XII. TACTICAL AND OPERATIONAL DATA. (Narrative and Comment).

Suspected anti-aircraft positions under trees along the southwest edge of YONTAN AIRFIELD, OKINAWA IS-LAND, were assigned as targets to the direct support group. Two divisions of VC-87 fighters fire-bombed the area, making seven of eight napalm bomb drops effective to burn out the target area which was approximately 400 feet in length.

Secondary targets including barracks and other buildings in the village of TOKESHI, north of YON-TAN field, were attacked by the third division, scoring three fire-bomb hits to burn the barracks and destroy several smaller buildings. Strafing produced fires in the villages of HANZO, KOKUDA, and SOBE.

In the hills northeast of YONTAN field, caves bearing evidence of recent activity were strafed.
