The SemiColon

What is a semi-colon?

A semicolon is a type of punctuation used to connect two independent clauses that are closely related in thought ("Using Semicolons").

How do I use a semi-colon?

Semicolons allow you to extend your sentence without creating a run on or making it too awkward.

For example, instead of saying "Derek loves chocolate chip cookies they have been his favorite dessert since he was a child" (a run on)

or "Derek loves chocolate chip cookies. They have been his favorite dessert since he was a child" (two separate sentences coveying the same idea), we can insert a semicolon!

Our sentence will now become, "Derek loves chocolate chip cookies; they have been his favorite dessert since he was a child". **Great!**

Let's look at some more examples!



"It's too cold outside to do anything fun I hate the cold weather and I wish it was summer!" (awkward run on)



"It's too cold outside to do anything fun; I hate the cold weather and I wish it was summer!"





"Dogs are very active animals. They need a lot of love and attention." (two separate sentences conveying the same idea)



"Dogs are very active animals; they need a lot of love and attention."

It's also important to place the semicolon in the correct spot. **Do not** place the semicolon in a spot where a sentence could neither begin nor end.



"Look at the stars in; the sky tonight aren't they so beautiful?" (semicolon has been placed incorrectly)



"Look at the stars in the sky tonight; aren't they so beautiful?"
