INFORMATION FOR TEACHERS.

1. Blank books for the order of text-books, text book records and check-books on State Dividend, must be secured from the State Treasurer, Dover, Del.
2. Copies of the School Register, book-labels, list of text-books, excuse cards, lists of children under the Compulsory Attendance Law, and blanks for reports under same, and pupils' Report Cards, must be secured from the County Superintendent.
3. Copies of School Law, Course of Study, High School Course of Study, Report on Attendance, blank form for teachers' Annual Report from the Commissioner of Education.
4. Teachers are especially urged to write either to their County Superintendent or to the Commissioner of Education for help in perplexing situations.
5. All candidates for any examination must hereafter be examined in the subject of Agriculture.
6. Teachers' Certificate provisions are printed fully on the last page of the School Register, accessible to every teacher, hence are not repeated here.
7. Legal Holidays in Delaware: January 1, February 12 and 22, May 30, July 4, 1st Monday in September, day of a general election, Thanksgiving, December 25. **The School Committee has the power to decide which of these shall be observed by closing the school.**
8. Questions and disputes about interpretation of School Law should be referred to the State Board of Education.
9. Traveling libraries may be secured for a school by writing to the State Library Commission, Dover.
10. The School Register must be kept for 20-day school months, regardless of basis of teacher's pay.

CERTIFICATION OF TEACHERS.

The examinations will be held on the same day in each county. The questions will be uniform for the state in the respective branches. Two days are taken to examine in all the branches, as follows:

ON THE FIRST SATURDAY OF APRIL, 8:30 a. m., these branches for:

PRIMARY AND KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATE: Reading, Writing, Spelling, Geography, History, U. S. Arithmetic.

LIMITED ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE: Reading, Writing, Spelling, Geography, History, U. S. Arithmetic, Constitutions of U. S. and Delaware.

LIMITED SECONDARY CERTIFICATE: Grammar, Spelling, English and American Literature, Rhetoric and Composition, Arithmetic, Algebra, Plane Geometry, School Management.

FOURTH SATURDAY OF APRIL, 8:30 a. m., these branches for:

PRIMARY AND KINDERGARTEN CERTIFICATE: Drawing, Grammar, Physiology and Hygiene, Primary Methods, School Management, Nature Study, Agriculture.

LIMITED ELEMENTARY CERTIFICATE: Drawing, Grammar, Physiology, and Hygiene, Primary Methods, School Management, Nature Study, Agriculture.

LIMITED SECONDARY CERTIFICATE: U. S. History, General History, Constitutions U. S. and Delaware, Hygiene, Physics, Physical Geography, Zoology or Botany or Chemistry, Secondary Methods of Teaching.

WHERE EXAMINATIONS WILL BE CONDUCTED:

New Castle County—School No. 1, 6th and French Streets, Wilmington.

Kent County—Dover High School, Dover.

Sussex County—High School, Seaford and Georgetown.

FOR COLORED TEACHERS: Examinations will be held on the Third Saturday of April, at 8:30 a. m., for

New Castle County—Howard High School, Orange Street above 12th, Wilmington.

Kent County—Colored School, Dover.

Sussex County—Public School, Greenwood.

RENEWAL OF TEACHERS' CERTIFICATES.

