

retain the same reading, transposing the words *πείσας* and *ὑμᾶς* variously in accordance with different manuscripts, none of which are of the highest authority. The last words are interpreted, whatever order is followed, *who persuaded you to abandon the Phocians and Thermopylae?* There is no great difficulty in applying this to the inaction of the Athenians at the time of the ratification of their treaty with Philip in 346 B. C., when Philip was marching upon their friends, the Phocians. Demosthenes had just referred (§ 30) to his own vigorous attempts to rouse the Athenians to action at that time:—*προῦλεγον καὶ διεμαρτυρούμην καὶ οὐκ εἴων προέσθαι Πύλας οὐδὲ Φωκέας*,—a passage to which the corruption of § 30 in the inferior MSS. is perhaps due.

But in the passage from § 35 (quoted above) the word *ὑμᾶς* is omitted in the best two MSS. (Σ. and Aug. 1); and in Σ., whose single authority ought to be above appeal in such a case, we have *ποιήσας* substituted for *ὑμᾶς*, the order being *τις ὁ Φωκέας πείσας καὶ Πύλας ποιήσας προέσθαι*. In Σ. we have also *ἐπαναμνήσκεσθαι* for *ἐπαναμνῆσαι*. In Voemel's larger edition of the public orations of Demosthenes (*Demosthenis Contiones, Graece et Latine*, Halis Saxo-num, 1857) we find both these corrections adopted from Σ.; but the translation shows that the editor still retains the interpretation of the old text, considering the rejected *ὑμᾶς* as still understood with both participles. He translates: *unusquisque vestrum, licet probe gnarus, tamen etiam revocet velim sibi in memoriam, quis suaserit ut Phocenses, quis fecerit ut Pylas proieceritis.* Westermann in his school edition adopts the same text, but has no note to show that he suspects the common interpretation. It would hardly have occurred to any one who was not familiar with the ordinary reading and interpretation to translate *τις ὁ Φωκέας πείσας καὶ Πύλας ποιήσας προέσθαι* in any other way than, *who was it who persuaded the Phocians and caused them to abandon Thermopylae.* A slight reference to the circumstances of Philip's passage of Thermopylae will show that nothing else could have been meant by Demosthenes. The orator tells us (Fals. Leg. § 58, p. 359) that, when the embassy reached Athens, Philip had already presented himself at Thermopylae and was making promises to the Phocians who held the pass, in the hope of being admitted without opposition. The Phocians put no faith in Philip's promises, but sent to Athens for advice. Their ambassadors were present in the very Athenian assembly in which Aeschines made his pretended disclosures of Philip's real intentions towards the Phocians, and they

returned in the full belief that Philip would pass Thermopylae as their friend. ‘*Ὕγοντο, οὐδὲ εἰ δεκάκις Φιλιππος αὐτὸν ἔξηπάτα, οὐδέποτ’ ἀντούς γε Ἀθηναίων πρέσβεις Ἀθηναίους ἔξαπατάν τολμῆσαι, ἀλλ’ εἴναι ταῦτ’ ἀληθῆ ἢ οὗτος ἀπήγγελε πρὸς ὑμᾶς, καὶ τοῖς Θηβαίοις ἥκειν οὐχ αὐτοῖς ὅλεθρον.*’ (Fals. Leg. § 53.) On their arrival the pass was surrendered to Philip by a regular convention, and all the cities in Phocis were surrendered peaceably into his hands. The following passages from Demosthenes (Fals. Leg. §§ 61 – 63) will remove all doubts:—

‘*Ἐτι τούνν τὸ μηδεμίαν τῶν πόλεων τῶν ἐν Φωκεῦσιν ἀλῶναι πολιορκίᾳ μέγιστον ἔστι σημείον τοῦ διὰ τούτους πεισθέντας ὡς ὑπὸ τοῦ Φιλίππου σωθήσονται ταῦτα παθεῖν· οὐ γὰρ ἐκείνον γε ἡγνόουν.*

