1. G-2 has reviewed the proposed changes in allocation of staff responsibilities for Paragraphs 11, 12, and 13 of JCS Directive Serial No. 89.

2. Reference proposed change in allocation of responsibility for Paragraph 11, subject directive, although the dissolution of military organizations, affiliates, clubs, etc., is the responsibility of Government Section under SCAPIN 548, surveillance of Japanese organizations to determine which are engaged in propaganda for militarism and ultra nationalism is a practical intelligence function of prior investigation.

3. Reference proposed change in allocation of responsibility for Paragraph 13 of subject directive, in every case the act of exclusion of individuals or groups from Government service or public office should be based on the Counter Intelligence investigation, surveillance, and concurrence.

4. It is therefore recommended that G-2/CIS and Government Section be allocated joint responsibility for that portion of Paragraph 11 which SRS proposes to reallocate to Government Section. It is further recommended that G-2/CIS be allocated joint responsibility with Government Section and CI&E for Paragraph 13 of subject directive.

1. The Chief of Staff in conference 30 August 1948 raised the question of distribution to the Department of the Army of SRS's Booklet "Allocation of Staff Responsibilities for Execution of JCS Directives to the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers."

2. As indicated on covering memorandum of Booklet, the approved distribution is limited to SCAP (as is G-3's corresponding Booklet). The Department of the Army was, after consultation with Lt. Col. Sackton, SGS, intentionally omitted from distribution because:

a. SCAP must presume that all the data contained in the Booklet, is available in Washington, with the exception of the internal assignment of staff responsibilities under column "Staff Action"; the latter is a matter of concern only to SCAP.

b. The forwarding to Washington of the Booklet might result in a restriction on SCAP's parenthetical interpretations listed in "Subject" column. Furthermore, ANNEX II of the Booklet, which lists nonserially numbered documents, might cause some confusion and unnecessary correspondence as well as raise the question of full-compliance by the U. S. Government with provisions of par (1), below, because:

(1) The terms of reference of the Far Eastern Commission specify that all directives to SCAP will be filed with the Far Eastern Commission (and are given a serial number).

(2) The JCS papers and radios, the wording of which makes them unquestionably directives to SCAP and which have not been filed with the Far Eastern Commission (with exception to radic WX 89117, which was filed with the Far Eastern Commission but not assigned a serial number) are listed in ANNEX II of the JCS Booklet.

3. In view of the above, especially par 2b, it is not believed desirable to place Washington on distribution of the subject Booklet.

4. Decision is requested as to whether it is desired to:

a. Continue limiting distribution to SCAP, or

b. Add Washington to the distribution list.

1. Transmitted herewith, in compliance with suggestion of the Secretary, General Staff, is a recommended check sheet charging SRS with the preparation of a SWNCC-SANACC Booklet. (See Inclosure 1).

2. The major time-consuming factors in preparation of a SWNCC-SANACC Booklet are: (1) Collection of all SWNCC-SANACC documents (whether in SWNCC-SANACC, JCS or radio form); (2) Correlation of the documents with other SWNCC-SANACC documents, JCS Serials and FEC papers to present the accurate status of the listed documents (i.e., whether amended, rescinded, superseded; whether issued by JCS as unilateral US Directive; whether introduced into the FEC for consideration; or whether adopted by the FEC as a policy and transmitted by JCS as a Serial directive); (3) Determining the radio numbers corresponding to SWNCC-SANACC documents; and (4) Determining the purpose for which the documents have been transmitted to SCAP (i.e., whether directives, whether sent for "information," "information and guidance," "guidance," etc.). (See comments on recommended format, Inclosure 1 to Inclosure 1).

3. The Booklet when once established must be maintained current, accurate and complete to be of value. In this connection, attention is invited to the current unsatisfactory condition of SCAP instructions to the Japanese Government as evidenced in the SRS study now in the office of the Chief of Staff. This condition resulted primarily from a failure to recognize the need of, and provide for this essential "follow-through" of a system once established.

4. The volume of documents, their correlation, and the number of problems to be resolved with the special staff section in this study will be several times greater than were involved in the preparation of the JCS Booklet. In the latter study the exhausting research, exacting analysis, and reduction of differences of opinion with the special staff section required the equivalent of two months full-time effort by the Chief Historian, the Cataloger, and the Assistant Executive-Personnel Coordinator over a period of more than five months. Although more than 80 hours overtime were put in by other personnel on the normal and essential functions of the individuals listed, the status of these functions, which directly and indirectly affect the efficiency and economy of personnel in the entire headquarters, fell considerably behind schedule.

5. To prepare the Booklet within a reasonable time, to eliminate the major deficiencies referred to in Par 4, above and to maintain the Booklet current, all in the interest of this headquarters, two professional and one clerical body will be required to establish and maintain the Booklet, with the individuals listed in par 4 above, providing major guidance and assistance during the establishment phase.

SUBJECT: Format of the Proposed Booklet, "Allocation of Staff Responsibilities for the Execution of JCS Directives to SCAP"

The following study is submitted in compliance with instructions from office of DC/S to Chief, SRS.

1. G-4 recommended that the above booklet be prepared in two sections:

a. Section I to be a listing of directives according to subject matter with all available identifying numbers (JCS, SWNOC, Radio, JCS Serial and REC, in that order) listed for each directive, but with no assignment of responsibility or paragraph breakdowns.

b. Section II to be a listing in the same order as Section I, with assignment of staff responsibility indicated and with paragraph breakdowns made where necessary.

It was suggested by G-4 that the order of presentation of subject matter in JCS 1380/15 (JCS Serial No. 18) be used as a guide in the above listings. Two pages illustrating the above proposed format for Section I have been prepared (Inclosure 1).

