MEMORANDUM FOR: JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

SUBJECT: Transportation Permit

1. Reference is memorandum for the Japanese Government from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, AG 387.6 (22 Jul 47) REP, (SCAPIN 1751), 22 July 1947, subject: Responsibility of the Japanese Government for the Packaging, Transfer, and Delivery of Equipment and Records Allocated to Claimant Nations under the Reparations Program, relative to the Japanese Government's responsibility in the supplying of dunnage, loading and stowage of equipment aboard recipient nations' ships.

NARRATIVE REPORT: Transportation Control of Critical Materials

REPORT PERIOD : January

PREFECTURE : Kyoto

1. Inspections were made from this office together with the Economic Police on 29 January 1948 on Nijo and Umekoji Railroad Stations, Kyoto City. All freight cars in Niji Station at the time of the inspection were checked for transportation certificate and goods involved. Two (2) carloads of fertilizer (ammonia sulphate) of 15 and 10 ton each shipped by Osaka Fertilizer Kodan from Ichiba Station, Osaka Pref. to Shuzan Kodan, Kyoto Pref. were found without transportation certificates. Order was given to the Station Master to hold fertilizer as it is until further notice. Investigation was made immediately by the Economic Police and upon investigation it was learned that though the transportation certificates were issued by the Osaka Fertilizer Kodan for shipment but failure by the Ichiba Station, Osaka Pref. to attach the certificates to the cars before departure and instead the certificates were sent direct to Shuzan Kodan. The certificates were obtained from the Shuzan Kodan and checked before releasing the fertilizer. Also at this station, one carload of sweet potatoes (179 sacks) shipped by the Chito-Cho Farmers Ass., Tottori Pref. from Chito Station to the Kyoto Food Eidan, Kyoto Pref. was found without any certificate. Since the shipment was for the Kyoto Food Eidan permission was granted to unload and deliver it to the Food Eidan. Investigation of this through telephone call revealed that the transportation certificate was overlooked and it came to the Station Master's attention that the certificate was not attached with the load until after train departed so they had it sent on the passenger train. The certificate was not received at Nijo Station until the following morning. Warning was given that there would absolutely be no reoccurrence of this nature and that careful check will be made for transportation certificates hereafter.

2. On same day from 1800 to 2400 hours five check points were set-up on the main roads leading into and out of the Kyoto City. The check points were set-up at the following places: (1) Jujo Street on the Kyoto-Osaka Highway, (2) Kangetsu Bridge in Fushimi, (3) Hanazono Bridge on Ohara Road, (4) Keage on Keichi-Otsu Highway, and (5) Kitagihara on the Sanin Highway. Police were stationed at each check point to check all trucks coming into or leaving the city. No violations were noticed nor reported during this checking hours.
