



FERTILIZERS MAKE FLOWERS GROW AND BLOOM

Most annual flowers, due to their short season of growth and profuse bloom, are heavy feeders and require an abundance of a quick-acting fertilizer. Nitrate of Soda and Sheep Manure are particularly adapted for this class of plants. The Sheep Manure should be applied at the time of planting; the Nitrate of Soda several times during the season. The perennial plants are slower growers and for that reason the less active fertilizers, such as Bone-Meal and our Special Garden Fertilizer, meet their requirements. Either should be applied at time of planting and supplementary applications should be made during the life of the plant. For prices see page 51.

ANISE

(Pimpinella anisum.) Annual, 12 to 18 inches tall; chiefly grown for aromatic seeds used in flavoring. (Not the same as Florence Fennel which is sometimes called sweet Anise.) Pkt. 5 cts., 1 oz. 25 cts., 1/4 lb. 75 cts. BASIL . SWEET



Table Beets

Seed should be sown at the rate of one ounce to 100 feet of row. The rows should be spaced 18 to 24 inches apart. Work the soil well and cover the seeds about an inch deep. A rich sandy loam is most favorable, but nearly all types of soil will produce beets if sufficiently fertilized and properly tilled.

When the seedlings are about an inch tall it is well to thin them to about one-half inch apart.





Cauliflower



Early maturing varieties of plants are less subject to injury from the caterpillars. The dust should be applied as soon as silk forms on the developing ears. It may be necessary to make several applications, as the ears do not all develop at the same time.



Onions are very hardy, and the seeds will germinate in cool weather. They can be safely planted just as soon as the soil can be prepared. 



Plant diseases are many kinds. Some, such as mildew, leafspot and rust attack leaves. Others, as fire blight, damage branches and stems of plants. Some, such as root rot, waylay the plant at the roots. Some diseases such as mosaic seem to disturb plant life processes in some way, no one is sure as to just how. These diseases are spread by various agencies as

Insects are of two general kinds, chewing and sucking. The first, such as leaf eating beetles, grasshoppers and caterpillars, eat tissues or leaves and are controlled by a stomach poison applied to the plants. The most satisfactory poisons are lead arsenate, calcium arsenate or Paris Green.

Sucking insects pierce the leaves or other covering and suck the plant juices from within, so they must be killed by some contact poison which kills by its burning action, poisoning thru the breathing apparatus, or, by suffocation. Among these insects are thrips, aphids, scales and mealy bug. The chief contact sprays are nicotine sulphate, nicotine dust, pyrethrum powder, dusting sulphur, lime sulphur, oil emulsoil, wind, insects, contact, seed, tools, shoes of the gardener and also birds.

Some of the better known ways of controlling various diseases, depending upon their characteristics, are by spraying, dusting, seed treatment, soil disinfection, rotation, planting on new and clean ground, breeding resistant strains and destroying infected portions or crop residues.
