The Bark of England, the usual dividend of four per cent for ex months was voted, on the report of the Directors. In answer to inquiries made, the governor stated, that the earnings of the six months hill short of the dividend by the sum of £19,000, and in the preceding six months, £10,000; but that the directors thought that in consideration of the large capital of the bank, upwards of £14,000,000, and that circumstances might occur which will enable them to continue the dividend at the same rate, they thought it fair to take a larger period of time to determine whether it would be necessary to reduce it.

In answer to other inquiries it was stated, that the losees of the bank some years ago, by the forgeries of Fauntlerroy, amounted to the sum of £300,000, and that recently a compromise had been made with the partners of Fauntlerry, by which they had paid the bunk, in lieu of all claims upon it, 25 per cent of the smeant of their loss, or £35,000. This payment was mot included in the dividend, which was independent of it, but was carried to the fund set apart for meeting losses, from which it seems the whole loss of £36,000 had been deducted, leaving it a minus quantity.
