Our Wide Experience enables us to secure for Florists and Dealers the very best quality of Bulbs, which we import direct from the most careful and experienced growers in Holland. Our French and Bermuda bulbs are selected with the greatest care.

Our Trade continues to grow steadily each year, thus showing that we are caring for the wants of our customers satisfactorily. Florists and Dealers who once use VICK QUALITY stock seldom after risk their success by purchasing elsewhere.

Our Prices are very reasonable for the quality of stock we offer. By reason of the immense quantity we import, we are able to offer the highest quality of stock at low prices.

Our Terms are liberal. To parties of approved credit we allow 60 days time, or 2 per cent. discount if paid in 10 days from date of invoice, or 3 per cent. if cash is sent with order. Orders from new or unknown customers should be accompanied by cash; or, if credit is desired, satisfactory reference. No goods will be sent C. O. D. unless a partial remittance is made as a guarantee that goods will be accepted. These prices are subject to change without notice.

Our Facilities are unsurpassed. With splendid freight and express accommodations we can handle orders rapidly. Nine railroads enter Rochester, whose numerous fast freight and express trains enable customers to secure their shipments promptly.

At prices here quoted we deliver all goods to the freight or express companies in Roch ester, with no charges for boxes, packing or carting. With our excellent equipment for shipping we can be depended upon to send out bulbs in good condition; after that our responsibility ceases.

Special Notice. Customers should give on every order, full name, postoffice, freight or express station, county and State; and also advise whether goods are wanted by express or freight. In the absence of such instructions we will ship according to our best judgment, but will not be responsible for the consequences. WE USUALLY SHIP BY EXPRESS, believing that course to be safer and more satisfactory. But sometimes, in the absence of instructions, we ship by freight, especially in cases of heavy shipments, to points easily reached. We have no fixed rule, however, and advise that customers give their preference.

A Final Request. Customers should advise whether they desire the varieties shipped when ready, or the entire order held until it can be shipped together. If not advised, we will ship when each kind of bulb is ready. The early Bulbs—Roman Hyacinths, Paper White Narcissus, Freesias, Candidum, Harrisii and Calla Lilies—can be furnished at once; nearly all of these have already arrived. Hyacinths, Tulips, Crocus, etc., in September; Lilies of our own growing can be furnished in October while most imported hardy lilies, Lily of the Valley etc. do not, as a rule arrive until late in October or November.

A WORD CONCERNING THE EFFECT OF THE EUROPEAN WAR ON OUR FALL BULB BUSINESS

We had our wholesale catalogue all ready to mail August first, but on account of the sudden upheaval in Europe and the paralysis of ocean traffic, we ordered the mailing stopped until more favorable conditions might prevail.

At last we have heard from most of our shipments, a large part of which are already on the water, and it now seems certain that we shall be in position to handle our regular fall trade in bulbs just the same as if no war in Europe had arisen. We have already received part of our bulbs and by the time this catalogue reaches your desk we will probably have had several more shipments. We have received our Pansy seed and all other varieties of flower seeds and seeds of perennials for summer and fall sowing so that these cannot possibly be a source of alarm.

On account of unusual conditions prevailing at the present time we respectfully request that you send your order as soon as possible. Even if you do not want the shipment until later on, it will be well to send your entire order and have the goods held until a specified time.

It is evident that there will be a heavy demand on our stock. Already we are receiving inquires, and even tentative orders, from seedsmen, nurserymen, and florists who have evidently purchased from traveling Dutchmen in this country, who on account of unprecedented condition of affairs, cannot reasonably be expected to fill their orders this year. So far as we are able, we desire to hold our stock for our regular customers, but it will be a benefit to all concerned if you will make up your order as complete as possible and send it along at an early date, no matter what you may have done in previous years.

In common with all other Americans we earnestly hope that peace may somehow be brought out of chaotic conditions which prevail abroad, and that the blessings of prosperity may abound as never before, not only in this country, but throughout the world.






