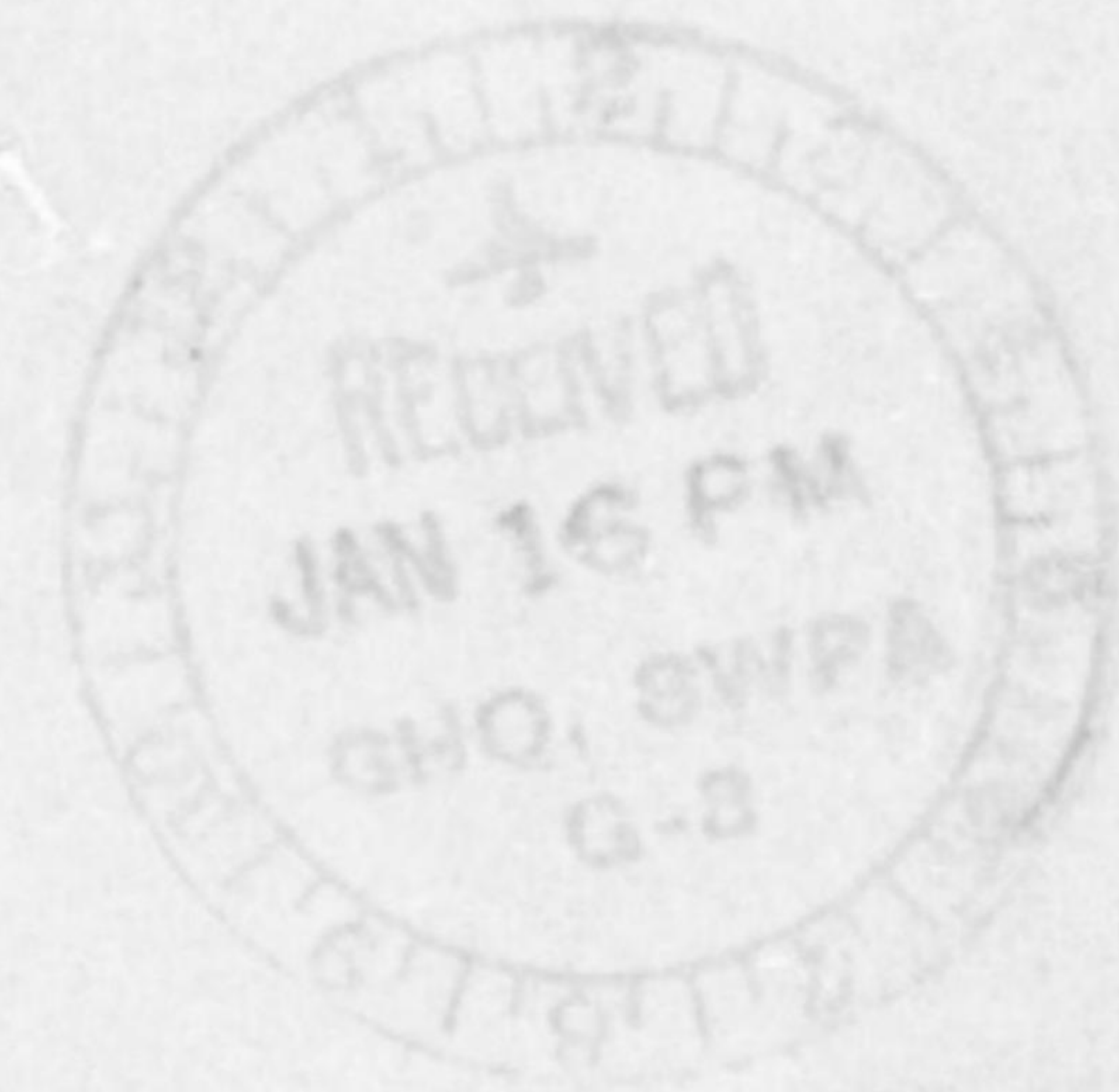

My 100329 not to all. Kosei Maru Kashima and Sakawa have lifted a total of 6065 Japs this month which is 2263 in excess of vessels stated capacity. Only 4400 Japs now remain for evacuation from Newak and can be lifted by Hikawa Maru and Hosho leaving approximately 1000 berths on Hosho for embarkation from Torokina.

