Ince of more expensive foods, say. pecialists in the United States Department of Agriculture, and this very little difference whether breadstuffs are served in the form of bread or in the form of breakfast cereals, side dishes with meat, or desserts. A man engaged in moderate muscular work can profitably consume about three-quarters of a pound a day of breadstuffs in any one of these forms. This quantity is the equivalent of one poundthe average family this quantity is consumed and the deficiency is made up by the use of more expensive substance. Of course, bread alone is not sufficient for the maintenance of health, but from both an economical and a hygienic point of view should be used more extensively than it usually is.

In a new publication of the department, Farmers' Bulletin 807, detailed directions for the making of bread in the home are given, together with a number of convenient recipes for home-made biscuit, rolls and bread in which rice or potatoes are used with flour.
