Because I had difficulty in making a living around the middle of July 1949 I went to the house of Kumagai (Tony) who has been working for the P.X. of 8th Unit asking him to help me in making a living that month by sharing with me cigarettes or something which were on sale at the P.X. Kumagai said to me that he understood what I meant, and that he would telephone to Sgt. Backiel. Somedays later Sgt. Backiel brought me ten cartons of cigarettes. Around August 20, I requested Kumagai once more. Kumagai (Tony) telephoned to Sgt. Backiel this time too and Sgt. Backiel brought me ten cartons.

Out of those twenty cartons (each containing ten packs, I sold eighteen or nineteen cartons to a woman aged about twenty-five in two times. First, around the end of July I sold ten cartons for ¥12,000 or ¥13,000 at my house. Second, around August 20, I sold eight or nine cartons at the rate of ¥1,200 or ¥1,300 per carton at my house.

Since about April 1947 I had been working in the P.X. of the 64th Artillery and since about January 1948 when it was united with the 8th unit I have been working in the P.X. 8th unit. In the P.X. they called me 'Tony'.

About the beginning of July 1949 OKAMOTO Reiko, the girl-friend of M.P. Sergeant Backiel called at my house and asked me to give Backiel some cartons of cigarettes more than ration because both the sergeant and her smoke cigarettes.

Later about the end of July 1949 sergeant Backiel came to the P.X. He handed over three coupons to me and asked for the ration of cigarettes. I sold him all nine (9) cartons including the previous week's ration and the next week's ration (3 cartons a week). In order to enable him to use the coupons once more again if he wanted to I punched the coupons with the smaller punch because it gives only an indistinctive cut. About twenty five (25) days after I sold him nine (9) more cartons in the same way.

As I remember, around summer 1948 when a sukiyaki party was held at the house of sergeant Mack Christine (spelling uncertain) his wife asked me to make ready a portable cooking furnace, a sukiyaki pan, coal and other utensils. I bought those items for her and I also attended the sukiyaki party. At about 7:00 or 8:00 p.m. when I was going home, she gave me various kinds of soap, about 20 cakes in all, saying, "I've no Japanese money at hand". As I was intoxicated, she put the soap in a box.

On my way home, I wanted to drop in a cafe and go out on the street. At the sight of a M.P. jeep coming down, I hid myself by the side of a measure store. As I was so hurried that I dropped all the soap from the box on the street. I picked up the soap in

a hurry. A jeep came from the direction of the house of Mack Christine. Requesting the driver of the jeep, I got him to drive me to my house. As I felt so great fear, I got back to the house of Mack Christine to return the soap. Mrs. Christine, intoxicated said, "Your family needs them" and pushed four or six cakes of the soap into my pocket. My wife and children had been using the soap until lately.

About the middle or the end of July 1949 above mentioned OKAMOTO, Reiko wanted me to lend her a typewriter if there was any surplus one in the P.X. because she was going to practice typewriting. As the owner of the typewriter used by me at the time was unknown, I told her that the typewriter used by me was broken and that I would lend it if sergeant Backiel came to borrow it. Furthermore I promised with OKAMOTO Reiko that the typewriter should be lent to her for about a week on the condition that she fixed it at her own expense. About a week or four or five days after sergeant Backiel came to borrow the typewriter. I lent it to him at the office of the P.X.

Paragraph 36, Circular Number 8, GHQ, SCAP, 31 March 1949 pertaining to Self-Incrimination has been read and explained to me by Fumio Tamamura whom I know to be a interpreter, 22d CID, and I understand that it is not necessary for me to make a statement which might tend to incriminate me.

It was around October 1947 when I came to know Mr. Bono. I think it was around November when I, Tamabayashi, interpreter of Mr. Bono, and Mr. Bono talked together as I was requested by Tamabayashi to talk with Mr. Bono about Tamabayashi's personal problem. At this time Tamabayashi brought with him a case of beer in a paper box and about 3 pounds beef saying that he liked to talk with each other while drinking. I did not know whether he bought them himself, but it was for the first time for me to see canned beer. Because I did not like beer I joined drinking with them bringing my own "Sake". I thanked Mr. Bono for coming to Japan for occupation from far away reminding of my son who died in the battle. It was around 11 p.m. after the party was over. Mr. Bono came to my house to pass time five or six times since then. I think it was around March last year that Tamabayashi came to me asking me to lend him about ¥10,000 saying that Mr. Bono ran out of money because he lost in gambling. I was rather surprised to hear this and told him to bring ¥5,000 with him because I had only ¥5,000. Tamabayashi received it saying that he would not fail in paying it back on the 10th of that month, his pay day. When I urged him to pay it back because

he did not carry out his promise on the 10th of that month, he brought me three cartons of cigarettes, each containing 10 packs, saying that he was sorry in putting up them instead of the money. So I was obliged to receive them. I do not remember well, but it was around June last year that he came asking me to lend money under the same excuse as before. I lent him ¥3,000 saying to him that it was all I had. He brought me two cartons of cigarette in stead of money this time too. I was obliged to receive them.

I think it was in the middle of September that he came asking me to lend him ¥10,000 and promised that he would return it in cash without failure. I lent him ¥5,000 because it was all I had. He did not return it until October, so I pressed him to return it many times. I think it was at the end of October when he brought me three cartons of cigarette and asked me to receive them saying that he would remain grateful to me for my cares toward him and that he would someday pay back my kindness when he made lots of money. I said to him that I was afraid that the cigarettes which I kept as they were would get rotten, but I was obliged to receive them after all because he had no money.

Since then he has not come. I heard that he was adopted by somebody.

The girl friend of Bono, named Machiko, came to my house with Bono four or five times, so I knew her. In October last year, I think, she suddenly came asking me to lend her rice because she ran short of rice. I lent her five shu rice though I also had not so much rice on the condition that she would return the rice. At this time I specially stressed on returning the rice, not other material, and sent it to Machiko's. When I urged her many times to return it, she came saying that she wanted me to receive Occupation Forces soap instead of rice because she had no rice and left my house leaving seven soaps behind.

As to the beer which you inquire I say that Tamabayashi used to bring one or two cases of beer by jeep every time Mr. Bono had party in my house, so I think they have had more than ten cases of beer in five or six times taking into consideration the beer the interpreter had.

Tamabayashi used to bring beer by jeep and place them in the room of my house about an hour before the party. I think the jeep driver knows about this fact too. They had party in my house five or six times, but I never have received a penny from them except three canned candies which Mr. Bono gave me and a carton of cigarettes and a candy wrapped with paper which Machiko gave me. But I do not have any relation with them because Tamabayashi and Mr. Bono have not come to my house this year.

No threats or promises of any kind have been made in order to get me to make this statement. I have signed or initialed each page and all corrections or erasures that have been made in this statement.