‘*Ακούετε, ὁ ἄνδρες Ἀθηναῖοι. ὁ μολογία Φιλίππου καὶ Φωκέων, φησίν, κ. τ. λ. Καὶ πάλιν παραδοῦναι δὲ τὰς πόλεις Φωκέας φησὶ Φιλίππῳ, οὐχὶ Θηβαίοις οὐδὲ Θετταλοῖς οὐδὲ ἀλλῷ οὐδενί. διὰ τί; ὅτι Φιλίππος ἀπηγγέλλετο πρὸς ὑμᾶς ὑπὸ τούτου (i. e. Aeschines) ἐπὶ τῇ τῶν Φωκέων σωτηρίᾳ παρεληλυθεῖν. τούτῳ δὴ πάντ’ ἐπίστενον, καὶ πρὸς τοῦτον πάντ’ ἐσκόπουν, πρὸς τούτον ἐποιοῦντο τὴν εἰρήνην.*

2. In the same oration, § 27 (p. 72, 12), we find in most editions this passage: *ἀλλ’ ὑμεῖς οἱ καὶ συνιέντες αὐτοὶ καὶ τῶν λεγόντων ἀκούοντες ἡμῶν ὡς ἐπιβουλεύεσθε, ὡς περιστοιχίζεσθε, ἐκ τοῦ μηδὲν ἥδη ποιῆσαι λήσεθ, ὡς ἐμοὶ δοκεῖ, πάνθ’ (πάντα ταῦτα ορ πάντα) ὑπομείναντες.* Here Σ. reads *ὅστε μηδὲν ἥδη ποιεῖν λήσεσθ, κ. τ. λ.* No editor, however, has adopted this reading, except Voemel in the Halle edition above mentioned, and he gives the passage an interpretation which we think the words will hardly bear. We venture, therefore, to call attention to it as more Demosthenic than the common reading. It seems hardly possible that any one can have been deterred from accepting this reading by any difficulty in interpreting *ὅστε μηδὲν ἥδη ποιεῖν.* We need merely refer to PLAT. Gorg. 479 C: *πᾶν ποιοῦσιν, ὅστε δίκην μὴ διδόναι, they do everything, to avoid suffering punishment, where ὅστε μὴ διδόναι is almost equivalent to the final clause, ὥν μὴ διδῶσιν.* The whole sentence will thus mean: *but you,— who not only understand for yourselves, but also learn from us orators, how you are plotted against, how you are encompassed by toils,— in order to avoid immediate action, will, it seems to me, insensibly submit to everything.*

We should hesitate to accept the form *λήσεσθ*, for *λήσεθ*, with the participle without better authority, especially as *Ω* (the abbreviation for *σθ*) and *θ* would be so easily confused. Even if we admitted the middle form here, we should consider it as equivalent to *λήσετε* in its

neuter sense; Voemel, however, translates *λήσεσθε πάνθ' ὑπομείναντες*, *immemores eritis omnia vos tolerasse*, and gives the following note: *oblivio priorum malorum praecipuum imprudentiae et desidiae signum est.* But the aorist participle with *λανθάνω*, *τυγχάνω*, and similar verbs, seems to have no more force as a past tense than the aorist subjunctive or imperative does; see *εἰλαβεῖσθαι μὴ λήσετε διαφθαρέντες*, *to take care lest you shall find yourselves insensibly corrupt*, PLAT. Gorg. 487 D; *βουλοίμην ἀν λαθεῖν αὐτὸν ἀπελθόντι*, *to get off without his knowing it*, XEN. An. I. 3, 17; *τοὺς ἀνθρώπους λήσομεν ἐπιτεσόντες*, An. VII. 3, 43. With such verbs the present participle is used in its ordinary sense, denoting a continued action, while the aorist expresses a momentary act coincident with that of the verb, and the perfect seems to have been used when a special reference to the past was required in the participle. Thus, *ἔτυχον ὅπληται καθεύδοντες*, *soldiers happened to be sleeping*, THUC. IV. 113; *στρατὶ ἔτυχε παρελθοῦσα*, *an army happened to march*, VI. 61; *ἔτύγχανον οἱ στρατηγοὶ ἀρτι παρειληφότες τὴν ἀρχήν*, *the generals happened to have just assumed their authority*, VI. 96; *έάν τις ἡδικηκώς τι τυγχάνῃ τὴν πόλιν*, *if it shall happen that any one has done any wrong to the city*, DEM. Cor. § 123. So *λήσετε πάνθ' ὑπομείναντες* will not mean, *you will forget that you have endured everything*, but *you will insensibly (before you know it) submit to everything*.
