Third-term Congressman, Richard L. Ottinger (D. 25th Dist.), candidate for the Democratic party nomination to the U.S. Senate, will speak at R.I.T. on Tuesday, April 14, from 3 to 3:45 p.m. in the student lounge of the College-Alumni Union.

Congressman Frank Horton (R. 36th Dist.) will also speak in the student lounge of the College-Alumni Union on Friday, April 17, from 1 to 2 p.m. All members of the R.I.T. student body, faculty, and staff, as well as the general public, are invited to attend.

Dr. Young joined R.I.T. in 1964 and was appointed associate dean of the College of Business in July of last year. He graduated magna cum laude with a bachelor of science degree from Indiana State University. He also earned a master of arts degree from Indiana State and a doctorate in business administration from Washington University (St. Louis).