2. The above-recommended treatment differs from that afforded by the proposed SRS booklet in that:

a. It adds two columns, one for JCS numbers and one for SWNOC numbers.

b. The order of columns is rearranged.

c. The sequence of listing directives is by subject matter rather than numerically by JCS Serial number.

3. Discussion.

a. Reference paragraph 2a above.

(1) The above-recommended treatment would identify a limited number of SWNOC papers with their JCS counterparts, thus making available more complete information on directives listed in the booklet

in the cases where staff sections have incomplete files of JCS papers. However, the use of SWNOC papers on subjects where JCS papers exist incurs the hazard that the SWNOC papers may have been modified by their JCS counterparts at the time the SWNOC passed such papers through the JCS for transmission to SCAP.

(2) The SRS booklet identifies JCS Serials with SWNOC papers only when corresponding JCS papers are lacking, and then only after word-for-word comparison of the conclusions and recommendations of the SWNOC papers with the corresponding JCS Serials.

(3) Only about 25 percent of subject papers are identified by SWNOC numbers and about 50 percent with JCS numbers. Forty-three of the last JCS Serials have not been followed by documents identified with JCS numbers.

(4) It is believed that, in view of the hazard mentioned in paragraph 3a above, the gaps in JCS and SWNOC identifying numbers mentioned in paragraph 3b below, the fact that JCS papers are available in the headquarters covering such SWNOC papers as might be added by the recommended treatment, and the fact that instructions for preparation of the booklet included making as few references to SWNOC papers as possible, it is undesirable to include identification to SWNOC papers other than as indicated in paragraph (2) above.

b. Reference paragraph 2b above.

(1) SRS can perceive no advantage for rearrangement of the columns.

(2) There are two methods of numerical identification which apply to all serially numbered JCS directives (which comprise 90 percent of the current booklet), i.e., JCS Serial numbers and FEC numbers. An attempt to use as primary method of listing any numbers other than the Serial or FEC numbers would leave numerous gaps in the format of the booklet. For example, 45 of the JCS directives are approved policies of the FEC and, therefore, have neither JCS nor SWNOC numbers, and the remaining 55 have either JCS or SWNOC numbers (which have been indicated in the SRS booklet), but only in few cases do they have both.

(3) It is believed that the use of Serial numbers provides the preferable primary method of listing.

c. Reference paragraph 2c above.

(1) For reference purposes, the grouping of directives according to subject matter is desirable, as is illustrated by "IMPORTS-EXPORTS," page 2, Inclosure 1.

SUBJECT: Format of the Proposed Booklet, "Allocation of Staff Responsibilities for the Execution of JCS Directives to SCAP"

(2) Certain difficulties arise, however, from use of the recommended listing by subject matter.

(a) The subject headings under which directives must be filed, if the order provided by JCS 1380/15 (JCS Serial No. 18) is to be followed, are misleading in that the directives so listed contain only an infinitesimal part of the information pertaining to the subject heading. For example, Part II, A, Inclosure 1, deals with "Limitation of Sovereignty of the Japanese," but only in a most limited manner, whereas the over-all limitation of sovereignty of the Japanese was covered in JCS 1380/15. Similarly, Part II, C, MILITARY COURTS, lists thereunder a directive dealing with the disposition of fines collected by military courts, but the authority for establishment of such courts, etc., is contained in the basic occupation directives listed in Part I, GENERAL, and Part III (not included in Inclosure 1), in directives dealing with the "Treatment of Aliens in Japan." The above situation is applicable to the majority of the other than "general" directives.

b. The use of subject headings would also bring together directives related by title but containing material entirely different from the title. For example, JCS Serial No. 6, which is titled "Authority of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers," and, according to the recommended plan, would be listed under Part II, Inclosure 1. However, its contents deal primarily with the custody of Japanese diplomatic and consular archives and property located abroad, rather than with the authority of SCAP.

c. The recommended plan would require considerable duplication in that the information listed in proposed Section I would be listed also in the proposed Section II.

d. The subject headings provided by following the order of presentation of material in JCS 1380/15 (JCS Serial No. 18) are inadequate to cover all subjects which have been treated as directives to SCAP.

e. The recommended treatment, if prepared according to the two sample pages attached, would require at least 10 pages. This precludes meeting the requirement of the office of DG/S to Chief, SRS, to limit the listing to not more than two pages.

5. Recognizing the need for a subject index of all JCS directives to SCAP, SRS has initiated such an index, which, when completed, will not only group together related directives according to subjects, but will also completely index the contents of the directives according to standard index practice. Inclosure 2 is an incomplete sample page of the proposed index, which follows in general the format used for the "Index of Directives to the Japanese Government (SCAPINS)."

1. The Chief of Staff has directed Statistics and Reports Section to prepare a booklet entitled "Allocation of Staff Responsibilities for Execution of JCS Directives Issued to SCAP." This booklet is to contain:

a. All current and future directives to SCAP which have been filed with the Far Eastern Commission. These directives have been assigned serial numbers by the JCS and may have been originally identified either as JCS papers or SWNCC papers. For example, JCS 1380/15 is JCS Serial No. 18; SWNCC 99/3 is JCS Serial 20-A.

b. All current and future directives to SCAP which have not been assigned serial numbers.

c. Allocation of responsibilities to SCAP Special Staff Sections.

2. In view of the broad scope of this problem, including the accurate delineation of responsibility between certain staff sections, it is requested that addressee staff sections send a representative to a conference at 0900 on 6 February 1948 in SRS, Fourth Floor, National City Bank Building, to discuss this matter. Representatives should be thoroughly familiar with directives to SCAP from higher authority and with responsibilities assigned to the respective staff sections.