1. **PRIMARY AND KINDERGARTEN:** First issue good for 3 years; renewed by passing examination on three books from prescribed list in Pedagogy; renewal good for 3 years, and must be renewed every 3 years.
2. **LIMITED ELEMENTARY:** First issue good for 1 year; renewed by passing an examination on two books in Pedagogy from prescribed list; renewal good for two years; three renewals permitted.
3. **PERMANENT ELEMENTARY:** Permanent for five year periods; renewal by passing an examination on five books from the prescribed pedagogical list. (One or more books may be passed any year of the five covered by the certificate.)
4. **LIMITED SECONDARY:** First issue good for one year; may be renewed by passing an examination on two books from prescribed list; renewal good for five years; three renewals permitted.
5. **PERMANENT SECONDARY:** Permanent for five year periods; renewed by passing examination on five books from prescribed list of readings; must be renewed every five years. (Examinations on the books may be one or more in any year of the life of the certificate.)
6. **LIMITED NORMAL SCHOOL AND COLLEGE GRADUATE:** First issue good for one year; renewed upon a testimonial of successful teaching under the certificate; County Superintendent and Principal should certify to success, as well as School Commissioners; renewal good for two years; but one renewal permitted.
7. **PERMANENT NORMAL SCHOOL OR COLLEGE GRADUATE:** Permanent for five year periods; renewed upon passing an examination in five books from the prescribed list, or upon proof of having pursued five postgraduate courses at an approved Normal School or College. The postgraduate courses given by Pennsylvania Normal Schools will satisfy these requirements; must be renewed every five years.
8. **SPECIAL CERTIFICATES:** Issued in Vocal Music, Manual Training, Domestic Science, and so on; first issue good for three years; may be renewed by passing an examination on three books from prescribed list; must be renewed every three years.
9. All issues and all renewals of certificates shall be dated as of July 1 of the year of issue.

LEGAL AND STATE BOARD REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO NON-RESIDENT PUPILS IN APPROVED HIGH SCHOOLS.

(In effect 1916-1917.)

I. INFORMATION.

1. By Chapter 219, Volume 21, of the Laws of Delaware, provision is made to pay tuition, at the rate of twenty (\$0.20) cents for each day's attendance, for non-resident pupils in Approved High Schools.

2. Two hundred and fifty (250) non-resident pupils are allowed to each county each year, by this law.

3. The State Board of Education is authorized to fix requirements for an Approved High School, and to make rules and regulations governing the admission of non-resident pupils to such approved schools.

II. WHAT SHALL CONSTITUTE AN APPROVED HIGH SCHOOL, AS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

1. The school must be open 180 school days in the school year (Sept. to June.)

2. The teacher (or teachers) must hold a valid Secondary Teacher's Certificate, or a Normal School or College graduate's Teacher's Certificate.

3. After September, 1916, Approved High Schools shall be ranked and classified as follows:

3-A. **Twenty (20) Unit High Schools**, shall have four grades or classes, (Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh, Twelfth) and all the time of at least two fully qualified Secondary teachers shall be devoted to these four classes.

3-B. **Fifteen (15) Unit High Schools**, shall have three grades or classes, (Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh) and all the time of one qualified Secondary teacher and half of the time of another qualified Secondary teacher, shall be devoted to these three classes.

3-C. **Ten (10) Unit High Schools**, shall have two grades or classes (Ninth, Tenth) and all the time of one qualified Secondary teacher shall be devoted to these two classes.

3-D. No Approved High School may include Seventh and Eighth grade pupils unless one-half of the time of one additional teacher is provided for these two grades.

4. Each Approved High School must follow the State High School Course of Study and must use the text-books specified in the state's Approved List of High School Text-books.

III. REQUIRED REPORTS.

1. Within ten days after the opening of school (in the fall) the Principal of each Approved High School must report (upon the proper blanks) the names, etc., of all non-resident pupils admitted to the school. Similarly, until notified that the quota has been filled, any non-resident pupils admitted must be promptly reported to the Commissioner of Education, who will investigate and report upon the admissibility of such pupils.

2. By and with the consent of the State Board of Education, admissible non-resident pupils may be substituted during the year, after the quota has been filled, for non-resident pupils who have left school, but such substitutions must also be promptly reported.

3. Non-resident pupils leaving an Approved High School during the term, should be promptly reported to the Commissioner of Education, so that pupils on the waiting list in other schools may be admitted, if the Principal reporting the vacancy has no waiting list.

4. During the school year, each Principal of an Approved High School, shall report at least twice, upon the work, attitude and standing of each non-resident pupil in that school, from grades VII on up. Blank forms for this report are sent to the Principals.

