Lts. (jg) W. L. FITZSIMMONS AND G. A. BRAUN, USNR, piloted two Squadron PB4I-1P's from Iwo Jima over Kikai and Tokuno Islands in Anami Gunto in the Nansei Shoto, obtaining good vertical coverage of each from 18 000 ft. true. There was no enemy AA fire or other opposition.

The photo-Liberators left Central Field, Iwo, 0500 King and were over targets in excellent weather from 1130 to 1300 King, landing again at Iwo, 1600. FITZSIMMONS and BRAUN returned to Guam 4 April.
