

\$30000 to develop an **experimental toolkit** for **developers**, **researchers**, **and Wikimedians** to **analyze data** from **Wikidata**

Generation Wikipedia (provisional, pending further review)

\$20000 to **pilot a summer camp** for young Wikipedians to build **skills, leadership, and community**

Travel & participation funding helps connect individual community members.

"It enabled me to go to a fantastic conference, where I did some good work with other open source folks. Was a great and useful trip."

"Thanks! you do an important thing for our community."

We're reaching some new and diverse Wikimedians.

49% of grantees are from the Global South. Over 30% are women (50% last year). For 77%, this is their first time applying for any kind of grant in the movement.

At ~2 grants/month, the program is underused.

Significant changes to scope and setup of the program are needed to realize full potential and serve more individuals.