Intend routing Hosho from Newak to Torokina to complete to capacity and propose that Katsuragi be sailed direct to Torokina for embarkation. If you concur request estimated quantity black oil required at Torokina for Katsuragi.

Your 090004 H and my 081001 A there are 500 stretcher and 4120 walking cases total 4620 in Torokina are for evacuation.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Radio 031147 6 January from ACNB giving priorities and number of repatriates at Sydney (6,000), Wewak (12,000), and Torokina (28,000) answers our CAX 56422, 25 December.

2. Present shipping enroute to Sydney and Wewak.

3. The Daizui Maru is scheduled to sail for Sydney, capacity 3,000. This will clear port of Sydney according to ACNB. ^{ETD 10 Jan}

4. Ships available for dispatch on this shuttle have large capacity and tentative plans are to dispatch them to Torokina where 28,000 await repatriation. The Arimasan Maru (hospital ship) will be dispatched to Torokina if Australian reply to radio SCAJAP indicates there are 3,000 patients at Torokina. Tentative plans call for dispatching the Katsuragi (4,500), Kumano (5,000) and Settsu (5,000) when ready. Other ships to continue shuttle until Torokina is clear.

5. Tentative plan calls for dispatching 2,000 capacity ship to clean up remainder at Wewak when such ship becomes available.

6. Since above information was received from SCAJAP, a radio from CTG 50.3 to ACNB number 070718 3, 8 Jan, was dispatched stating that Hospital Ship Arimasan Maru was being diverted to Torokina and requesting immediate advice if this vessel needed Torokina as hospital ship as hospital ships are urgently needed elsewhere. It also states, "Will schedule lift balance of Wewak Japs as soon as receive number from you."

7. Recommend no further action on this subject in view of action now being taken by SCAJAP. Action passed to SCAJAP.

8. No concurrences deemed necessary.

9. This completes action on this subject.

1. Reference is made to your C/N of 25 Sep 45 to this Office and to our reply of 6 Oct 45. The attached tabulation (Incl #1) expands the requested information on Japanese PWs, listing them by nationality, rank, and place of detention. The only major difference is 500 more Formosans in New Guinea and not at Cowra. The report of this movement is expected within a few days. No figures are available on Japanese Pws held in New Guinea other than Formosans sent up from here (see par. 3 below).

2. Where individuals of one nationality appear at a camp reserved for another nationality they are either in the hospital or the detention barracks.

3. Your attention is invited to Radio CAX-52632, dated 2 Oct 45, from Hqs, AFPAC, to C-in-C, ANZ. Col. McCahon read this to me. It is a request for the number and location of PWs and disarmed personnel to be repatriated to Japan; the ports of embarkation, and the priorities desired. The whole matter is before the Governmental authorities and as of this date has not been decided. However, the following may be mentioned in the reply:

- (1) Japanese Pws will have the highest priority in repatriation.
- (2) It will assist in the closing of Pw & I camps if Australian and US captured PWs are repatriated at the same time.
- (3) PWs listed as War Criminals will be retained for trial.

4. I believe that the repatriation policy to be followed as regards civilian internees and merchant seamen is what is holding up the reply.

5. I questioned each hospital, and in general, all patients can be repatriated. There are seven mental cases (4 in Gladesville, 3 in Melbourne) which will probably require special handling. Some question might arise in TB cases in the last stages of the disease. There is one case of Leprosy.

