MUNICIPAL SOLONS IN SHORT SESSION

FINISHED BUSINESS IN LESS THAN AN HOUR

Number of Communications About Inadequate Drainage—City Engineer's Report and Trio of Motions.

Something went smash at the meeting of the city council last night. It was a record. The municipal legislators were in their seats exactly forty-five minutes when the motion to adjourn was put and carried. The time was phenomenal, and will doubtless not be equalled this term.

After the usual formalities a communication was read from Drake, Jackson & Helmecken, on behalf of the Donald Fraser estate, James Bay, regarding the appointment of an arbitrator in the matter of the expropriation of lot 1, block 70.

Frank Page, clerk of the police court and secretary of the board of police commissioners, communicated the application of the chief of the board, for detectives' winter clothing and constables' shoes and trousers. Referred to the finance committee for report.

Sidney Wilson drew attention to the bad condition of Michigan street in front of his property, which lacked adequate drainage, causing water to accumulate. Referred to the city engineer.

Sarah A. Smith asked permission to move her house on Dallas road to another lot, a short distance away. Referred to city engineer and building inspector for report.

F. Elworthy, secretary of the Victoria, B. C. Board of Trade, reported that the 14,000 copies of the pamphlet, Victoria, Past and Present, had been nearly all distributed.

Ald. Williams held a contrary opinion, referring to the excellence of the idea and the fact that the board were willing to meet the council half way. He wanted the communication referred to the finance committee for report.

The amendment was lost and Ald. Stewart's motion carried.

J. F. Sprinkling accepted the council's award of \$100 in compensation for injuries sustained by him through an accident to a horse reel while en route to a fire. Filed.

Alex. Smith directed attention to defective drain in the vicinity of his premises on Michigan street, which sadly needed remedying. Referred to the city engineer for report as to cost.

the building on the northwest corner of Port and Douglas streets. The report was adopted. The market superintendent reported receipts for the past month of \$129,000. Received and filed.

Marian Lee and eight others petitioned for a sewer on Rupert and Collinson streets, from Humboldt to Vancouver, a length of 900 feet. Ald. Cameron urged that the petition be referred to the city engineer for report as to cost and also for an alternative scheme comprehending drainage.

The standing committee of finance recommended the appropriation of \$3,655.95. Adopted. The same committee also recommended the appropriation of \$33.40 on the Point Ellice Bridge by-law. Adopted.

Ald. Williams's motion providing for the appointment of an arbitrator to act on behalf of the city in determining the value of lot 1, block 70, James Bay, was carried, E. Crow Baker being appointed arbitrator.

Leave was granted Ald. Beckwith to introduce the annual and formal municipal election by-law. This permits those who have not paid their taxes to vote at the municipal elections.

Ald. Cameron's motion that tenders be called for printing and binding the municipal voters' list, 1902, was carried and the council adjourned.