5. At the close of the school year and before July 1, each Principal shall report to the State Board of Education, upon a blank form provided for the purpose, the total attendance in days of each non-resident pupil accepted as admissible by the Commissioner of Education. Along with this report of attendance there must be sent the Certificates of Admission presented by non-resident pupils when entering the school. The school district's receipt of tuition for non-resident pupils is computed from this report, therefore Principals should be careful to include the full attendance of each non-resident pupil. The total attendance for a pupil and his substitute may not aggregate more than the total number of school days in the term.

IV. ADMISSION TO AN APPROVED HIGH SCHOOL.

1. Annually in May a State examination is conducted to ascertain the fitness of candidates for High School attendance. The examination covers the work of Grade VI and below. Candidates may be admitted to the examination if they have a proper certificate from their teacher. The examinations are held in Approved High Schools under the direction of the County Superintendent. The questions are uniform over the entire State. To candidates who pass this examination with an average of 70 per cent. or over, the County Superintendent issues a Certificate of Admission. No non-resident pupils may be admitted to an Approved High School without such a Certificate of Admission (except as stated in following provisions).

2. Pupils properly in attendance of an Approved High School in any year may be admitted to an Approved High School next year or in subsequent years, if they earned promotion during their year of attendance of an Approved High School.

3. Pupils may not be admitted as state-tuition-paid pupils of an approved High School until they have satisfactorily completed all the grades maintained in the schools of their home or residence district.

4. As soon as the legal limit of 250 non-resident pupils in the Approved High Schools of any county has been reached, the Commissioner of Education is required to notify the Principals of Approved High Schools of the fact, and after the receipt of such notice no further pupils may be admitted as state-tuition-paid non-resident pupils for that year, except as substitutes for non-resident pupils already admitted who leave the school.

5. Pupils who have belonged to an Approved High School may be admitted to another Approved High School upon presentation of a statement of good standing in the school which they are leaving.

6. The Principal of an Approved High School may enroll the pupils admitted on Certificates into any grade (above VI) for which he decides they may be fitted, and is not limited or bound in any way by the certificate except as noted above.

7. It is by law within the discretion of the School Committee of each district to decide whether or not their grades are already full and to refuse to admit pupils for this reason.

8. For tuition in grades below the VIIth, each district fixes its own charge. For the other grades, the state payment of twenty (\$0.20) cents per day fixes the charge, except for the City of Wilmington.

V. CONTINUANCE IN APPROVED HIGH SCHOOLS.

1. Non-resident pupils whose work, or deportment, or attitude, or influence in any school are not satisfactory to teachers and Principal, and who do not become satisfactory after admonition, shall be reported to the Commissioner of Education, and may, by and with his advice and consent, have their names stricken from the list of non-resident pupils for whom the State pays tuition. Substitution of other properly qualified non-resident pupils in place of such pupils whose names have been stricken from the list is permissible, as provided in Part III, division 2.

2. Non-resident pupils who fail of promotion at the end of a year's work may not be re-admitted to the same grade or class next year as a state-tuition-paid non-resident pupil until after all pupils holding Certificates of Admission as non-resident pupils have been admitted, unless there be a reason and an excuse for the non-promotion which is entirely satisfactory to the Principal and the State Board of Education.

3. Non-resident pupils must be regular and continuous in attendance. Pupils may not enroll when school opens, be absent a month or two, and yet have their places held for them during such absence, while other pupils are thus prevented from being admitted as non-resident pupils.

4. Non-resident pupils who have been admitted to a system of schools in a grade below the Seventh, and are regularly promoted to the Seventh

grade, may be admitted to the State's non-resident list for that school, without examination, if the school be an Approved High School.

VI. ADMONITIONS TO NON-RESIDENT PUPILS.

1. Following the report upon non-resident pupils by the Principal to the Commissioner of Education as required according to Part III, Section 4, the Commissioner of Education is required to write a commendation or an admonition to pupils where either may be deserved or needed.

