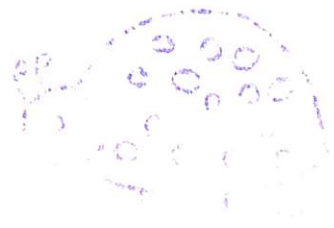
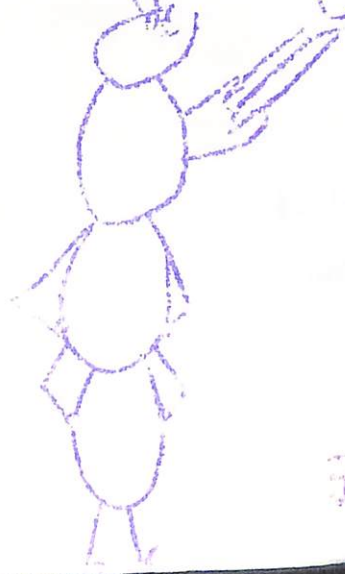

Their parents patiently chauffeured them back and forth, washing out the paint from their clothes and taking the splinters out of their hands.
