was 233%.