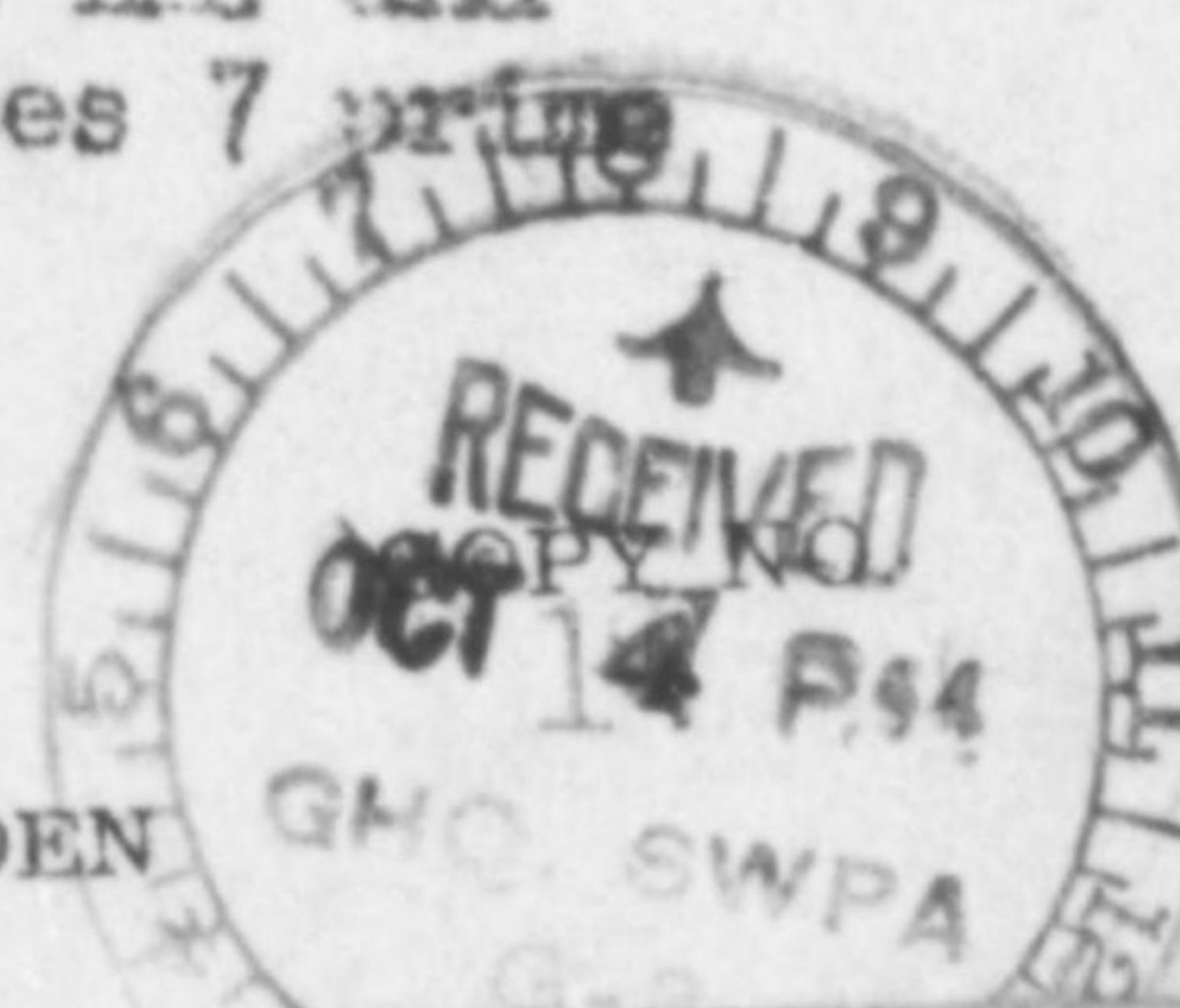