2. In harmony with special admonition, teachers and Principals will find their power and influence much enlarged and multiplied, if they too use their influence to arouse the indifferent pupils to a sense of the advantage which is offered them in a High School education for which the State is paying the bills. At this time the State is doing this for some of its pupils but not for all!

SCHOOL LIBRARIES.

Very few of our District Schools have even a small collection of books suitable for pupils to read. One of the many duties that rests upon the teacher is to **direct her pupils in the reading of good literature.** It would be well, if she could by some means purchase a few books to form the nucleus of a school library. This could be added to each year without much effort. The fact that the school has no books at all need not interfere with the wide-awake teacher. Fortunately, the State Library Commission of Delaware has a number of Traveling Libraries which can be loaned to any school, college or seminary, upon application of the Teacher or Principal and his agreement that the rules of the Commission will be observed. Each of these libraries contains about fifty carefully selected books, half or more of them especially suited to school children. Any of our teachers may have the loan of one of these libraries for three months with privilege of renewal. Transportation, except local carriage, is free.

TRAVELING LIBRARIES LAST YEAR.

(Excerpt from Report.)

"Almost no man, woman or child is working at a job about which he or she could not learn much of value from some book. The lawyer and the doctor have always found it necessary to read constantly in order to do their work well. The teacher and the minister have always found books and periodicals necessary. We of this generation are discovering that it is also true that every farmer, mechanic and housewife can do his or her work better by reading.

"Delaware is in the front rank of states which aim to place books within the reach of all their inhabitants, by means of traveling libraries, book-wagons and parcel post service. These books and this equipment belong to the people of the state, and it is the purpose of the Delaware Commission to see that no person in the state, whether he lives in city, village or on a farm, is without the books which he needs, whether for inspiration and help in his work, or for help in his leisure moments.

"The traveling libraries are collections of books which are sent out from Dover in stout, hinged boxes, circulating free of charge. They are made up from 35 to 50 of the best popular books both for grown-ups and children, in stories, history, travel, biography, science and literature. They are sent to schools, Sunday Schools, granges, or any group of people willing to be responsible for their safe return. Application for a traveling library should be addressed to the State Library Commission, Court House, Dover, Delaware.

"In order to serve those who cannot conveniently use the traveling libraries, the Commission sends book-wagons to visit farms, thus carrying books directly to the doors of those living at a distance from others. These wagons are in charge of women who become greatly interested in fitting the books to the needs of the farmer or his child, and delightful personal relations are often established between the "book-wagon lady" and the farm-dwellers.

"In New Castle County there are three book-wagon routes starting from Townsend. In Kent county there are six, three from Dover, one from Kenton, and two from Felton. Sussex county has five routes—Delmar, Laurel, Lowe's Cross Roads, Millsboro and Staytonville.

"Books will also be sent by parcel post to any individual studying a special subject.

"Apply to the State Library Commission, Court House, Dover, Delaware."

DELAWARE COLLEGE

Delaware College, the State College for men, was founded in 1833; the Women's College of Delaware, the State college for women, affiliated with Delaware College, was founded in 1914. These dual colleges are owned and controlled by the State, and are supported conjointly by the State, Federal Funds and donations from Alumni and other friends.

Delaware College has the following departments of instruction:

1. **Arts and Science**, a four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science.
2. **Agriculture**, a four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science.
3. **Engineering**, Civil, Electrical, Mechanical and Chemical, four years' courses, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Engineering.
4. **Education**, a four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science. This course is especially designed to prepare students for teaching in high schools and for principalships.

Tuition is free to all Delaware students.

The following courses of study are offered by the Women's College of Delaware:

1. **Arts and Science**, four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science.
2. **Education**, four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Education.
3. **Home Economics**, four years' course, leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Home Economics.

Also a two years' course in Education or Home Economics, leading to a certificate, but not to a degree. Students of sufficient maturity who have not completed a regular high school course will be allowed to take the two years' course in Education or Home Economics, provided they can satisfy the Entrance Committee that they have had adequate preparation.

It is desired that every candidate for admission to either of the colleges shall have completed a four-year high school course of study.