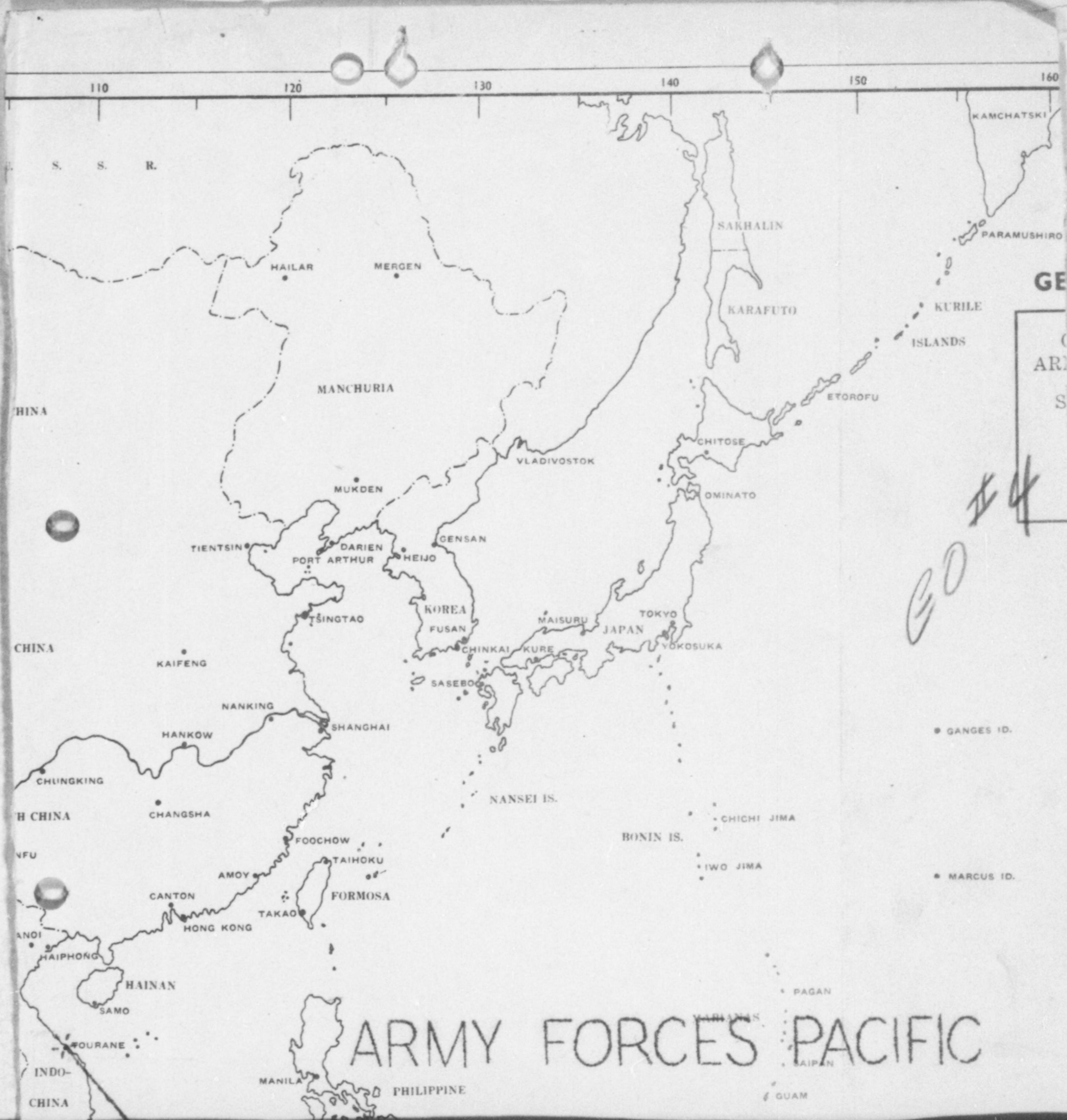

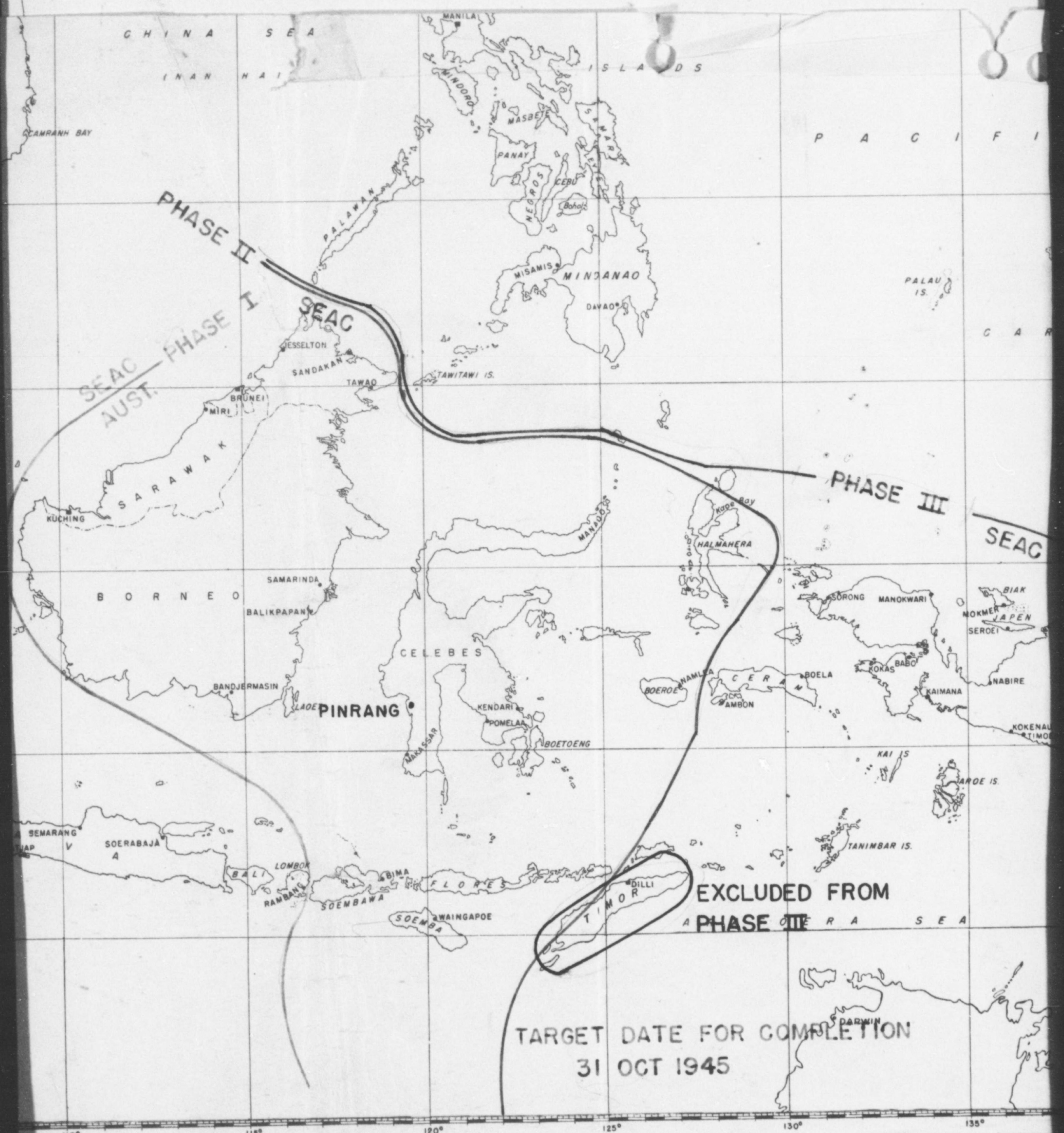
